REGULAR MEETING

A Regular Meeting of the Sellersburg Town Council was held at the Sellersburg Library at 6:30 p.m. Those present were: Stanley E. Tucker, Council President; Dave Broady, Council Vice-President; Doug Eddings, Jr., Council Member, Roy Everitt, Council Member; Karl Truman, Council Member; Perry McCall, Attorney; and Linda G. Schafer, Clerk Treasurer.

Called To Order

President Tucker called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Invocation

The Invocation was passed at this meeting.

Pledge

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited.

Minutes of the Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting and requested a motion to approve them.

Motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting made by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Don Brown Addresses Council/Annexation

Mr. Brown stated that he has a little speech he would like to give to the Council about annexation.

Mr. Brown passed out copies to the Council Members which read as follows:

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is now over a year since this Council began annexation proceedings of the areas known as $^{\prime\prime}I$, K, and $M^{\prime\prime}.$

I am pleased to report tonight, as of this date, none of the areas are imminent danger of being annexed.

Due to the support of most of the Residents Against Annexation group, and the efforts of our attorney, Mr. Larry Wilder, we have resisted your conscription call well past this years tax deadline.

Although some of our residents do not seem to appreciate our efforts to save them money I hope their outlook will change in the future when they realize you can fight city hall and win!

The best example is the fact that the RAA has saved the residents of Area "M" \$25,958 in additional taxes for this year.

The residents of Diamond Heights have been saved \$7076.00 in additional taxes.

The people who live in the Twinbrook/West Creek area will enjoy a savings of \$28,099.00.

Don Brown Addresses Council/Annexation Cont.

I believe that this is a magnificent measure of a victory even though "we have not yet begun to fight".

I have several announcements to make.

First, the Residents Against Annexation will have a general meeting in April to assess the qualifications and attitudes of the candidates for public office, who reside in the areas affected by annexation.

Second, this will be a public meeting, and residents of Clark County who are in the Sellersburg "path of progress" are invited to attend.

And all members of the Sellersburg Town Council are invited.

Don Brown Chairman, Steering Committee Residents Against Annexation

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/New Dispatcher Bella Marie Jackson

Chief Kinder stated that we were advertising for a part-time dispatcher. While we were running the advertisement Susan Ehringer left as a full-time dispatcher. We were already interviewing, so we hired Bella Marie Jackson as the full-time dispatcher at \$7.23 an hour.

Building Commissioner Presents Claims

Building Commissioner, Stephen Prather presented a bill for the International Conference of Building Officials in the amount of \$75.00 for membership, which the Town had previously agreed to pay.

Mr. Prather also presented his report of permits and inspections from March 1st thru March 14 in the amount of \$202.50.

Motion made by Council Member Everitt to approve Building Commissioners claim and seconded by Karl Truman.

Stephen Prather Addresses Council/Classic Car Collections Nuisance Violation

Mr. Prather stated that there was one item brought up. The garage in the alley way, right up the street, I had some complaints last year about the body shop. There was painting going on in the garage next to the Cabinet Company's building. Basically, those people got out, I thought it was resolved and someone else bought the garage initially to store their antique cars. That was no problem. I was informed by one

of the neighbors that Classic Car Collections has grown into let's fix everyone else's car. They aren't doing any painting that I'm aware of but basically, they are back to running a business out of an area that is not zoned to do that. I agreed that I would make the Board aware of it. I will send out the appropriate letter tomorrow and our standard policy is giving them 30 days to correct the nuisance. This means there is nothing for the Board to do tonight, I just wanted to make you aware of this.

President Tucker stated that Mr. Prather may want to make the Planning and Zoning Board aware of this and thanked Mr. Prather.

Council Member Broady Addresses SEDA Program

Council Member Broady stated that he and Rick Wheeler were talking and I was wondering if it might be possible to hire someone under the SEDA Program.

President Tucker asked if SEDA paid for it.

Rick Wheeler stated he was not sure how it works. He had received a form on it and wasn't sure of the details.

Council Member Broady stated it might be something we could look into.

President Tucker stated assuming that I understand that a little bit, Hoosier Valley Economic Development, which is in Jeffersonville, they help youths find work and they partially pay them, if I understand this. I think it would be great to look into that. If we can find out the specifics, cost, terms or whatever and bring it back, that's fine. The director of Hoosier Valley is Jerry Stevens and he will direct you to the right person. You can use my name if that will help you.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/American Legion Dinner

Council Member Everitt stated that the Sellersburg American Legion has invited the Town Board Members to a dinner on Saturday, Marci 26th. Cocktail hour is 6:30 to 7:00. Guest Speaker is the Southern Vice Commander, Tony Riley. They will also be honoring the Policeman of the year and Firefighter of the year. I have asked Stan about a plaque from the Sellersburg Town Council. If we could vote on an award to present to the American Legion for the work they've done in our community with the Parades, Easter Egg Hunts, name it and they've just about done everything for the Town for the past 40 years.

Council Member Everitt stated I would like to put in a motion that the Town Board presents them with the Sellersburg Seal and thank them for the work they've done.

Motion made by Roy Everitt to present the American Legion with an award and seconded by Karl Truman.

Clerk Treasurer Presents Claims

Clerk Treasurer, Linda Schafer presented claims for the last two weeks for the Civil, Sewer and Water Departments.

Motion to approve claims made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 4-0

Attorney Perry McCall Addresses Council/BFI Contract

Attorney McCall stated as you recall back some weeks ago in an interlocal agreement with Clark Co. Commissioners and the Solid Waste Disposal of Clark County, they are getting ready to put that plan in effect very soon. In order to get that project in place we need to execute a contact with BFI, the other communities are doing the same.

Attorney McCall stated, I would ask that the Town Council allow President Tucker to sign this agreement.

President Tucker stated he would entertain a motion to approve the agreement that the other communities in Clark Co. have agreed to.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to approve the signing of the contract and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

A resident stated that he had read in the paper that this would cost from \$2.00 to \$2.50 a month.

President Tucker stated that the way he understands it and he's not totally clear, that the first year is one amount, the second year is another and the third is another, the fourth year, we the Town are to take over basically in totality. The first, second and third year they will be subsidized with funding that they already have available. I think it's \$1.00 the first year meaning 1994. In 1995, I think it goes up, it is negotiated each year if I'm not mistaken.

President Tucker stated if it's \$2.50 you pay \$1.00, Wastemanagement pays the \$1.50 and this goes on for at least the first couple of years, at some point we inherit it.

President Tucker stated the way I understand this. it is mandatory, we don't have a choice.

Phyllis Rhodes asked who would look into the Town employees picking up the trash, if there is a problem.

Council Member Truman stated if the Town employees see a problem they would pass the information on to Wastemanagement.

Attorney Perry McCall Addresses Council/BFI Contract Cont.

President Tucker stated that Mark Warren does ride around making sure that there is some compliance to our regulations. I also find that people in Sellersburg let us know when something is not going the way that they think it ought to go. I'm sure someone will let us know. Problems need to be directed to Jerry Fuller.

President Tucker stated that it was stated that if it becomes a greater than once a week pick-up, they would put additional bins out. I think when it comes to the recycling part, we need to talk to Jerry Fuller. Nothing is simple.

Attorney McCall Presents Ord. 94-588/Est. Building Fund for Construction of New Town Hall

Attorney McCall presented Ordinance 94-588, an ordinance establishing a building fund for the construction of a new Sellersburg Town Hall.

Motion made by Council Member Everitt to approve Ordinance 94-588 and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Information from Codification

Council Member Truman asked if we had heard anymore on our Codified Ordinances.

Clerk Treasurer, Linda Schafer stated that the information had been put in the box for the Council Members at the Town Hall.

President Tucker Addresses Council/Planning & Zoning Appointments and Reappointments

President Tucker stated that Dave and I have been working with Rod Pate for the last few weeks to put in place the members of the Planning Commission as well as the members fo the Zoning Appeals Board. We have names to bring forth tonight and I will appreciate a motion to approve these for a two year term which would basically end with our term December 31, 1995.

President Tucker Presents Claim From Commonwealth Engineers, Inc.

President Tucker presented a claim from Commonwealth Engineers, Inc. in the amount of \$1,200.00 for the first partial payment for Engineering Services performed for the completion of the IDEM Construction Permit Application for the Town of Sellersburg.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to approve claim and seconded by Council Member Broady.

President Tucker Presents Ordinance 94-587/Transfer of Appropriations, Police Dept.

President Tucker presented Ordinance 94-587, an Ordinance providing for the transfer of appropriations for the Town of Sellersburg Police Department, for the year of 1994.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated that Mr. Kinder has dropped his cleaning services to be able to replace his floor, his dispatchers are going to do that in their spare time. It's not costing anymore, he's saving the Town money.

Motion made by Council Member Broady to approve Ordinance 94-587 and seconded by Council Member Truman.

President Tucker Presents Proposal/Hoosier Codification

President Tucker stated he had received a proposal from Hoosier Codification for eight additional code books that we need to pass out to various departments. The Planning Commission, Police Department, several departments need them. For the eight copies it would be \$265.00 and any additional sets would be for \$5.75 per page.

President Tucker stated that Karl had stated that we needed more copies and to get them it will cost \$265.00.

Council Member Truman stated I make a motion and as part of that motion we keep a copy here at the Library for the public.

President Tucker stated I think there is a copy here at the Library.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to approve Hoosier Codification supplying us eight more of the Town Code Books and one to stay at the Library, seconded by Council Member Eddings.

President Tucker Presents Proposal/Hoosier Codification Cont.

Resident Don Brown asked did you say they wanted \$5.75 per page to copy this.

President Tucker stated it was for updating in the future. In other words, let's assume we do two or three pages per month of additional ordinances, multiplying by twelve you have thirty six pages. It would be \$5.75 per page for 36 pages per manuel.

Council Member Everitt stated I would like to be sure that each Town Board Member gets one but that when his term in office is over it be turned back in to Town Hall.

President Tucker stated that's fine.

Vote 4-0

Council Member Eddings Addresses Council/Sale of Town Properties

Council Member Eddings stated that we have three pieces of property we are looking at to sell. We have had the property surveyed by the Town Engineer. Supposedly the title searches have been done showing the legal ownership.

Council Member Eddings stated of the three pieces of property, the one on Villa Drive, we are still investigating the best possible way to sell that piece of land. According to the survey, whether or not we may have a flood issue or a drainage issue with that piece of property. We kind of want to set on that piece of property and look at that, make sure that if we sell it, it won't come back and hurt us.

Council Member Eddings stated the other two pieces, since we have the title search done and the surveys done, we want to go ahead tonight and authorize the two appraisals on those two pieces of property and put the wheels in motion to go ahead and sell those two pieces of property.

Council Member Eddings stated that we'd like to sell it by Option "B", on the last proposal. It was for us to except bids on the property and then if necessary, if we feel like we need to call the highest bidders in and have an auction on those two pieces of property, one piece being the Prather Lane property and second being the old Firehouse. It would be a sealed bid and if we deem necessary a final auction. If the bids that come in are not 90% of market value they will not be excepted.

Council Member Truman asked why do you prefer that option over the public auction with 10% buyers premium.

Council Member Eddings stated that with the bids, the secondary option the most it would cost us is 8%, if we do it that way instead of 10%.

Council Member Truman asked about the brokerage fee, is that included on Option "B".

Mr. Baker stated it is included in Option "B".

Council Member Eddings Addresses Council/Sale of Town Properties Cont.

Council Member Truman asked if Century 21 has an auctioneer they would use or a local auctioneer, do we select one or what.

Mr. Baker stated we have one.

Mr. Wm. Collier asked could we legally sell Villa Drive since it was part of the Town drainage and if we did sell it, the people who bought it wouldn't they have to maintain it as such. That is part of the Town's Storm Drain System.

President Tucker stated one of the things Doug stated at the beginning was that we are only asking permission to sell the Prather Lane property and the Old Firehouse. We are not at this time asking to do anything with Villa Drive. We are researching that. If there is a drainage problem there, that the person who buys it will inherit that problem.

Council Member Eddings stated if we sold it, the person who buys it would have to maintain it or make it better.

President Tucker stated we could put restrictions in the deed that would not allow the drainage to be changed in any shape or form. The remainder of the property could be changed somewhat. I don't want to create problems with that piece of property. We aren't going to do anything until we feel that we have the ability to do this in the correct manner.

President Tucker stated at this point in time we've kind of taken this property off the market until we can get some questions answered.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings for the 2 appraisals to be made and go ahead with the sale of the Prather Lane and Old Firehouse properties as long as the paperwork is in order, motion seconded by Council Member Broady.

There was a question on the selling process.

President Tucker stated it is a sealed bid, let's assume three people bid on that property.

Mr. Bolly stated that he has a client that is interested in the Prather Lane property. He was concerned about a private auction and thought there could be problems. His client would pay a reasonable price with some stipulations, that the alley was closed, close Bucheit Street.

Council Member Everitt asked you're talking 30 feet where the old Prather Lane was, okay, If Iremember right, when we built Prather Lane back in 89 & 90, all of that was taken care of, it should be in the minutes. The alley was closed and 1/2 of that went to the older lady who lives in the house on the corner. If I'm not mistaken, whenever you give up an alley or street you give 1/2 of it to the homeowner and that was suppose to be taken care of in 89 & 90.

Mr. Bolly stated we haven't found where that was legally closed.

Council Member Eddings Addresses Council/Sale of Town Properties Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated that Old Prather Lane was 39.18 wide. The reason we went ahead and done that was because he couldn't get in and out of his building the way it was. Mr. Regan built the building on Old Prather Lane and that's the only way they could get in and out of that building.

President Tucker stated that what we have found in some cases, the documents have not been done correctly. It may have not been recorded. If we find there is a problem with the title it would have to be corrected.

President Tucker stated that we should ask Perry to check and see what needs to be done to make these properties saleable and come back to the Board with recommendations.

Attorney McCall stated he will check on these.

Council Member Broady rescinded his second of the motion.

Council Member Eddings rescinded his motion of two appraisals and going on with the sale of the two properties.

Council Member Everitt stated the reason Buchiet was closed was because the Federal Government said it would cost \$187,000. to take the fence down and make it a dead end that we wouldn't be out the money.

Council Member Truman asked what were the three things that Mr. Bolly's client wanted.

Mr. Bolly stated:

- Close the right-of-way.
- 2. Closing Bucheit Street.
- 3. Closing the alley.

Council Member Truman stated we need to go ahead and make a motion to do these three things.

Council Member Everitt asked do we have to give the whole street up, that would be 30 feet. Do we have to give any to the existing land owner which would be to the gas station.

