



THE MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG, Indiana.

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with this Board requesting the Board to authorize and issue the bonds of the Town of Sellersburg for the purpose of procuring funds to be applied on the cost of construction of a Town Hall and Garage in and for said Town, to which petition there are attached the affidavits of various persons verifying the signatures appearing thereon, and the certificate of the Auditor of

Clark County showing that said petition has been signed by 204 owners of taxable real estate in the Town of Sellersburg; and

WHEREAS, the Board, upon due examination of said petition, finds that said petition complies in all respects with the provisions of Section 64-313 Burns Statutes 1933, 1951 Replacement Volumne, and is signed by more than fifty (50) owners of taxable real estate in the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, now therefore;