President Tucker stated his guess would be fifteen feet to each, the buyer and the existing property owner.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to close Bucheit Street and the alley and negotiate the right of way, seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Adjournment

Motion was made by Council Member Eddings to adjourn the meeting and seconded by Council Member Truman.

March 28, 1994

Regular Meeting

A regular meeting of the Sellersburg Town Council was held at the Sellersburg Library at 6:30 p.m. Those present were Stanley E. Tucker, Council President; Dave Broady, Council Vice President; Doug Eddings, Jr., Council Member; Roy Everitt, Council Member; Karl Truman, Council Member and Linda G. Schafer, Clerk Treasurer. Perry McCall, Attorney being absent.

Called to Order

President Tucker called the meeting to order at 6:34 P.M.

Prayer

Brother Dale Offutt offered the prayer for this meeting.

Pledge

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited.

Jim Baker Addresses Council/Town Properties

Mr. Baker stated that we had a meeting with Mr. Toombs, Mr. Murphy and Karen Elliott.

Mr. Baker stated that there are a couple of things, first of all regarding Prather Lane, vacating the alley, 30ft. at Bucheit and 30 ft. right of way easement. The 30 ft. easement may not affect the property. Chuck Murphy will research to find out if CarMerica ownes that.

John Toombs stated that legally and since it's on the edge of the property, that you would start with the Planning and Zoning Board.

President Tucker asked how we proceed from here.

Mr. Toombs stated that you would get approval from the Planning and Zoning Commission to vacate.

President Tucker stated so the next step is someone needs to tell the Planning and Zoning Commission what we need to do as far as vacating and so forth and if they agree to that it's passed on.

Jim Baker Addresses Council/Town Properties

President Tucker stated could I ask Doug to get with Perry and get a written recommendation as to what we need to do and take it to the Planning Commission and get their approval, bring it back to the Town Council.

Council Member Eddings stated can we go ahead and set the wheels in motion for appraisals.

President Tucker stated that I have no problem with that.

Council Member Eddings stated based on the condition of sale being that the Planning Commission recommends and the Town Board accepts vacating Bucheit and the alley way and the right of way for Old Prather Lane.

Motion made that the Board approve the appraisals and the beginning process for selling the properties based on the conditions of sale being that we give up the right of way at Old Prather Lane, vacate Bucheit to the point of the two adjacent properties and vacate the 10 foot alley way.

Seconded by Council Member Broady.

President Tucker stated the Planning Commission will meet on the 12th of April and we will not be able to approve it until the 25th of April.

Vote 4-0

Mr. Murphy stated we have examined three pieces of property, one being known as the Old Firehouse, the title is in the name of the Town of Sellersburg, it's free and clear with no liens or encumbrances which are recorded.

Mr. Murphy stated that there was some discussion this afternoon and I was being told then about the money that was used for that project that involves that piece of property. My only suggestion would be that when and if you are ready to sell that property we retain a flood easement on which would keep us, I believe out of any problems. The third piece of property, as I understand that you're going to obtain, one being the Police Station, the other one being the Sewer Plant.

Mr. Murphy stated the third on is the Prather Lane property, again we find the real estate is free and clear of all encumbrances. We do find that there are some easements and some dedicated right of ways of record on that property. I tried to call Mr. McCall to discuss this with him and was unable to reach him.

Mr. Murphy stated, it is my recommendation that prior to selling this property that the right of ways be vacated. My understanding with talking with Mr. Toombs, that what is the Old Prather Lane portion of this is all within the what was the Highland Park Addition that as I believe Indiana law to be in terms of vacations, all of that property of the Old Prather Lane would belong to the City as well as that alley way. The only difference would be the alley way at Bucheit, would be split 50/50, the rest by virtue of ownership would go to the Town.

President Tucker stated that his suggestion to Mr. Murphy along with Mr. McCall get together and decide what I need to ask the Planning Commission.

Chris Marshall Addresses Council/Community Map

President Tucker stated that Mr. Marshall came to visit him at the Bank. He has a map, a Community Map, asking if we'd be interested in having the Town of Sellersburg on this map and I'll let you take over from here.

Mr. Marshall stated that Commercial Advertising out of Jasper, Indiana, we've been in business for about 15 years. What we do is donate one side of the map to the Town and the other side is used as a street map.

Mr. Marshall stated some Towns want a county map, it's basically what you want to do with them. It is advertiser supportive. Each one of the advertisers will get a supply of maps. The bulk of the maps would come to the Town Hall for distribution.

President Tucker stated he had a chance to spend some time with Chris the other day, the chamber does have a map and it has a small insert of Sellersburg in it. This map would be an advantage to us. If we are going to do it we need to do it right.

President Tucker stated question one, is this something we would like for the Town of Sellersburg, question two, I heard that you would basically like an introduction letter. Thirdly, someone needs to, more or less, accept the responsibility of helping the Board make the verbage, Carl Kamer or whoever.

Council Member Truman asked to do something like this here, what do we need to do.

Mr. Marshall stated you need to deliver a raw map, it's all type set.

Council Member Truman stated we need to type out what we want it to say.

Mr. Marshall stated it can be hand written.

Motion made by Council Member Truman that we approve the permission for Commercial Advertising Co. to create a map for the Town of Sellersburg. Seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Chief Kinder offered help with the verbage of the map.

President Tucker asked Chief Kinder if Carl Kamer and Charlie Ridenhour wanted to work on the map, would he be interested in helping. President Tucker stated he just wanted to make sure if we did this, we did it right.

Chief Kinder replied yes, he would help.

Mr. Marshall stated as I said the advertisers would receive a supply of maps and the Town would receive the bulk of them.

James Gregg addresses Council/Corradino Group

Mr. Gregg stated I am with the Corradino Group. We work with a number of grants from the Department of Commerce. I had written a letter to Stan about the grants from the Indiana Housing Finance. They have a few different types of programs trying to assist low to moderate incomes in Communities throughout Indiana making structual improvements to their houses. What I had written for Sellersburg was two different type of Community Block Grants. The two projects which may best suit Sellersburg are:

- 1. Owner-occupied or Owner-occupied/Rental Housing Minor Improvements
 The maximum rehabilitation cost must not exceed an average of \$5,000 per homeowner. Funds may be used to remedy conditions that represent an ongoing threat to the structural integrity of a building and may eventually result in an emergency situation. A repair program may target specific population groups such as the elderly, handicapped, or be open to all low and moderate income families.
- 1. Owner-Occupied Moderate or Substantial Rehabilitation
 Rehabilitation activities must bring each assisted unit totally up to IHFA
 Rehabilitation Standards, or local building codes or ordinances, whichever is
 more stringent. The IHFA has established a maximum subsidy allowance of \$15,000
 per unit, however, approval may be requested to increase this amount.

We administered a number of programs throughout Southern Indiana and found out these programs were quite effective. Each of these projects require a 10% local match. Your local building inspector may be able to provide inspection services, thus, reducing you cash match requirement. Applications for this round of funding are due April 22nd, 1994, with award announcements on or about May 26, 1994.

President Tucker stated to Stephen Prather, Building Commissioner, that he would look to him as far as the houses in the Town that might be able to use this type of funding. Maybe at the next meeting you could come back and say yes, we have an area that could use this type of funding and Linda if you could check to see if we have \$10,000 to match on this grant, we may not have any surplus money.

President Tucker stated what I suggest is I make a copy of this for everyone on the Board to look at and let them read it over and Steve will be back with information and Linda will look at the budget and maybe by the next meeting we will have some direction. If I feel you need to be here to answer any questions, I'll call you.

Council Member Everitt asked is this similar to what Sellersburg had a few years back? I believe we had this once before.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated that was H.U.D.

Mr. Gregg stated it is probably a variation of that. It's not the same thing.

James Gregg addresses Council/Corradino Group Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated I know it was the Kahl Court area, was one of the areas they worked on but when the people got their houses worked on they couldn't sell them for five years, is this the same thing?

Mr. Gregg stated yes, if you could set it up, the major programs would require a five year forgiveable loan, you can structure that in a couple of different ways. You could have a forgiveable loan were 100% is forgiven per year, they would have to payback a portion. The minor program, since you are just talking about \$5,000 is normally paid back in a two year period.

President Tucker stated is this done the the Corradino Group, by a person in the Town, a local bank, who's the one that actually sits down with the person and says this is what you need to have repaired and this is how it's going to work, here's the mortgage, how does that work?

Mr. Gregg stated it is administered by a firm, such as ours, there are other firms around that do this type of work.

Minutes of the Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from March 14, 1994, the Executive Session and Regular Meeting.

Motion mady by Council Member Broady to approve the minutes as read and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Part-Time Dispatcher, Pamela Fay Stillwell

Chief Kinder stated we are back to a part-time dispatcher because the other two dispatchers have already moved up in their current jobs. They took over new duties at Floyd County and they've already advanced.

Clerk Treasurer Linda Schafer stated she had a question, Tamara McCurdy and Shirley Yochem shared one part-time position and then Shirley moved up, you combinded those two positions into 1 full-time.

Chief Kinder stated we have Michelle, Shelley, David and Shirley, then we had Susan and we got Bella. We have Tami still at part-time and Susan was going to fill in as part-time but now she can't work part-time.

Chief Kinder stated we have a lady that was interviewed before that we'd like to bring on board.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Part-Time Dispatcher, Pamela Fay Stillwell Cont.

Chief Kinder stated I also have one more thing about the nuisance ordinance, who handles this?

Steve Prather stated if it is a building violation, it is covered by ordinances and has the power of the State, if it's just a nuisance ordinance like a car parked on property that's not supose to be there, it falls under a Town ordinance and the enforcement policy for the Town, you have two options, one is the Town Attorney can seek legal action and second the Police Department to write a citation.

Steve Prather stated he can always write a nasty-gram. The standard law is 30 days and if they refuse there is nothing else I can do.

Chief Kinder stated what we are running into now, bushes to close to the intersection, the Street Department has to cut them back free of charge.

President Tucker stated I think we can give them a citation for that. If they do not do it within a reasonable time, I assume 30 days is a reasonable period of time or less, I would think the Street Department could do that and we would bill them accordingly.

Steve Prather stated that the way it reads is all nuisances fall under me, but if there not building nuisances all I can do is write them a letter giving them 30 days.

President Tucker stated assuming that I'm understanding what you're telling me, is that if it isn't a building, if it's a nuisance that has something other than a building, then it's David's and he may pick a reasonable amount of time 10, 15, or 20 days, whatever to have that rectified. If not you have a choice of either having it rectified by the Street Department or if it's something that can't easily be done, then I think we need to refer it to Perry McCall.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to approve the hiring of Pamela Fay Stillwell at the salary rate of \$. , and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Stephen D. Prather, Building Commissioner Presents Claims

Mr. Prather stated before I present my claims there was a permit #0385 and I inadvertently wrote the amount of \$25.00 on the permit, it was issued to Mr. Wayne Hobbs, he paid for the permit, receipt #287545, it should have been for \$20.00 instead of \$25.00, it was my error. I went to the Clerk Treasurer's office, we adjusted the receipt to reflect \$20.00 instead of \$25.00, mailed out a refund check for \$5.00. John Toombs, Consulting Engineer Presents Res. 1994-22, 1994-23 & 1994-24

John Toombs, Consulting Engineer presented Resolution 1994-22, a resolution in reference to set aside thirty (30) percent of its budget line items for Local Road and Street Funds, Motor Vehicle Funds, and Street Department Funds, to be used, as recommended in the approved STORM WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN, for Capital Improvements, Equipment, Employees and Materials for maintenance, repair and improvements of the storm sewer and ditch system in the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

Resolution 1994-23, a resolution in reference to finance, by the sale of Bonds, all those storm sewers, that need to be installed, as outlined in the approved Storm Water Management Plan, which are not to be accomplished with the grant being applied for from the Indiana Department of Commerce.

Resolution 1994-24, a resolution in reference to the Town Council of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, authorizing the submittal of the Community Focus Funds Application to the Indiana Department of Commerce and addressing related matters.

Motion to approve resolutions 1994-22, 1994-23 and 1994-24 made by Council Member Truman and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Council Member Everitt asked if the 30% on LRS motor vehicle fund, what do have \$70,000 in there this year.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated \$6,000 in one it's LRS, Street & Sanitation and...

Council Member Everitt stated is this going to go on from now that they are going to take 30% out of this fund, I know down the line we're going to need every penny we can get for the streets.

John Toombs stated we're not taking anything out of the funds, all you're doing is to resolve what you're already doing. There will be no change at all in the budget. We aren't taking anything out or making anything different. This is just saying what you are doing officially.

President Tucker stated this is not committing us to anything.

John Toombs, Consulting Engineer Presents Bid From Joe Reschar Construction

John Toombs presented a bid from Joe Reschar Construction. Mr. Toombs stated that over in the Adkins Court area we worked out a solution to the sanitary sewer problems. It has three little sections, we've got prices on these. Mr. Broady and I have looked over them. I want to recommend that we award the pink to Mr. Joe Reschar who's a contractor, his bid was \$11,375.00 and that will take care of straightening out a part of this area. I recommend that the Board except this bid.

Motion made by Council Member Broady to approve the bid from Reschar Construction and seconded by Council Member Truman.

John Toombs, Consulting Engineer Addresses Council Concerning Sewer System

Mr. Toombs stated we have been doing and done an investigation on the Sewer System and in order to comply with our Grants we are supose to get the rain water out of our sewers. We smoke tested and took photographs of all the problems, we found places that didn't have plastic caps over their clean-outs, places where we have our own sanitary sewers running into creeks and we will probably be finished with the plans this week. I don't want to wait another two weeks. What I'd like to mention, once the plans are finished we go out for public bids. Alot of things need to be done. I need your permission.

President Tucker asked if everyone was okay with that and stated you have my permission.

Mr. Toombs stated in addition to that I've been working with Rick and Jim Blincoe looking for problems and there is an area, Indian Oak Mobile Home Park, there are things that need to be done, there are alot of homes that have the little white pipe sticking up out of the groind that do not have a cap on them. We have made a seperate list of these. I would like the Boards permission to prepare a letter detailing that they are not allowed to leave these things open, they are responsible to cap these themselves, there are about forty of them.

Council Member Truman asked if we have an ordinance requiring that.

Mr. Toombs stated probably not.

Council Member Truman asked should we pass one, I just want to make sure we have the authority to back this up.

Mr. Toombs stated there are some problems at the school with drains and again we have some more investigating to do. I would like the Boards permission to write them a letter explaining what the problem is.

President Tucker stated I don't think anyone has a problem with that, as far as a letter being processed you and I both could sign it.

John Toombs, Consulting Engineer Addresses Council Concerning Sewer System Cont.

Mr. Toombs stated we can call or write but they somehow need to be informed officially.

Mr. Toombs stated in addition to all of that, back in 84, one of the Town employees went around to see if there were sump pumps, alot of people did. We asked several times for residents to get rid of their sump pumps. We have down spouts and yard drains running into the sanitary sewers. We'd like to prepare a notice to let residents know we can't have this going into our system. We need someone to check on these residents.

Mr. Toombs stated the last thing is if we are going to do all of this stuff, we need someone to go out and see that all of these things are done. We need a person to go out and make sure all of these things are done properly, to check drains, down spouts, and so forth. There are two ways this can be done, I can hire somebody or you can save alot of money by hiring you own. I'm here to recommend you do that.

Council Member Truman asked what type of rate would someone be paid.

Mr. Toombs stated it's hard for me to say, I don't know what your rate structure is.

Council Member Eddings asked would they need to be licensed.

Mr. Toombs stated no.

Council Member Truman asked would this be a temporary position, part-time, full-time or what.

President Tucker stated Rick and John and me will talk about it and come back with a recommendation.

Council Member Truman stated it sounds like a job for a utilities manager.

Dave Broady Addresses Council/Sewer Tap-In Fees

Council Member Broady stated in going over tap-in fees, I brought up a recommendation I'd like to give the Board Members, and let them look at it saying what it was and what I suggest it go to, to raise the tap-in fee which we'd do by ordinance and bring it back next meeting. It was \$450 and I'm suggesting it go to \$800. Clarksville in \$1200. I think it's well within range for the area. We are lower than Clarksville and Jeff.

Council Member Broady stated I'd also like to suggest that we get a quiet title or whatever we need to do and decide what we want to do with the old sewer plant. We can sell it or lease it. I'd like to get permission to ask Perry to see if he can get a quiet title.

Karl Truman Addresses Council/Tri-Township Fire District Vacancy

Council Member Truman stated one item I'd like to bring up is the Tri-Township Fire District is having a vacancy from the person who is the representative from the Town of Sellersburg area. The Town Board does not have any direct input as far as who that person is, they are appointed by the County Commissioners. The Town Council can make a recommendation to the County Commissioners as to who they would like to see them appoint from the Town of Sellersburg. Rod Pate who is a prior Council Member and serves on the Zoning Board and been active in the community has expressed an interest in that and I'd like to make a motion that the Council President on Town letterhead, write a letter to the County Commissioners asking them to appoint him to the Fire District Board to represent Sellersburg.

Motion made by Council Member Truman and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Council Member Everitt stated I think I know what Karl is saying but I feel like that's a County Commissioners job and there's other people who are interested in that job. I know Rod and I've worked with him, I feel Rod really wants it he could call Mr. Isgrigg and Ralph Guthrie and talk to them about it. The same as I'm sure other people will do. For the Town to go ahead and put in a name for this postion, I think would be asking to much for me to do it. I know Rod and he's a good man but there's other people my be interested in that job and I don't want them to say this is who the Town wants.

Vote 3-1 With Council Member Everitt voting against.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Henryville Water Company

Council Member Everitt stated that the Henryville Water Company would like to meet with Sellersburg to discuss maybe purchasing more water and they would like to have this meeting as soon as possible. I've got a card here and a name for you Stan.

President Tucker stated I'll call Mr. Masters and see what they are wanting.

Council Member Everitt stated they would like a million gallons a month.

President Tucker stated I will call Mr. Masters and see what he's wanting and call a meeting. President Tucker asked Council Member Eddings if he'd like to call Mr. Masters and find out what he's wanting and thanked Council Member Eddings.

Clerk Treasurer Presents Claims For This Meeting

Clerk Treasurer, Linda Schafer presented her claims for this meeting in the Civil, Sewer and Water Departments for the last two week period.

Motion was made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Broady to approve the claims as presented.

President Tucker Addresses Animal Registration

President Tucker stated that Linda brought to his attention, and I might ask the press to help us on this one. We have about three days until the licensing of animals runs out. We sell tags from March 1st to March 31st. Last year we licensed approximately 400, this year we've licensed only about 80. If they are not licensed and are picked up or complained about, they are heavily fined.

- Plans for ingress and egress could be submitted now with a bid date being established; or
- 3. Plans for the ingress and egress to be submitted after the bidding process has been completed with Swifty's bid being contingent upon the approval of the plans.

Mr. Bolly stated as a token of our good faith in this transaction, Swifty is willing to place the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) in escrow:

- 3. The Town of Sellersburg is unable to obtain a release or termination of the thirty foot (30) right-of-way on the front of the property.

There was to be an initial charge of \$1.00 and the rest was to be subsidized by the County. The cost goes up slightly in year two and year three we are to take it over totally. Starting June 1st, I believe the landfill, including the Clark Floyd Landfill will no longer take alot of the refuse that they use to take, grass clippings, refridgerators, etc. We had to start somewhere. Jerry Fuller is the person who is in charge of this on behalf of Clark County. I read the paper every night and there's at least one or two letters about the recycling. Lately there have not been as many negative letters. As far as Floyd County, I feel at some point in time they will recycle. They had to start somewhere. We have very little control. It has been in existence for about two weeks, I noticed the orange bins around town. All I can suggest is everyone participate and if you have questions or concerns call Mr. Fuller.

Harold Sullivan Addresses Council/Recycling

Mr. Sullivan stated I have something also on recycling. You charge us \$3.00 on our water bill and at 20,000 people that's \$74,000, BFI picks up these cans, they take these cans and sell them to Reynolds and American Aluminum and they get 60¢ a pound. Here's 26,000 more, BFI collects trash also from Louisville, there's paper, cans and a whole bunch of other stuff in there. They are not recycling. They are just taking it to the landfill. If I have less garbage and more recycled, my garbage should be down. We were told to have it out by 7:00 a.m. or 8:00 a.m. and it wasn't picked up until 4:00 p.m. today. I mean they are going to make money, but yet in a years time you are going to charge us more. They are not in this business to help us out. Recycling like I said is good but they are making money. Where does all of this money go. You've gotten over one million dollars.

Harold Sullivan Addresses Council/Recycling Cont.

President Tucker stated we do not service 20,000 people.

Mr. Sullivan stated another thing, I don't like is when they put an ordinance out and it's like sticking a gun to my head and saying "hey, you're going to recycle" and that's it. I'm not use to that, I spent 20 years in the Army and I do not like that. If I want to participate that should be fine. Don't say, "if you don't", I'm still going to bury it, if I want to take my cans somewhere else, if you're going to bill me \$1.00. That's my constitutional right. Are you taking my rights away from me?

President Tucker stated we are not taking your rights away. There were at least 6 public meetings about recycling over the last one year period. When the meeting was held here in Sellersburg two (2) people showed up, one from Borden and one from Henryville. There have been opportunities for the public to come in. What I suggest is that I will call Jerry Fuller, who is in charge of this and ask him to attend the next meeting if that's possible. You can come back at that time and air your views to him. He's the one who is in control of this system. We as a Township participated in order to make it work. Someone had to start somewhere.

Mr. Sullivan stated at one time I put three cans out and now I'll be lucky if I put out one and you're still going to charge me \$3.00.

President Tucker stated the landfill has incressed the amount that we have to pay to dump the garbage.

Mr. Sullivan stated when I called today to see when they were going to pick up they said they had been working 8, 10 and 12 hours because they had such a bunch of people in this. They had an overwhelming response to this. If you can find out how much they've picked up then you could find out how much tonage you're going to have to dump. Do you pay by the tonage or by the truck.

President Tucker stated by the tonage.

Council Member Eddings stated he was sure they would be tracking the tonage and it would probably be a couple of months.

President Tucker stated we pay over \$80,000.00 a year to dump at the landfill. We collect \$74,000.00, based on the number of households in Sellersburg. We have 5,600 households. In Sellersburg we pick up garbage for about 5,600 houses.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated that the population of Sellersburg is 5,914.

Council Member Truman stated that the point Mr. Tucker was trying to make is that Sellersburg does not make a profit off of the \$3.00 fee.

Harold Sullivan Addresses Council/Recycling Cont.

Mr. Sullivan stated when I talked to the engineer today they said Sellersburg serviced 20,000 people.

Mr. Truman stated do you think they meant the County.

Mr. Sullivan stated I told him where I lived.

President Tucker stated I think you were misinformed. Jerry Fuller has written letters to the Editor stating if you have any questions to call him and listed the number. Since this has only existed for about two weeks, it's probably a little premature to try and guess what it's going to do to our garbage collection. At the beginning it's going to be different than it will be on a long term basis.

Council Member Truman stated that the \$80,000.00 you were talking about is not the cost to pick up the garbage that it is just the tipping fee, what we pay at the landfill.

Karen Elliott Addresses Council/Town Properties

Ms. Elliott stated Don Erler of Remax Commercial Brokers has made a listing agreement and asked if the Council had a chance to look at it.

Council Member Eddings stated that he had no questions, that it is basically an agreement, somewhat of a guarantee on the sale of the property that covers the auctioneer, explains what his responsibilities are, his marketing and advertising fees and where the adds would run, what size the adds are. All we need is a signature from a representative of Sellersburg.

President Tucker stated if we do not receive 90% of market value we would not sell and would only owe the advertising fee.

Council Member Truman stated if it sells the 10% covers everything, auction fees, advertising, everything.

Ms. Elliott stated that's correct.

Ms. Elliott stated I was going to highlight a couple of areas that will be of interest to everybody, at the auction itself we will obtain bids and the high bid will be awarded, 10% buyers premium will be added to that high bid to determine the final sale price. That 10% will be paying all reality fees. We have engaged with other realitors by offering 1% of the high bid for agents who bring somebody in who might be interested in the property and that again would come out of the 10% buyers premium. There's going to be a down payment required of 15% at the day of auction that will keep up from running into someone backing out. That will pretty much guarantee the buyers performance. Closing will be 30 days after the sale.

Karen Elliott Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Ms. Elliott stated John Toombs will do the surveys of the Prather Lane properties. Also there is another property which is Double S Variety on Helbig. It is owned by Rod Pate. We believe that if we market this property at the same time and Mr. Pate would like to do this. It would bring a better price since it is adjacent to each other. Someone may have a need for both properties. We need to get the Board's input to see if they will allow that. Also I had asked Chuck Murphy if he would go ahead and provide a title opinion prior to the auction and also his legal opinion on the advertising and he gave us Indiana Code 5-J-1-2 and 36-111-4. The publication needs to be approved.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to approve the listing agreement prepared by Commerical Brokers/Remax, Auctioneer Don Erler and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Vote 4-0

Mr. Bolly presented a letter from Swifty Oil Co. which indicated that they would guarantee a minimum bid of \$90,000. including the buyers premimum and they will post a \$20,000. escrow amount. At this point you have agreed to do what they have asked you to do. This will in effect guarantee that it's going to sell. If they are the acceptable bidder the \$20,000. will apply as their down payment. If that's all consistant with what we've agreed.

President Tucker asked who shall act as the excrow agent for that money.

Council Member Truman asked if the Town has the money and Swifty is the successful bidder at the time of auction then the Town will end up writing a check. This is a thought, what about putting the money in Mr. Bolly's escrow account on behalf of Swifty. It would be better.

Mr. Bolly stated we were just trying to make a good faith deal with you.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to approve the public auction on June 24th at 11:00 a.m. for the Prather Lane property and 12:00 noon for the Old Firehouse property and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Council Member Truman asked if the auction would take place at the properties.

Ms. Elliott stated yes, at the properties.

Vote 4-0

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to allow Rod Pate which is Double S Variety to be marketed along with the Town Board's property. Mr. Pate will pay his share of the marketing fees and advertising fees. The Town will not be out any money. This will make the over all property more attractive to the buyers and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Karen Elliott Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Council Member Truman stated that it was important to note that they are seperate. The Town is not with Mr. Pate in any way.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to approve the notice for sale according to Indiana Code 5-3-1-2 E & I and Indiana Code 36-1-11-4 and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

Chief Kinder Addresses Council

Chief Kinder stated we need to get a couple of these traffic laws rewritten. We are also having a problem with grass and weeds finding out who owns the property. We can mow the grass and put a tax lien on the property.

President Tucker asked Chief Kinder to get with Perry McCall and find a way to solve this problem.

Chief Kinder stated that we lose our animal control officer on June 1st. We need to do something.

Chief Kinder stated that Fern Street is a real problem, the usual speeders, cars parked on one side. We are taking alot of heat over it. We don't have an officer to set down there. We are open for suggestions.

President Tucker stated could you check with Perry McCall and the other officers. I'm brainstorming at this point. I'm not suggesting we do this but we talked about speed bumps. I don't think this would go over to well but it's a possibility. Is there a way we could keep parking off the street. I don't know that we can do that either. I know some places like Louisville, you can't park on the streets between certain hours. I don't think the alternative road will be built any time soon.

Chief Kinder stated I think this is something that the Town Council needs to set down and decide.

President Tucker stated it's kind of hard for us to set down and brainstorm, it's called a public meeting anytime we set down.

Council Member Eddings asked what was some of the complaints about speed bumps.

Chief Kinder stated to dangerous for cars.

Council Member Eddings stated it wouldn't be if they didn't fly up and down through there.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council

Ms. Schafer stated also semi's.

Council Member Eddings stated I think that's been eleviated. They are going up Service Drive.

Attorney McCall stated if you change the weight limit on that road it wouldn't happen. We've talked about that before.

President Tucker stated there is a back way for them to get in now, they don't have to use Fern Street.

Council Member Eddings stated now that we don't have the semi's going through there, we should put speed bumps through there to keep the people slowed down.

A resident asked why you couldn't put a speed camera up.

President Tucker stated I don't know that we have a camera but be appreciated the suggestion.

A resident stated that alot of the people who live on that road were told that Fern Street wouldn't be the main road for the park and that's access to their homes. Putting speed bumbs on that road would really upset them.

President Tucker stated they would be upset no matter what. It's like darned if you do and darned if you don't.

President Tucker stated it's probably a couple years away before the road will be build, it's not in the budget.

President Tucker called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:35 p.m.

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting and requested a motion to approve them.

Jennifer Humphries Addressed Council/United Way

Ms. Humphries stated that she is the new area manager for the United Way. I'm just here to talk a little about the United Way. I've only been with the organization for about 2½ months. Jennifer Adrio has moved on to Metro United Way.

Ms. Humphries stated we have had some changes in the last year, one of the most important things I feel is to get the information out for the people to get the service they need. We do raise money and the money keeps these agencies open to provide the services. People need to know that these services are available. I will leave some brochures. These are last years, we are having new ones made. I'm not sure how many of you know that Clark Co. United Way merged with Metro United Way in Louisville, so we all are part of Metro United Way. Clark County United Way is about 50 years old and up until last year it was it's own independent United Way. Being part of Metro does not mean we are not independent. Clark County United Way has it's own Board of Directors, they have their own volunteers to raise money and it does have it's own set of agencies that funding goes to.

Mr. Humphries stated I know many of you know Mr. Francis Conroy, he lives here in Sellersburg. He is an advisory board member this year. There are 19 agencies in Clark Co. that we provide services for.

Jennifer Humphries Addressed Council/United Way Cont.

Ms. Humphries stated you can call the Clark Co. Help Line and also get information. Clark County Government is getting ready to kick off it's campaign and all government offices are going to be running campaigns. I'm looking forward to running the campaign in Sellersburg.

President Tucker thanked Ms. Humphries and stated I might add that since Clark County and Metro has merged that Clark County has received more money than what was in their budget because Metro has given us additional money.

Carl Kamer Addresses Council/Silver Creek Township Park

President Tucker stated that we need to generate an agreement that you may use Town equipment after hours, not during town hours and you need to have a licensed operator, preferably a town employee. I have not had a chance to put that agreement together. Ed and I talked about it but Perry is out of Town, as far as the water deposit and the sewer tap in inspection fee, my personal feeling is that since that park is not in the Town of Sellersburg but we do utilize it, we do need the park to pay the \$650.00. That would make it just like everybody else. I think that covers everything, fixing it so you pay \$8.50 a month for sewer.

Mr. Kamer asked what about the water, that doesn't go into the sewer.

President Tucker stated we do have people who have sprinkler systems and they have a seperate meter. My suggestion is to get a seperate meter and use it for the sprinkling. We can make adjustments on that because it doesn't go through the sewer.

Council Member Truman stated it would be better if Mr. Kamer would outline for the Board exactly what he is asking for. That would be a good place to start.

Mr. Kamer stated why should I have to pay the \$600.00 inspection fee.

President Tucker stated it's a \$550.00 sewer tap in fee and \$50.00 inspection fee. Everyone who tapped into the sewer paid this fee. My feeling is that if it is not in the Town of Sellersburg persay, it's being used by the people in Sellersburg, this is my opinion, it's my feeling that the tap in fee should be paid.

Mr. Kamer stated you have 75% of the kids using that park. I would think that the Town would be willing to help out a little bit.

President Tucker stated I think to some extent we've already done that. The money that we have comes from the residents of the Town and that is not in the Town of Sellersburg, I have a hard time rationalizing the use of Sellerburg tax money into a entity that's not in the Town of Sellersburg, at some point in time it's going to be in Sellersburg. I assume. I do agree that probably 75% of the kids are from Sellersburg and some are from Charlestown, Borden and some other areas. I'm giving you my views on this. If Karl or Roy or Doug want to look at it another way that's fine, that's why we are here to talk about it.

Council Member Eddings asked if the \$8.50 sewer charge was the minimum charge and if that' what they'd pay every month.

President Tucker stated yes that's right.

Mrs. Schafer stated it would be \$20.40 for the meter size he has all year around.

Council Member Eddings stated you have two restroom facilities there, that would be more than \$8.50 per month during the summer.

Council Member Truman stated before we start getting into a discussion on everything, I would like to get a list of all the items they are asking for the Town to do. Let's go back and review them.

President Tucker stated if we can find a way to average the water bill would that be appropriate. That's what we are doing on the sewer. I don't have a problem with that. President Tucker asked what is the lowest fee on the water.

Mrs. Schafer stated I didn't count on water, I was considering giving him a year around fee at the lower meter because he does water the grass.

President Tucker stated that's on the sewer charge right.

Mrs. Schafer stated that's right.

President Tucker stated we know the sewer rate now we need to get the minimum water price, we will look into that.

President Tucker stated I'm going to let Clark and Doug determine the minimum amount of water, there must be some way we can average this out.

Council Member Everitt stated it should work out the same but I feel the \$550.00 is Sellersburg money and the tap in should be paid.

Council Member Truman stated I would like to get a list or is this everything. I've got

- 1. Is asking the waive the tap in inspection fee.
- 2. The water rate.
- The sewer rate.
- 4. The interlocal agreement to use Town equipment.

President Tucker stated that's basically it, using the backhoe and the dump truck occasionally after working hours of the Town, with a licensed operator with insurance.

Council Member Truman stated that he would like to put into the minutes that he is the Attorney for the Silver Creek Township so this is on the table.

Council Member Truman stated I don't feel this presents any type of conflict of interest for me or anything. This does not prohibit me from entering into discussion on these issues. Regarding the fees, technically, it is not in the Town boundaries, it's so close it's almost part of the Town. It is another governmental agency. I don't have a problem with waiving the fees. That's my opinion.

Council Member Everitt stated the way it is set up it's \$550.00.

President Tucker stated I think what Dave said is that we charge \$450.00 for the tap in fee and waive the inspection.

Mrs. Schafer stated you are under a tariff, when you are dealing with a meter deposit through the Indiana Utilities Regulatory Commission and you have to collect the \$50.00 deposit. As far as the \$550.00 and \$50.00, I would think you would have to amend the ordinance that you currently have on sewer.

President Tucker stated let me offer a suggestion. I don't mean to table this, it sounds like a cop out and that's not what I'm saying, but Karl since you respresent the Silver Creek Township Park, could you get with Perry and basically come up with some kind of agreement that covers the equipment, interlocal agreement that covers the equipment after working hours, sewer rate of \$8.50, water rate. Doug will find that out in a couple of days and I make a recommendation that we waive the water deposit. We can not waive the inspection fee, is that correct.

Mrs. Schafer stated no.

President Tucker stated we can't waive the water deposit but we can waive the sewer inspection fee.

Council Member Eddings stated that we should check with the Indiana Utilities Regulatory's Commission before we do this.

Mrs. Schafer stated the Town Council governs the sewer fees only the water utility is under the Indiana Utilities Regulatory Commission.

President Tucker stated Perry will be back on the 16th and what I recommend is \$8.50 flat sewer, a minimum water rate year around and a agreement about the usage of equipment. We can not eliminate the water deposit, we can reduce the sewer inspection fee. We have to make sure we can do this where we don't have to go back and change all of the ordinances. We should have all of this before the next meeting and will try to give a copy to you before the meeting on June 27th.

Barbara Sanders Addresses Council/Public Hearing-Atlas of Indiana

Ms. Sanders stated that Atlas of Indiana, they are a trucking firm, they want to put their offices on one side and the maintenance building on the other side.

Jane Ash Addresses Council/Gillenwater Estates

Mrs. Ash stated I don't want you to think that we do this everytime someone drops a piece of paper in the grass. These pictures are dated April 14 which I went to the Chief directly.

Council Member Everitt stated I'd like to add that just a couple of weeks ago we had dumpsters 75 to 100 yards from here.

Mrs. Ash stated all of this stuff was moved in the backyard in October. In September when the Town furnished the dumpsters, which we appreciate, I went next door as a good neighbor and said May did you know the dumpsters at the end of the block are for all of us to use and not just the people on the corner. Anyway, she said we are bringing this in the house, so I said okay, I tried. In October, they moved it to the backyard, the mattresses were added after the first of the year. We gave them time from October to April, I went to the Chief, I made a mistake, I went next door and took pictures and told her I was going to the Town Board. Well she put everything under the house. Like the Chief said, it's out of the yard, so we had no complaint. Now, two months later things are a mess and it's other properties too.

Mr. Prather stated according to the ordinances, they should be notified by mail and given 30 days to clean it up. After the 30 days if it's not cleaned up, the council needs to decide what penalties need to occur. The Town can seek a lien on the property.

President Tucker asked Steve to send a follow up letter to remind them they have 15 days to clean up or we will take legal action.

Mr. Prather stated he hasn't been by theckeck.

Mrs. Ash stated that there are three problem areas. They don't care.

Mr. Truman asked if anyone has called the Health Department.

Mrs. Ash stated don't give us anymore agencies to call.

Mr. Truman stated I'm not passing the buck, we need to take whatever action we can, it's just another place to put pressure on them. The Clark County Health Department has the authority too.

Mrs. Ash asked Mr. Truman if he was an attorney and stated she would appreciate it if you would do that for us.

Mr. Truman asked what.

Ms. Ash stated whatever you just said, call the Health Department.

Called To Order

President Tucker called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:34 p.m.

Prayer

The prayer was offered by Reverend Tim Weddell.

Minutes Of The Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting and requested a motion to approve them.

Council Member Truman stated I have a couple of minor corrections:

Page 3, where the title refers to Carl Kamer, Carl Kamer starts his name with a "C" and not a "K".

Page 5, first paragraph, where it says Council Member Truman, second sentence, this does not permit me, I believe I said this does not prohibit me. So that's all.

President Tucker stated with those two changes do I have a motion to approve the minutes.

Motion to approve the minutes as corrected by Council Member Everitt and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

Mrs. Schafer stated excuse me, I do have something to say. I put those minutes in the box one week prior to the meeting so they can be reviewed, if there is a problem in the future to correct the originals because the paper is very expensive, I would appreciate you letting me know in advance.

Council Member Truman stated that's why I brought it up tonight.

Carl Kamer Addresses Council/Silver Creek Park

Mr. Kamer stated what are you offering me Stan.

President Tucker stated if I remember, the last meeting Karl was suppose to get with you and see in essence what you would like to see done. There is a water bill, sewer bill, tap in fee, basically four or five fees altogether which I don't even know if I have. In essence what I thought was going to happen, you were going to come back and tell us what you would like to see happen and basically we could tell you if that could be done. If I'm not mistaken, there was a \$50.00 water deposit fee, a \$550.00 sewer tap in fee and \$50.00 inspection fee, we had talked about dropping that to \$450.00 if I remember correctly. Then there was also a suggestion that we do a flat fee of \$8.50 for the sewer fee for the whole twelve months. According to the State that regulates the water utilities, we have to charge whatever water usage you use. We can't fix that.

President Tucker asked Council Member Truman if he had any input.

Council Member Truman stated no, actually I thought that Perry and I would discuss an interlocal agreement on the use of the equipment. I didn't remember anything that Carl and I were suppose to get together on.

President Tucker stated well we left it at, I think we can look back in the minutes, that it was suppose to be presented at this board meeting so we would know what Carl wanted and what we could do because at that time you weren't clear on all of the pieces that were to be put in place.

President Tucker stated there was an interlocal agreement that they could use equipment after hours with the proper person using it, \$8.50 sewer charge, basically a water charge, whatever that was going to be. We were going to drop the sewer tap in fee from \$550.00 to \$450.00, I think we could not waive the water deposit fee. The way I understand it and tell me if I'm incorrect. There is a \$50.00 meter deposit, \$450.00 sewer tap in fee, \$8.50 a month sewer, whatever the water bill comes out to be and we need to come up with some kind of agreement that says you can use the town equipment after hours, in essence under town supervision. Does everybody agree with that.

Mr. Kamer stated that the man with the State Board of Accounts said that you all could waive that sewer tap in fee and you all are not in favor of that.

President Tucker stated we reduced it, we did not waive it. I personally, as I told you two weeks ago, am not in favor of that since it is not, quote unquote, in the Town of Sellersburg.

Council Member Truman stated I'm in favor or waiving it because it's for the community, it's not like we are doing it for one person or any particular individual. I mean it's for the good of the community.

President Tucker stated if you would like to make a motion on that we can vote on it.

Carl Kamer Addresses Council/Silver Creek Park Cont.

Council Member Truman stated is that the tap in fee for the sewer.

Motion made by Council Member Truman that we waive the sewer tap in fee for the Silver Creek Township Park, the \$550.00 tap in fee and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 2-3, with Council Members Truman and Broady voting in favor and Council Members Everitt, Eddings and President Tucker voting against.

Council Member Eddings stated I'm not in favor to waive it but I am in favor of reducing it.

Motion made to reduce the tap in fee from \$550.00 to \$450.00 by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Vote 4-0

Mr. Kamer stated let me ask you one more question, what is the minimum fee on the water bill.

President Tucker stated I don't have the figures on that.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated you can't do that, it's governed by the Indiana Regulatory Commission. We would not be able to adjust the water. They are set rates through the Indiana Regulatory Commission.

President Tucker asked Perry if he could get with Karl and put something together, we are looking at a \$50.00 water deposit, \$450.00 sewer tap in , flat rate of \$8.50 a month on sewer and whatever the meter reading is for water usage and then the use of the equipment.

Council Member Everitt asked Mr. Kamer if he was in a hurry tonight.

Mr. Kamer stated yes.

Council Member Everitt stated the reason I asked is because we have some people here tonight that have some questions about the ballpark.

Mr. Kamer stated well if the Town Board wants to use it, it will be no.

Mr. Everitt stated okay, that Carl use to be President of the Town Council a few years back.

Mary Carney Addresses Council/Silver Creek Pool

Ms. Carney stated I live on Dreyer Lane and the reason that I have been put on the agenda tonight is that for the area residents. There is blatant disregard of the speed limit, speeding and hot rodders. We need more police patrol in this area. I think if we could get the police out there, maybe for several weeks the word would get out.

President Tucker stated I think we have someone else here from that area, Ron and Theresa Arrington and asked if this was something simular or different.

Mr. Arrington stated it is coupled right along with that. I live at 609 Catalpa and the problems we're having or were having have been resolved because the gates were closed last Wednesday. I understand they may be reopened. The problems were kids drag racing in the street out front, I'm talking side by side drag racing in from of our homes. We can't let our kids get out and play. We have a problem with loud music. I like to see kids have a place to play, especially teenagers. The problem is they abuse it. The homes in the immediate area, we suffer from the loud noise, boom boxes, that music is really unbearable. We have called the Sellersburg Police on several occasions to ask them to turn it down, they can't tell them to turn it down. What we are really asking for is some direction or help. What do we do. How do we control this problem. We have a trash problem, kids with no respect to the regards of residents in this area, chasing balls or whatever they are doing. All kinds of problems going on besides the trash and rodent problems.

A resident asked if it would be possible to put speed bumps on Catalpa, are they costly. There are times at 3:00 a.m. cars going 50 m.p.h., are speed bumps costly. The police do a fine job when they are there but as soon as that car leaves, right back to 40 m.p.h. or whatever they want to do. When the police are there, you can see a police car, everyone slows down to 20 m.p.h. once they leave it's back up. Could we get speed bumps.

President Tucker stated we are not sure they are legal in Indiana. I've asked the Attorney to look into that number 1, number 2, they can cause liability problems for the Town because of people hitting them too hard cracking their neck or whatever they may say happened to them and they sue the Town for that, not that it's not a valuable alternative but we are looking to try to answer. There's alot more people here tonight than usual and I assume alot of it has to do with Catalpa and Dreyer at the Swimming Pool. I have talked to the President of the Parks Department and what we are recommending is that we hold a special meeting two weeks from now with the Parks Board which was not totally there last Tuesday night when we were there. We made some sort of emergency changes last Tuesday night to solve the immediate problem and put a lock on the gate and that's where the garbage was picked up the next day.

President Tucker stated we will have a meeting and if Chief Kinder could be there.

Chief Kinder stated he would be there.

President Tucker stated two weeks from tomorrow night, this will be in essence a special parks board meeting. It will be listed in the paper because we have to do that at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting. That's going to be the 12th, does that sound like the correct date.

Mary Carney Addresses Council/Silver Creek Pool Cont.

Mrs. Garr stated I would like to thank you for the attention you gave us last week. The park is well used. Since the gates have been closed there is a different breed of kids using skates and scooters that could not play before because of all of the traffic. We want to thank you.

President Tucker stated we've heard those comments and also others. In politics half are right and half are wrong. That's why we decided to hold a meeting two weeks from tomorrow night at the Library in this same room. All interested neighbors should attend and we can get the pro's and con's. The chief will be here and we can get the legal aspect and so forth. We don't have a, quote unquote, noise ordinance persay, but according to the chief that kind of runs into a nightmare kind of like the speed bumps.

Chief Kinder stated we've looked into this and I think disorderly conduct may fall into this. I'll need to check with Attorney McCall. I think that applies to a public disturbance when you have a complaint in the neighborhood. If you call in and complain about noise or something, they will answer the complaint and get back with you.

President Tucker stated the meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. next Tuesday night, July 12th at the Library.

Mr. Bill Peters stated when we bought our property, we were told there was one foot of property and there would be no thoroughfare as far as the loud noise it is definately a problem.

President Tucker stated as far as the thoroughfare, that is a legal question and I will ask the Attorney to look into it. I don't perceive that as a thoroughfare going into the park.

President Tucker stated we will try to keep the gate locked, we may let some lifeguards come and park in that area but it will get locked back at night. It is not a thoroughfare.

Mr. Hanger stated he will open the gate for deliveries because it is not safe for some deliveries to be made from the entrance.

President Tucker stated this is a temporary solution until we can get everyone together and come up with a solution, to let the lifeguards and delivery trucks in seems reasonable.

Mr. Dold stated I know everyone here is on one side, but there has to be someone on the other. My daughter brings her child to the pool, she has to drive all the way down Utica to get into the park. If you have a thoroughfare there open it.

President Tucker stated his suggestion is to ask your daughter to attend the meeting.

Mr. Dold stated it's just like I told her, there's too much money in Dreyer Estates, they can get about what they want.

Mary Carney Addresses Council/Silver Creek Pool Cont.

A resident stated we sure pay our taxes over there.

President Tucker stated those people are addressing the swimming pool and Dreyer issue, if that's satisfactory, we will be here Tuesday night, two weeks from tonight at 6:30 p.m. and it will be in the paper as well.

Dennis Ott Addresses Council/Water Standing On His Property

Mr. Ott stated I don't have anything nearly as controversial. We own the four plex right over here on New Albany Street adjacent to the library property. We bought that property in 1991 and sometime in the winter of 1991 there was work done on the sewer lines back in that area and apparently opened an underground spring which now runs onto our parking lot basically keeping a constant puddle, mud puddle at most times in our parking lot. We don't have any way of getting rid of the water. I talked to Mr. Eddings about it and he looked at it and told me that he thought the best solution would be to come and address the Board and see if there was some way of asking the contractor, who did the work on the sewer repair, upgrade or whatever, to come back and correct the situation that they apparently created. That's my request, I'd like to have something done about the water that's coming on to my property.

President Tucker stated Mr. Toombs helps us in the area of engineering. All I want you to do John is take a look at it and tell me what it is or what it isn't.

Mr. Toombs stated we can't get the contractor back, we don't know what it is. I've already looked at it. We can test it and see if it is city water or sewage. The contractor has been gone way too long.

President Tucker asked it there was a way we could tap it and put a pump on it.

Mr. Toombs stated well, I'm sure that's about all your going to be able to do.

President Tucker stated we will look into it and find out if we can fix it and find out how much it will cost to fix it. If you keep in touch with Doug or the Town Hall, we will let you know as quickly as possible.

Mark Fraley Addresses Council/Tax Abatement

I was here in September of 1992 to approve the building and tax abatement in Avco, evidently there were some forms that needed to be signed at that time.

President Tucker asked Mr. Fraley if he had the forms by any chance. If you will give them to us, basically it is standard that anyone who moves into Avco Industrial Park receive a tax abatement on the building so all we have to do is vote on it and give me permission to sign it.

Mark Fraley Addresses Council/Tax Abatement Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated it had already been voted on, just the papers wasn't filled out right.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated she had looked back through the minutes and there was an approval for him to be there but it wasn't never voted on for the abatement.

Motion made by Council Member Everitt to approve the tax abatement for 1711 Avco Blvd., Sellersburg, Indiana for Mark Fraley Produce and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Vote 4-0

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Nuisances

Chief Kinder stated at present we have some memo's going out to people in town. This is for the news media mainly. We are asking for people to cut their shrubs back and if not we will come back to the Town Board and if we cut it, come back with a tax lien. We are having problems at intersections.

Chief Kinder stated number two, we just painted the intersection at Enterprise Way, we've put stop bars in. According to the highway engineers, they all recommend that a stop sign and not a yield sign be put up on Ohio. This was recommended when they put up the yield sign. I realize this is an inconvenience for the residents of Hill -n- Dale but right now it's a serious problem. I'm asking the Town Board to put a stop sign on Ohio.

Council Member Eddings asked if there was a Traffic Safety Commission that could make that recommendation.

Chief Kinder stated the engineers made that recommendation. They are going to take that island in from of Burger King our. The highway dept. is taking that out. That's going to create more of a problem since they've built Dairy Mart it's really become a major intersection.

President Tucker stated from a safety stand point, you're alot better off stopping there then trying to yield anyway.

Council Member Truman stated I was wondering who would be at fault, the person that crossed the double yellow line or the person not yielding.

President Tucker stated do you feel, Chief, since this is an issue, that we ought to give some notice and let the people have an opportunity to speak.

President Tucker stated I would like to suggest with the help of the Eveving News, Leader and Tribune, that at our next meeting we will discuss putting a stop sign up at the corner of Ohio Street and Enterprise Way. This will be discussed at our next meeting on July 11th.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Nuisances Cont.

Council Member Truman stated I think we ought to put a notice in the legal section.

President Tucker asked Clerk Treasurer Schafer if she would put a notice in the newspaper that we are going to discuss putting a stop sign at the corner of Ohio and Enterprise Way. It will be discussed at the July 11th meeting.

Stephen Prather, Building Commissioner Presents Claims

Mr. Prather stated I have two issues, last month on my report we issued a permit that was found to be in the County to a Brian Beaver so we owe a \$15.00 refund, I guess I need to get that approved. What I have done is adjusted this months report so that it's already reflected on this. The receipts are actually \$15.00 less that they actually were.

Motion to approve Building Commissioner's claim from June 14 thru June 27th in the amount of \$962.55 and to have the Town refund Mr. Beaver his \$15.00 made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Vote 4-0

Mr. Prather stated the other issued I have is a resident contacted me on Applegate Lane pertaining to a fence that was installed, the fence did have proper permits and it is the proper height however, on one side the homeowner put the fence up and has the finished side facing toward his own property. The way the houses set on Applegate Lane the neighbor looks at the back side of the fence. He would like the Council to ask him to turn around the fence so the finished side is out. My question to the Board is, our fence ordinance does not stipulate which side has to face out. He wants to know if something can be done. I don't think we have any grounds to ask them to turn it around. The only thing our ordinance states is the location and height.

President Tucker stated I basically think that's what you should tell them. We do not have an ordinance to address that, maybe the two people could get together and he could paint the fence, that's what I've done to mine.

Mr. Prather stated it is a new fence, it's not an eyesore or anything, it's the fact that you're looking at the post.

Mr. Prather stated you also asked me to follow up, I will be sending out follow up letters tomorrow on the three properties on Wilson Lane. I'm going to drive over there tonight and make sure there's been no change.

Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties

Mr. Erler stated I'm Don Erler. I was employed along with Karen Elliott and Jim Baker to perform the auction on the surplus properties. The lot on the corner of 311 and Prather lane and the Old Fire House on Utica Street.

Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Mr. Erler stated that proposal had been presented to the Board and approved. The auction was scheduled to be held on June 24th. All of the promotional activities were carried out, the response was favorable but when we neared the auction date we learned that the legal notices that were to be placed in order to validate the title pursuant to Indiana Statute for some reason or another had carried an incorrect date that indicated that the auction would be held on July 24th as opposed to June 24th. In checking with that and at the request of several of the interested parties, we checked back with Chuck Murphy who had been engaged by the city to look into the statutory basis of how to sell the properties. Mr. Murphy recommended based on the fact that the later date had been published and even though corrected, that to guarantee the title, the auction be cancelled for June 24th and not be held again pryor to July 24th. You have a notice in front of you, that notice was distributed at the sale date at the sale location on June 24th indicating that the auction had been cancelled for that date and would be rescheduled at a future date and that the future date would be discussed at this council meeting.

Mr. Erler stated in the process of advertising the properties something else had arisen that we felt needed to be brought to the council's attention that could be a very favorable situation, may be a good coming out of a bad situation. It was indicated to us that some parties were interested specifically in the 311/Prather Lane property. We would classify as being other than local buyers, somebody with national standing that had substantial uses for that particular tract of land and would pay a premimum to purchase that property. The one thing that had been brought to our attention was that the auction format that we had recommended and we still felt would serve the purpose for the town did not necessarily meet the criteria for national type buyers, they require certain due diligent requirements before they make the final committment to purchase a piece of property and normally operate under a sealed bid format that would permit certain due diligent periods to pass, due diligence for title, due diligence for ingress and egress, due diligence for building permits and things of this nature. In light of the interest that has been expressed to us we would recommend the following for the Town Council's consideration.

Mr. Erler stated we proceed to hold the auction at the Fire House and the additional property that had been allowed to be sold with it, Rod Pate's property, which is adjacent to the Old Fire House property. That auction be continued on Friday, June 29th. The format of the 311/Prather Lane offered by the City be amended from a public auction format to a sealed bid arrangement that would allow buyers that have more thorough requirements as to their purchase investigations to allow those parties to participate which in our judgement would possible bring a substantially higher price for the properties than as with the public auction format that we had originally proposed. Normally we don't see these buyers and didn't expect them but they did surface and have shown some indication and in our judgement should be a sealed bid arrangement be allowed which is permitted according to Mr. Murphy and to Mr. McCall because we have discusses this with them.

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Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Mr. Erler stated this is a permitted method to sell property under Indiana Statute. If we were to use this method in our judgement, we feel we will get offers which are substantially higher than we feel we would get out of a public auction format, not to ask the Board to make a final decision on this we would like to do a little bit further investigation and we feel like since Mr. Murphy has indicated that the auction can't be held until at least July 24th. We would like to return to the Council at there meeting on Monday, July 11th with a written recommendation as to exactly how this would proceed, exactly what the cost would be involved, what our proposal on commissions and arrangements would be. We are not asking to be relieved of our responsibilities. We would come back with a written recommendation for Board approval that would allow us enough time for the auction and/or sealed bid.

Mr. Erler stated that basically is our report. We apologize, sometimes there are oversites, these things happen. We have generated a number of substantial buyers and we feel they will continue to be interested. We will maintain contact with them as to the way we are going to proceed.

President Tucker asked if anyone showed up on the 24th.

Mr. Erler stated yes, we had several. We were able to recontact a number of folks before they showed up at the sites to let them know. We had posted signs prior to the 24th and indicated that the auction had been rescheduled. We didn't have the date so the date was not on the signs. The only error that was caused and this happened because I was trying to react in a fairly short period of time was we posted a banner across the advertisement in the Leader, Banner and Giveaway published on the 22nd of June that indicated that it had been rescheduled for July 11th, which we found out from Mr. Murphy that it would not satisfy the statute either.

Mr. Erler stated that the point is that we have generated good activity and there's good solid buyers out there, more than I guess I anticipated, especially on the 311/Prather Lane property.

Mr. Murphy stated that he had spoke with Mr. Bolly yesterday and he had no problem with that.

Council Member Truman stated if we are going to address changing the format, I think someone ought to notify him.

Mr. Erler stated I think it would give everybody proper breathing room if we came back to you in two weeks and said that we have done some investigation and a sealed bid doesn't seem to be heading anywhere and I think we ought to public auction all of these the way we originally assumed we should. We don't have the notice time to sell the Fire House and the 311 property on two different dates and in our judgement whatever we do needs to be a joint promotion whether we be promoting a sealed bid on the 311 properties or a public auction on the Fire House. The publications need to be carried the same. They have basically carried the headline of municipal auction.

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Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

President Tucker stated why don't we just wait unil the July 11th meeting and get your recommendations at that point.

Mr. Erler stated that's what I would recommend.

President Tucker stated I want to do it right the first time.

Mr. Erler stated there is one other issue if I may address it, in dealing with the 311/Prather Lane property we had all of the utilities marked, the water company, which is owned by the Town has not been able to determine whether or not the old water line which apparently followed the Old Prather Lane, may or may not be immediately transacting that property. The question has been raised by a potential bidder on that property, if I were to buy that property and I dig my foundation and find that the main water line is going right through the middle of my property, who's responsibility is it to move it.

President Tucker asked Clark Henson if we could find that out. Clark has indicated that soundings indicate that it may be going across the middle of the property but the drawings indicate that it's not. We don't know.

Mr. Erler stated I guess the question is the legalities and if it's on the property, is the city willing to move it.

President Tucker stated his senses are that we would be responsible.

Mr. Murphy stated that you sell basically as is and if the buyer wants the lines moved they would pay to have them moved.

Mr. Erler stated I guess we would like to know two things, one is if they are there, that would be helpful and number two, what's the council's pleasure as to how to offer it. Do we offer it being moved if it's in the way or do they pay the cost if it has to be moved.

President Tucker stated if we have more information by the July 11th meeting we can get it to you then.

Council Member Broady Addresses Council

Council Member Broady stated we have obtained the final easement for Speed's sewer problem and we will proceed next Monday.

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Council Member Everitt Addresses Council

Council Member Everitt stated back on Ohio Street by McDonald's, is there anyway that we can have the Indiana State Highway Department there. The gentleman I knew is gone. I'd like to see someone at that meeting. I know the past Board was told to put a stop sign and we put a yield sign but since the other businesses came in it may be everybody's best bet to put up stoplights with turning signals up.

President Tucker asked Chief Kinder if he would call over there and ask if someone with knowledge of that intersection could attend the next meeting.

Council Member Everitt stated I'm talking about the stoplight on 311, they may have to change that lighting system for a right and left hand turns. I would like to see the Highway Department at that meeting, they could maybe answer some questions.

Chief Kinder stated then I suggest Mr. Everitt call them, Chas Hunter told us that day that the Town of Sellersburg accepted that the way it was and they never contacted the Highway Department.

After much discussion Council Member Everitt stated he would contact the State Highway Department.

Clerk Treasurer Addresses Council/Bill Mosley Park

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I would like the Council President to go over the Bill Mosley Park information that we had discussed. My understanding is there should have been a street sign up there also.

President Tucker stated I gave it to Dwight, I did not read the whole thing. My understanding is that in 1990, they dedicated the pool, I guess in name to Mr. Mosley. I talked to Virgil Bolly not to long ago. The Town doesn't really own the swimming pool. It is actually owned by a corporation which has a board of directors and the board of directors no longer exist. Virgil Bolly was on that board of directors and said that he would try to put that board of directors back together in some way so they could address some of these issues. They are the ones for example, that have to deed the pool to the town, there's no other way to do that. They are the ones who have to support the erection of the sign.

President Tucker stated right now that board has to be put back in place in order for any legal action to take place. There were like seven people on that board, most of whom are not around here or deceased. If we can get in touch with Virgil and see if he will take the time to put that back together so we can take care of the legal action of naming the park and hopefully putting the swimming pool into the town's name. The town is paying all of the bills and doing all of the funding. It's only logical that it be in the towns name, according to Virgil there is only two board members alive.

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Clerk Treasurer Addresses Council/Bill Mosley Park Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated I believe, Ms. Mosley, what happened with the last town board, was that we did name the street going into the park Mosley Lane, that's already on the books. We just haven't got none of the signs up yet.

Ms. Mosley stated I believe the name was Mosley Park Road.

Council Member Everitt stated that was done but as far as renaming the pool, we didn't do that. All we did was name the road going into it.

President Tucker asked Mr. McCall if he could check into deeding the pool to the town after it is paid off and also renaming the road and what we can do after it becomes ours. It will take a little while just like everything else, we will look into it.

Clerk Treasurer: Presents Claims

Clerk Treasurer, Linda Schafer presented her claims for this meeting in the Civil, Sewer and Water Departments for the last two week period.

Motion to approve claims made by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

A regular meeting of the Sellersburg Town Council was held at 6:30 p.m. at the Sellersburg Library. Those present were: Stanley E. Tucker, Council President; Dave Broady, Council Vice-President; Doug Eddings, Jr., Council Member; Roy Everitt, Council Member; Karl Truman, Council Member; Linda G. Schafer, Clerk Treasurer; Perry McCall, Attorney.

Called To Order

President Tucker called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:44 p.m.

Prayer

The prayer was offered by Reverend Bob Hauselman.

Pledge Pledge

The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

Minutes of the Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting and requested a motion to approve them.

Motion made by Council Member Broady to approve the minutes and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Vote 4-0

Public Meeting/River Hills Economic Development-Storm Water Drainage Grant

President Tucker stated that River Hills Economic Development has put a notice in the paper that we are going to resubmit a CFF Grant for storm water drainage.

President Tucker stated we submitted it before and unfortunately we were not successful. We have until the end of this month to resubmit. We have made some adjustments, basically, as far as our portion of the funding, our portion of funding last time was 10%, it will be 25% this time. Hopefully it will happen because it is a major problem in Sellersburg.

Motion to approve the grant proposal for July 29th made by Council Member Everitt and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Vote 4-0

Ms. Gallitelli asked if members from the town board and other interested parties would sign the attendance sheet.

Allen Morris, Attorney Addresses Council/Vacation of Alleyways

Mr. Morris stated I'm an attorney here in Clark County. Tonight I'm representing the Indiana Vocational Technical College, Ivy Tech, S. E. I previously filed a petition for vacation of certain alleys which are adjacent to Ivy Tech. I have with me tonight, Doyle Berry, Director of Facilities at Ivy Tech also David Clifton who is Director of Instruction. If you have any questions, I'll be more than happy to answer them or if I can't, those gentlemen will.

Mr. Morris stated in accordance with IC 36-7-3-12 and 5-3-1-2, I prepared a notice which was published in the Evening News. I will enter that to your clerk for entrance into the record. There are also two affidavits, one for the Evening News and one for the Clark County Journal indicating that the notices were properly published.

Mr. Morris stated also pursuant to those statutes we sent notice to all of the adjoining property owners certified mail, returned receipt requested, at this time I will tender to the clerk an original copy of the petition which was filed, the original green cards which were returned from the adjacent property owners and ask that those be placed in the record.

Mr. Morris stated you have, I hope, copies of the petition that I filed. I have heard no objection from any of the adjacent property owners. I did receive a call from the Indiana Attorney Generals Office, I returned that call and was unable to speak with the attorney that had called me. I haven't received any correspondence. We have the petition before you, in addition to that I have a copy of the plat map. This same petition has been brought before the county. There was some question as to whether parts of this were in the county or in Sellersburg. I have discussed that matter in great detail with your engineer, John Toombs, he said he would be here tonight and I do not see him. He has drawn the conclusion and I don't mean to speak for him, that it is within the Town of Sellersburg. I have spoken with Rollin Blankenbaker whom is a local surveyor, who has researched it and he also is of the opinion that it is within the Town of Sellersburg. The County Commissioners on September 15, 1992 voted 3-0 to vacate the alley and I'11 read the language right out of the minutes, "To the extent that it is in the Commissioner's jurisdiction and authorize the use of the commissioner's stamp for an ordinance", no ordinance was ever submitted and they were of the opinion, according to their attorney, that it was not within that.

Mr. Morris stated the petitions I believe lays out for you everything that the statute requires. We do not believe that it will do any harm. The alleys are 16 foot alleys, to the best of my knowledge they have never been paved, they have never been rocked, they have never been used as alleys. They were drawn in to the initial plat map of the Fairview Addition to the Town of Sellersburg, as and I've discussed this with your town attorney as well and as is normally the case, half of the alley would go to the adjoining property owners. If we own on both sides we get it all. We don't think any of the neighborhoods would be harmed. It will not hender the use of any public way. The adjoining owners of the properties are Willie and Marjorie Powell, the Indiana State Police and Ivy Tech, based upon that we've requested vacation of these alleys and I'll attempt to answer any questions that you might have. I have prepared a draft ordinance in the package there.

Allen Morris, Attorney Addresses Council/Vacation of Alleyways Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated I have a question you can probably answer. The alley that your talking about, are you talking about the one next to where it is the children are taken care of, the day care center.

Mr. Morris stated there is an "L" around the day care.

Council Member Everitt stated that's where the alley came off the street and went up towards the police post.

Mr. Morris stated yes.

Council Member Everitt stated this is the alley you're talking about. The last council we give you that alley on the last one, but where Adam's use to live, the day care is, that's already been done right. This is the other one going down towards Popp. I thought it was covering the state police post too. What your wanting, this will eliminate all the alleys up through there wouldn't it.

Mr. Morris stated yes, the town engineer revised my initial draft and he put in there all of the language he thought was appropriate to do that. I went to him to get everything we needed.

President Tucker stated I'm going to make an assumption, there's a piece of property that I want to say is two doors east of the day care that an individual still resides, and it's my contention that he is not in the Town of Sellersburg and John thought he was in the town, has that ever been resolved.

Mr. Morris stated it is our belief that it is in the Town of Sellersburg. I've talked to Rollin Blankenbaker who researched this to some extent sometime ago and I've talked to the engineer and they are both of the conclusion that it is in the town.

Motion to consider vacating alleyways on the first reading by Council Member Truman and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 4-0

Ordinance 94-595/Vacating Public Alleyways in Fairview Addition, Silver Creek Twsp.

Attorney Allen Morris presented to the council for approval Ordinance 94-595 in reference to vacating public alleyways in Fairview Addition, Silver Creek Township, near Ivy Tech.

Motion was made by Council Member Truman to approve Ordinance 94-595-vacating public alleyways in Fairview Addition, Silver Creek Township and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties

Mr. Erler stated I'm Don Erler. I'm the auctioneer that the town has employed to sell the excess parcels of property. I'm working with Jim Baker and Karen Elliott. We were asked to return this evening to make a recommendation, give a report, as to the activity on the property and also our recommendation as to the future sale date. We are speaking of two properties of which the town has designated as excess properties, the one property at the corner of Highway 311 and Prather Lane, that's about 6/10 of an acre parcel of vacant land and the other is the Old Firehouse property which is on Utica Street and the corner of Helbig. We had previously planned to do a live auction on the properties at 11:00 a.m. and 12 noon on June 24th, that proposal had been made and accepted and all of the advertising had been done however as we approached the auction we determined that the legal notice incorrectly carried the date of July 24th, upon advice of council, both the city and Chuck Murphy, we determined there was some question on whether or not a good title could be given on the properties. It was determined that the auction should be held sometime after the date that was given in the original legal notice which was July 24th and so we had deferred the matter until this evening. What I wanted to do at this point was to bring a couple of matters to the town council's attention so the council could make a decision.

Mr. Erler stated we have been approached since the auction was advertised by several interested parties that I would characterize as national buyers, people that would put highway related establishments on parcels throughout the country. These people would pay top dollar for real estate. Several issues have come up relaring to the possibility of entertaining offers from those parties. Those parties have indicated that in order for them to purchase they require and are normally entitled to what they call a due diligence period at which time they can ensure that they have good title to the property. They put their plans before the proper authorities and get those plans approved so basically there commercial establishment is fully approved prior to the final commitment to purchase and close. This particular perod of time involves sometimes up to six months from the time that an acceptable offer is actually received by the city and accepted it becomes a contingent offer in that time which means you could go six months and that party walk away from the deal and we'd go back to square one.

Mr. Erler stated we have been approached by two different entities, both of which have asked to remain anonymous but represent national interest. There is another problem involved with that particular tract, these types of buyers generally require a bigger tract of land than what we have to offer them, we have 6/10 of an acre, most of these buyers require an acre or so to put there types of establishments on. That would mean in order form them to satisfy their needs they would also need to acquire the private piece of property which is privately owned. Apparently she has been approached before and she has basically said it is not for sale. The other question which would obviously come forth is if we entertain a sealed bid that would allow a national buyer a due diligent time we also would have the contingency on whether or not they could acquire this piece of property.

Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Council Member Truman stated I really don't want to get into contingent offers if they start putting so many different stipulations which possibly could never be met then six months down the road were back to square one.

Mr. Erler stated we have found Karl, to address your concern that generally when I think of a national buyer I think of Super America, McDonalds, either restaurants or service stations, generally they have fairly expanded requirements. If they have a deal they pay top dollar but they have all of the uncertainties.

Council Member Truman stated that's fine, I realize a large corporation has it's bureaucracy they have to go through, contingencies are normally negotiated, for them to just come in and say yes we are the highest bidder but we are listing a dozen different things, hoops that we need to jump through first. I mean if it was a situation where we could negotiate that's fine but for them to hold up the process by getting the high bid but with a list of arbitrary contingencies that's my concern.

Council Member stated he felt the same as Karl.

Council Member Eddings stated he felt the same way.

Council Member Broady stated he felt the same.

President Tucker stated I agree.

Mr. Erler presented a written recommendation and stated let me review it quickly. We would recommend that the auction be held on Friday, August 5th and this allows us the proper amount of time to give notice. The auctions would be conducted as prevoiusly scheduled on site, on the properties, at the 311 Prather Lane property at 11:00 a.m., the Fire House and Rod Pate property, not together but at the same time at 12 noon on that Friday.

Mr. Erler stated we did incur the original proposal we made, we spent \$2,600.00 or more. We also had a contribution from Rod Pate. We estimate that additional advertising expences of \$1,000.00 will be necessary to properly alert the public as to the change that the auction will be held. We are willing to underwrite and absorb that cost as part of our commission. What we had previously done is we were going to charge a 10% buyers premium, that we would absorb all of the cost as long as the property sold. We will continue to do that, we are willing even to absorb the additional \$1,000.00. It was nobody's fault, it was just an error that was made. We feel there is good activity on the property. We will take that risk with you. The one thing that we do ask, because of the extended period of time, we started this process in late May, we've spent \$2,600.00, which is basically out on the street and we're going to spend another \$1,000.00. We would ask the town board to advance the advertising money. That's what we are asking and if the council finds that satisfactory we would like to proceed.

Don Erler Addresses Council/Town Properties Cont.

Mr. Erler stated you would get the money back as long as the property sells. The agreement was you would reimburse us for the advertising if the property did not sell.

Motion to pay the advertising fee out of the Building Fund and to collect that money at the closing and to go with the August 5th date for the auctions and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated the only thing that I may be thinking of is, there is no appropriation. When I received that \$75,000.00 grant, I had set things to reimburse the town. I'll check with the State Board of Accounts. We may have to take it out of consulting services or another area of the budget that's acceptable.

Vote 4-0

President Tucker Addresses Council/Stop Sign on Ohio Ave.

President Tucker stated we were going to discuss at this meeting a stop sign at McDonalds and Ohio Ave.

Victor Prather, resident, stated I live at 535 Ohio Ave. and people coming out of McDonalds do not stop. I think it's kind of confusing.

President Tucker stated right now I think there is a stop sign on Enterprise Way and a yield sign on Ohio Ave. The suggestion was that there be a stop sign at both places. We are trying to come up with the best possible solution. If we put a stop sign up at least they would have to stop.

Mr. Prather stated there is a problem with brush on Ohio. We need that cut back also.

Council Member Everitt stated that was the property of the State Highway Department and he would check with the state and see.

Council Member Everitt stated the State Highway Department recommended that when we put that yield sign up it should be a stop sign. The past town board elected to put up a yield sign and if no one here is against it that's fine.

Council Member Truman stated that's a bad intersection and I think that's it's kind of like putting a band aid on a bad wound. I think it's the only option we have at this point short of rerouting the whole intersection which obviously we can't afford to do, hopefully some day the town can afford to do it. I've talked with other people in the neighborhood about putting a stop sign up, a few people have voiced oposition to it and I urged them to come to the meeting tonight. I drive that road everyday. I don't see any other option other that rerouting the whole thing which we can't do.

President Tucker Addresses Council/Stop Sign on Ohio Ave. Cont.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to recommend a stop sign on the corner of Ohio Ave at the intersection of Enterprise Way and have attorney McCall prepare the ordinance for approval at the next meeting, seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

President Tucker Addresses Council/1995 Salary Ordinance

President Tucker stated the next item of business is the 1995 Salary Ordinance. I would entertain a motion to basically, this is a 5% increase to the town employees, they received a 3.5% increase last year, the year before it was 4%. We've held it down the past couple of years. Thanks to Linda and the guys in various departments financially we are a little better off than we were two years ago. My recommendation is to give them a 5% this time. This would be reflected in police pension pay also. I would entertain a motion to approve the 1995 salary ordinance.

Council Member Truman stated personally, I would like until the next meeting to study it because I just got it this evening and I'd like to compare it to this years.

President Tucker stated it is imperative that we pass this at the next meeting on July 25th. The deadline is August 1st. If there are any suggestions or questions, please get back with me or Linda so we can discuss it between now and then.

Council Member Truman asked if the clerks office would put a copy of this years ordinance in his box.

Motion to table the 1995 Salary Ordinance until the next meeting made by Council Member Truman and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Vote 4-0

Police Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Sale of Police Cars

Chief Kinder stated we have two police cars, both have bad transmissions. Steve Killen from Jim O'Neal Ford has looked at them. We've had an offer of \$600.00 per car. We need to get this approved.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated we need to get two appraisals on them.

Motion to sell the two police cars after we have obtained the two appraisals by Council Member Truman and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/New Police Officer

Chief Kinder stated we have a new police officer to replace Richard Hall, as of July 5th, 1994 we have Randall Carmichael.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Trees And Shrubs In Alleyways And Intersection

Chief Kinder stated we have had alot of complaints on trees and shrubs in alleyways and intersections. We've sent out letters and they've had until July 10th. A few have not complied. We have asked to do it or have the town do it for you and possible put a property lien on the property with Attorney McCall's help.

Council Member Eddings Addresses Council/Purchase Of 1988 Dodge For Water Department

Council Member Eddings stated we have had the opportunity to purchase a 1988 Dodge Ram 4-wheel drive vehicle. The net difference was \$5,900.00. This will allow us to get to the water field during bad weather conditions to check the wells. You have to have a 4-wheel drive to do this. I would like to ratify the purchase of this vehicle for \$5,900.00.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to approve the purchase of the 1988 Dodge Ram for the water department for the amount of \$5,900.00 and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Vote 4-0

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated we also need to mention that the Chevy Luv vehicle was traded in.

Council Member Eddings stated the cost was \$6,350.00 less the \$450.00 trade for a total cost of \$5,900.00.

Building Commissioner, Stephen D. Prather Presents Claims

Building Commissioner, Stephen D. Prather presented his claim for the period of June 28th through July 11th, 1994 in the amount of \$405.09.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to approve the claim as presented and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Council Member Broady Addresses Council/Claims From Jacobi, Toombs And Lanz, Inc.

Council Member Broady stated I've got three claims from Jacobi, Toombs and Lanz, Inc. in the amount of \$2,945.25 for work they have done for the sewer department, part of this is for the Clark Nickels job and part for the job at speed.

Motion to approve these three claims for Jacobi, Toombs and Lanz, Inc. in the amount of \$2,945.25 made by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Eddings.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Budget Meeting

Council Member Truman stated he was wondering if we were going to schedule a budget work session or anything like that.

President Tucker stated we can, basically we will do whatever you want to do.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated the 19th of July the Tax Commissioner is going to have a budget workshop type meeting if you're interested. I didn't attend that last year.

President Tucker asked how far along are you on the budget.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I've received most of the things back. I have to calculate the taxes and put in hydrant rentals and a couple of other things.

Council Member Broady asked when it was due.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated in August.

President Tucker asked if Council Member Truman had a time that he'd like to do that.

Council Member Truman stated no.

President Tucker asked if he wanted to wait until after the July 25th meeting to see where we are with the salary ordinance and see where Linda is on the budget.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated the problem is until the salary ordinance is adopted I can calculate the budget but it really doesn't do a whole lot in the areas of salaries when I don't have any figures to work with. I don't have a problem with it if you guys don't.

President Tucker stated as we left it we will hope to pass the salary ordinance on the 25th as is and at that meeting, hopefully we will schedule some sort of budget meeting and go from there.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I would like to have some extra help at that time.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Reception July 19th American Legion

Council Member Everitt stated the American Legion has asked me to inform the Council that they are having a reception for Ms. Cox on July 19th at 6:00 p.m. They requested the members and their wives to be present if they possibly could. This is for the young lady who became governor for the day.

President Tucker asked if anyone who would like to attend at 6:00 p.m. on the 19th, please get with Roy and let him know.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Gillenwater Estates

Council Member Everitt stated on Terry and Wilson Lane in Gillenwater Estates, we discusses a 8 ton limit. I would request that these two streets have an 8 ton limit, not the whole Town of Sellersburg, just these two streets.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Recycling Bins And Grass Clippings

Council Member Everitt stated I received a letter from a Ms. Tobin talking about the recycling bins, about putting wheels or a rope or something for the older people. I'm calling Jerry about this. I also got a letter from Dan Cristiani talking about the recycling and they want \$18.00 a ton if we take limbs or anything there. She's talking about the town maybe buying a piece of equipment to cup up these limbs and things. I wondered if we couldn't look into buying a piece of equipment or getting some prices to see which would be the cheapest. I mean if we grind up enough limbs and leaves and stuff we can sell it back to people or give it to them.

President Tucker stated is it not true that at the end of last month or something that no more grass would be taken at the landfill.

Council Member Everitt stated right, I'm talking about limbs and this sort of stuff.

President Tucker stated in September they will not take limbs right. What alternatives do we have, basically if we don't have any place to dump it then we can't pick it up.

Council Member Everitt stated that's right.

President Tucker stated which means people will have to take care of that themselves.

Council Member Everitt stated it's going to be up to the board how we want to do it and it needs to be looked into.

President Tucker asked Council Member Everitt if he could get ahold of Mark and look into what kind of equipment, that's not going to solve the grass problem.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Recycling Bins And Grass Clippings Cont.

Council Member Everitt stated well the grass problem would be solved if the council just said we're not going to pick up any grass. The leaves, we've been picking up leaves until we, until the peoples been taking leaves says no more then I would say the town could pick them up but once these people will not accept them.

President Tucker stated what about the limbs.

Council Member Everitt stated that's the big thing, who's responsibility is it, the town or ours, I mean the people.

President Tucker stated what do you think.

Council Member Everitt stated in case of a disaster I would say the town, otherwise I would feel it's the people.

Council Member Everitt stated we have an ordinance that says we will pick up the limbs now after a certain date we are not going to be able to take limbs.

Clerk Treasurer Presents Claims

Clerk Treasurer, Linda Schafer presented her claims for this meeting in the Civil, Sewer and Water Departments for the last two week period.

Motion to approve claims made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

Attorney Perry McCall Addresses Council/Pixley vs. Town of Sellersburg

Attorney McCall stated that Patricia Law has made a couple of recommendations as to the land out there, one would be planting grass, it would have to be 95% coverage. The other alternative would be to create a wet land marsh area.

Council Member Broady asked how large on an area are we talking about.

Attorney McCall stated she hasn't given me any drawings.

President Tucker asked that this be tabled until John Toombs receives a drawing to see what we have.

Attorney McCall Addresses Council/Speed Bumps

Attorney McCall stated that back to the Fern Street issue. Speed bumps are legal but they are a personal liability.

Steve Prather stated that Mark Ball has expresses concerns over speed bumps and fire trucks.

President Tucker stated he was not trying to procrastinate but little league is over and I think the problems on Fern Street has calmed down. The council will check with Mark Ball over his concerns.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/8 Ton Weight Limit in Sellersburg

Chief Kinder stated Roy had wanted a 8 ton limit on two roads, I suggest that for all of the streets.

Council Member Everitt stated it's in the ordinance if they are delivering they can do that. If you put a 8 ton limit on the street, trucks will start hauling rock from the quarry, as long as we keep the 6 ton limit on Utica the trucks won't haul on these streets.

Chief Kinder stated that 8 ton isn't going to make a difference to the rock haulers because a triaxle, it wouldn't be a load for him. This ordinance that was being proposed is for one person and it would be favortism, we need to make it for everybody.

Adjournment

Motion made by Council Member Broady to adjourn this meeting and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Regular Meeting

A regular meeting of the Sellersburg Town Council was held at 6:30 p.m. at the Sellersburg Library. Those present were: Stanley E. Tucker, Council President; Dave Broady, Council Vice-President; Roy Everitt, Council Member, Karl Truman, Council Member; Linda G. Schafer, Clerk Treasurer; with Doug Eddings, Jr., Council Member and Perry McCall, Attorney being absent.

Called To Order

President Tucker called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

Prayer

The prayer was offered by Reverend Bob Hauselman.

Pledge

The pledge of allegiance to the flag was recited.

Minutes of the Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting and requested a motion to approve them.

Motion to approve the minutes by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 4-0

Karen Elliott Addresses Council/Town Properties

Ms. Elliott stated I'm pleased to report that we are on schedule for the auction date of August 5th. The rescheduled ads are running in the Evening News, Courier Journal, Business First, New Albany Tribune, Leader, Banner and Giveaway. Signs are up with the new date already and we've mailed out brochures of the change to interested parties and updates are going to be sent on a more general mailing this week. The legal notices have been property published also, July 16th and July 23rd in the Evening News and I have copies.

Arthur McDerment Addresses Council/Trash Pick Up

Mr. McDerment stated I would like to know why they didn't pick up my garbage because remember you told us we had to get new cans. I went out and paid forty something dollars for new cans. They said they weren't going to pick up clippings. I went out and paid \$200.00 for a lawn mower that I didn't need. I put out one can with a lid on it. There was about six or eight ounces of grass in a little bag. They picked up everybody around me, this was just a little bag with a few clippings. I'd like to know why mine sen't picked up.

President Tucker stated I don't know the answer.

 ${\tt Mr.}$ McDerment stated I called the landfill and they said they were taking everything until September 30.

Arthur McDerment Addresses Council/Trash Pick Up Cont.

President Tucker stated that was not the information we had received.

Mr. McDerment stated he was told Mark Warren wanted to start early so we would get use to it.

President Tucker stated we have received some misinformation, originally it was going to be June 1st. They would no longer take grass clippings at the landfill and if it was mixed with the garbage they would turn the whole packer away. Someone though redtape in government didn't get it taken care of so they recinded and they will take grass clippings until September 30th. I will instruct Mark to continue to pick it up until then. As I understand it after September 30th the landfill will reject any packer that has grass clippings in it. At this point in time, we do not have a solution as to how to deal with grass clippings and/or limbs. To my knowledge they have not created a compost site. I've asked Roy to look into that and try to come back with some recommendations as to what we are going to be able to do when September comes. At this point in time I do not have an answer.

Mr. McDerment stated well I've got mine right out there in the car. It's set since Friday a week ago now where do you want me to dump it.

President Tucker stated put it on top of your garbage can.

Mr. McDerment stated I'm talking the whole garbage can, they didn't just throw that little bag out they left the whole can. One can of garbage, they took everybody elses around me that had grass clippings in it. Why didn't they go in and inspect them. Nobody has any business cutting my bags open.

President Tucker stated I don't ride around with the garbage truck so I don't know the answer.

Mr. McDerment stated and another thing, Monday I asked them to clean up that curb. There's grass growing all over it and I use to clean that up myself and put it in the daggone can but since you ain't taking the yard stuff I ain't gonna bother with it.

President Tucker stated all I can do is talk to Mark and have them do something about it in the future. I can't go back and fix the past. As far as the garbage can, you said you had four, set it out when you set your next ones out and they will pick it up.

Mr. McDerment stated what if I'm not here, I've got it out there right now.

President Tucker stated I don't have an answer for that, it won't fit in my car.

Mr. McDerment stated oh yes it will, where is your car.

President Tucker stated right straight across.

Karl Truman Addresses Council/Interlocal Agreement Between The Town Of Sellersburg And Silver Creek Township

Council Member Truman stated I've prepared the interlocal agreement between the Town of Sellersburg and Silver Creek Township which reads as follows:

Whereas, each of the political subdivisions signatory hereto are desirous of entering into an agreement by which the Town of Sellersburg will allow Silver Creek Township to utilize heavy equipment belonging to the Town of Sellersburg's;

Whereas, Silver Creek Township will utilize said heavy equipment to construct a new park;

Whereas, each citizen of the Town of Sellersburg will be entitled to use and enjoy this park;

Whereas, the Town of Sellersburg has equipment which Silver Creek Township does not possess;

Whereas, Indiana Code 36-1-7-1 et seq, provides statutory authority for Indiana political subdivisions to jointly exercise any power that could be exercised by any such subdivision individually.

Now, therefore, by this indentured, it is agreed bdtween the Town of Sellersburg and Silver Creek Township, both of which are Indiana political subdivisions, entitled to jointly exercise such powers pursuant to the provisions of Indiana Code 36-1-7-3, as follows:

- 1. In consideration of the construction of the Silver Creek Township Park, which shall be available for the use and enjoyment of the citizens of the Town of Sellersburg, the Silver Creek Township Trustee shall be permitted to use the dumptruck and backhoe, which is the property of the Town of Sellersburg and/or town utilities.
- 2. This agreement will be for a period of time of one (1) year which shall automatically renew until terminated by either party. Either party may terminate this agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice.
- 3. Silver Creek Township agrees to be finacially responsible for any and all damage which may result from negligent operation of the heavy equipment by Silver Creek Township, its employees, agents and/or independent contractors.

By ordinance of its Town Council, passed and adopted the 25th day of July, 1994.

President Tucker stated this is the interlocal agreement between the Town of Sellersburg and the Silver Creek Township Park. Occasionally, not during working hours, they will borrow some of the towns equipment to help with the park.

Motion to approve the interlocal agreement by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Vote 4-0

President Tucker Addresses Council/Sprinkler Systems-Sewer Adjustments/Covered Bridge

President Tucker stated as I understand Covered Bridge is on our sewer system and they have Silver Greek water, these houses have sprinkler systems.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated what the problem is the residents out in that area, being that they are not actually in the Town of Sellersburg, and Silver Creek water does supply the water but they are on our sewer system. Everyone of the homes, which there is probably about 35 in this phase, have sprinkling systems. They are required to have those sprinkling systems. They would like to have a sewer adjustment, the same adjustment that the Town of Sellersburg residents have on their sewers. That is pretty much why they are on the agenda.

John Toombs stated the problem is complicated. First of all your ordinance does not allow such a thing for residence outside of Sellersburg unless you amend your ordinance. The Attorney would have the power to legally grant that wish.

Mr. Toombs stated the other problem is they get their water off of the main, as it is now Silver Creek does not read the second meter so one proposition is they pay extra to have the town read that meter.

President Tucker asked Clerk Treasurer Schafer what she thinks should be done.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated well we do charge a \$25.00 application fee and a \$25.00 per year fee for reading those meters to those residence within the Town of Sellersburg which there is probably three or four of those residence. There's really not an easy answer. It really wouldn't be fair for the town, even thought I respect those people out there, to send one of our people out at the town's expense to afford them a sewer adjustment. There's really not an easy answer.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated there has been several suggestions such as let them read their own meters and periodically send out one of our workers, maybe once a year to read the meter. I have the ordinance and had asked Perry for clarification, if you would like to read it.

Council Member Everitt stated the golf course gets their water to sprinkle the golf course out of the pond. I was just letting the people know that's were they get their water.

President Tucker Addresses Council/Ordinance 94-596 Amending Ordinance 509/Sprinkler Systems

President Tucker stated I have ordinance 94-596 which amends ordinance 509 which states each owner upon application of a sprinkler system shall pay an application fee of \$25.00 and each year thereafter a service fee of \$25.00 will be assessed.

Motion to approve ordinance 94-596 on the first reading by Council Member Everitt and seconded by Council Member Truman.

President Tucker Addresses Council/Ordinance 94-596 Amending Ord. 509/Sprinkler Systems

Motion to approve Ordinance 94-596 amending 509 made by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Truman.

President Tucker Addresses Council/1995 Salary Ordinance

President Tucker Addresses Council/1995 Salary Ordinance Cont.

Council Member Truman asked do we have a meeting date.

President Tucker stated the 15th, we have a special meeting and that date is August 15th. We tried to get it sooner than that but couldn't.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated it's a public meeting on the budget, it will be announced in the newspapers.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/New Generator At Police Department

Chief Kinder stated that PSI gave us twenty minutes notice they were going to shut off the power, fifteen minutes later we had a fire in the building. Insurance will not pay for the generator. They are thinking that the generator caused the fire. We need to buy a generator. It was improperly installed and the ground wire was connected to PSI's wire and when the power was shut off there was no ground and it shot 225 volts up the wall. Insurance will pay for everything except the generator.

President Tucker stated you feel you need the generator back in service as soon as possible.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Sale Of Two Police Cars

Chief Kinder stated that the department sold the two police cars today for \$1,200.00.

Building Commissioner, Stephen D. Prather Presents Claims

Building Commissioner, Stephen D. Prather presented his claim for the period of July 12th through July 25, 1994 in the amount of \$351.86.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to approve the claim as presented and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 4-0

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Sellersburg Pool-Park Hours

Council Member Truman stated that the committee appointed by the Parks Board wanted me to bring a couple of things to the Town Board for action. One recommendation was for the Town Council to establish hours for the park, not for the gate but for the park's hours to be from sunrise to sunset. They would like that in the form of an ordinance and if they are there before or after that time they could be asked to leave by the police. I would make a motion that we ask the Town Attorney to prepare an ordinance to that effect and present at the next meeting.

Motion by Council Member Truman to ask the Town Attorney to prepare an ordinance to present at the next meeting establishing park hours from sunrise to sunset and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

Council Member Everitt stated what about when they have tournaments and such.

Council Member Truman stated this would exclude park events.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Additional Signs At Bottorff And Hauss Streets

Council Member Truman stated another issue that was brought up was a recommendation was made to put a no parking sign at the end of Bottorff Street where the foot bridge is and there was another sign, maybe you all can help me out. I misplaced my notes from the meeting, I thought there was another sign that they were asking for.

Chief Kinder stated a stop sign.

Council Member Truman stated yes a stop sign at Oak and Hauss.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to place a no parking sign at Bottorff, by the foot bridge and a stop sign at Oak and Hauss and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Council Member Truman Addresses /Council/Additional Signs At Bottorff And Hauss Streets

Council Member Truman stated the only other things discussed which I am not presenting for any type of action was about having a trial run for the gate on Catalpa to be open during the pool hours and that would continue through Thanksgiving. That is being handled by the Parks Board.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Town's Insurance

Council Member Truman stated in reference to the town's insurance, the liability, property & casualty. Earl Bonniville has contacted me, as the town board knows he had previously had the insurance and the town went with another company last year. He's wanting to place another bid which I believe comes up for renewal sometime in August. He has indicated that he thinks he can give us a quote \$10,000.00 to \$15,000.00 less than we are currently paying and he'd like until the next board meeting to get that together.

Motion made by Council Member Truman that the town not make a long term commitment until the next town board meeting and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Council Member Everitt stated doesn't that have to be open to everyone.

President Tucker stated if I remember correctly, I seem to remember that last year when we went through this same exercise, I seem to remember that you made the motion that we would not renegotiate the insurance on an annual basis.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated that's correct.

Council Member Truman stated I'd like to see the minutes because I don't think that's correct.

Vote 3-1, with President Tucker voting against.

Council Member Truman stated that President Tucker wasn't suppose to vote.

President Tucker stated that he had checked with Attorney McCall and he stated I can.

Council Member Truman stated I disagree.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Uniform Allowance-Police Dispatchers

Council Member Truman stated the question was brought up about a uniform allowance for the police dispatchers. I make a motion that we instruct the town attorney to prepare an ordinance for the uniform allowance for the dispatchers. What is the current uniform allowance.

Council Member Truman Addresses Council/Uniform Allowance-Police Dispatchers Cont.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated \$600.00 per police officer, there is no established amount for dispatchers.

Chief Kinder stated they have two uniforms and we just buy them. Dispatchers do not have an allowance.

Council Member Truman stated as far as an amount, the chief would have to get with the attorney and establish an amount.

Motion made by Council Member Truman to have Chief Kinder get with the attorney to prepare the ordinance and establish an amount. I understand that the Clerk Treasurer stated that the State Board of Accounts stated that we have to have a clothing allowance. If we don't have to have it that's fine.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated because uniforms were purchased the State Board of Accounts stated they would give a year, until the next audit, to have an ordinance for that.

President Tucker stated that I would only comment that other town employees who do not have uniforms, such as the Clerks office, something simular to that.

Chief Kinder stated I have no objection to that.

President Tucker asked Council Member Truman if he would be willing to add that to your request.

Council Member Truman stated no, I mean an office worker, that's different from an organization such as the police department. I just don't think it's the same thing.

Motion seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 3-1, with President Tucker voting against.

Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Agreement For Road-Related Services

Don Erler Addresses Council/Sale Of Town Properties

Mr. Erler stated we are glad to come back and tell you that the auction of the surplus properties has been completed. The auctions was very successful. The property on 311 and new Prather Lane achieved a sale price of \$181,500.00. The bid price of \$165,000.00 was the net to the city and you will recover your advertising in addition to that. The appraisal on that property was \$100,000.00. The fire house was appraised at \$30,000.00. It brought a bid of \$25,000.00 plus 10% for \$27,500.00 which meets the letter of the statute. It exceeded the 90% which would of been \$27,000.00. The city will net \$25,000.00 from that sale plus recover their advertising as well so for the city out of the two sales, if approved \$190,000.00 recovery of the \$3,600.00 that was advanced, total proceeds coming back would be \$193,600.00. We ask that the council approve the contracts as they have been submitted pursuant to the statute. We were given a 15% down payment on the fire house property which was payable to Remax Commerical Brokers and will be placed in escrow, which was pursuant to our contractual agreement.

Mr. Erler stated the buyer on the Prather Lane/311 property gave us \$30,000.00 which was a little more than what was required but that's the funds that they had. Those funds were made payable to the Town of Sellersburg and I'm asking the town council to endorse those checks. The \$10,000.00 from Swifty 0il and the \$20,000.00 from Virgil Bolly's escrow acct., endorse those two checks over to Remax to be placed in escrow pending closing.

Mr. Erler stated we appreciated the opportunity to work for the town.

Council Member Truman asked if there were alot of bidders.

Mr. Erler stated there were two primary bidders on the 311 property, the fire house, a single bid of \$25,000.00. Swifty Oil bought the 311 property and F & S Medical bought the fire house and Rod Pate's property.

Bill Keeney Addresses Council/Park Gate at Catalpa Drive

Mr. Keeney stated I'm sure it comes as no surprise I'm here to talk about the gate at the end of Catalpa Drive. The last time we were here, we being the opposition to the way the park was being run at that time. We were directed to a special parks board meeting on July 12th. Several of us from the neighborhood attended that meeting and for your efforts and for the record here are the minutes from that meeting.

Mr. Keeney stated as you can tell from reading those there were several people there and several people made substantial comments. From that meeting there was a committee formed that was suppose to be representatives of all parties. I was not present. The meeting was held one time with one meeting of this committee. I'm told and what I've read in the paper that those of us who are opposed to the opening of the gate did not get a fair shake. I mean minds seem to be made from reading these minutes that the gates were going to be opened in some type of fashion. That's not what we agreed to do. That's not what those of us who are opposed to opening the gate anticipated would happen and in fact that's what happened. My sole purpose here tonight, since this board is the determining factor in what's been happening, or will be the determining factor, I'd like to expedite this. I'd like to move it along and I'd like to ask the town board to involve themselves in this and see if we can't reach a resolution that's satisfactory to all parties so we can all move on to other things.

President Tucker asked what would be your suggestion.

Mr. Keeney stated I think Mr. Broady has had some conversation with Mr. Arrington, who is part of the opposition of the reopening of that and I think Mr. Broady has a very good plan. I don't know if he's prepared to discuss it at this point. I think it deserves consideration. What is proposed by the parks department is not acceptable.

Mr. Keeney stated frankley Stan, we didn't get a fair shake at that meeting, all it's done is cause more irritation up and down the street.

President Tucker stated Karl represented the town board at that meeting and asked Mr. Truman if he had any comment.

Council Member Truman stated there was alot of discussion and I thought all of the committee members tried to do a good job and tried to deal with the situation from an objective view point. I don't think that the committee was stacked against one way or the other. I think there was alot of opened discussion so I don't think anybody went in there with a predetermined outcome as far as that committee meeting.

Mr. Keeney stated the results were the same whether they were predetermined or not, again I think Mr. Broady has a plan that will satisfy the concerns.

Mr. Truman stated maybe we should hear what that plan is.

Council Member Broady state the recommendation that I was going to make to you Karl to take back to the park board and committee after looking at it and thinking about it, a compromise for everybody.

Mr. Broady stated going down to the end on Catalpa and take part of the parking lot that's existing there and circle with pipes or whatever you want to do, that would make pedistrian traffic. This would hopefully satisfy the people from Hill N Dale. You could pull in there and drop them off. It would be a pick up point for those kids and on the other end of the pool area, I call the old parking lot, we have now a gate and an entrance to the new parking lot but the crossing at the creek is quite inefficient to handle any traffic and it's given us problems and problems and problems and needs to be replaced anyhow. It would be my recommendation what about replacing that bridge to something that's useable and we have an existing road there with very little funds at all we could make a roadway from the old parking lot to the new parking lot that way you would still utilize the parking lot. It's just a recommendation.

Council Member Truman stated you don't think that adding a turn around there is still going to cause traffic flow problems.

Mr. Broady stated no because what was happening there was kids were going in there and parking if I'm not mistaken and with a turn around you would obviously post no parking in that turn around and you'd pull in there and drop them off and pull right on out. The gate on the other end would give you access to both parking lots, there would be no need to open the gate.

Mr. Keeney stated the only problem I see with that is there were people in the park at 2:00 and 3:00 in the morning.

Chief Dave Kinder stated after Thanksgiving it would be closed.

President Tucker stated there is a parks board meeting Tuesday night one week from tomorrow. We also have two town board meetings, one on the 15th and one on the 22nd, in both cases we are going to be discussing the budget for 1995. As a sugguestion, you can have a representative come to the parks board meeting next Tuesday night at 6:30 p.m., the meeting is at the pool and then discuss it and make the final decision at the August 22nd meeting.

President Tucker stated I would rather work harmoniously with them. We've tried the last two and a half years not to resort to that type of situation and it seems reasonable to me. I have not talked to Dwight since that meeting, I was not part of that committee, Karl volunteered to do it. There hasn't been a parks board meeting since the committee met. I was just thinking it would be reasonable to discuss it at the next parks board meeting and bring it back to the meeting on the 22nd.

Mr. Truman stated I'd like to see the issue after the parks board has a chance to discuss it, that the issue be brought back to this board to review but I don't want to go around their authority when their involved. If I don't agree with what their decision is, I don't have a problem voting different from them.

President Tucker stated the meeting will be a the pool on the 16th, I will call Dwight and let him know that there will be people in attendance, it's a public meeting anyway but I'll let him know what's happening and Dave will you please come since you have a recommendation. There is two people on the parks board that live in your subdivision in Dreyer Estates and I'm sure they have feelings just like everyone else and let's try to get some resolution.

Mr. Arrington stated the only thing he would like to add to that is the possibility of moving one of the volleyball courts.

We, the town, owe alot of credit to Linda and there's other people who have participated as well. Our financial condition is better in the Town of Sellersburg than it has been for a number of years. Debts have been paid off, our tax rates have not increased. I think she's done an excellent job as I understand correctly her salary would be slightly greater if it was increased to some of the surrounding communities like Madison, Charlestown and Salem. If I'm quoting this correctly, but I think she's done a perfect job that deserves an increase and she has to run for office next November and she could be elected or not elected. I think you pay people for how their performance is while they work. If she doesn't get elected, the money is not there. Karl's comment, and I'll let him speak for himself, his comment last time was that we on the town board for example have not had an increase for the last 21 years and she's an elected official and it's his feeling that she shouldn't either. I feel strongly that she deserves this increase.

Council Member Truman stated I have no comment.

Council Member Everitt stated I guess I do then. Well the reason why I'm looking at this, Linda has since hired another girl and I take it as town hall clerk.

Ms. Schafer stated that's correct.

Council Member Everitt stated okay, she's making \$14,206.40 in the new budget and also your looking at and I know this council's always talking about a town manager. I thought we agreed a utilities manager at \$30,000.00. It was what, \$30,000.04 along with Linda's salary comes to \$26,000.00, it would be \$70,000.00. If we're going to hire a town manager, is it going to be a town manager of a utilities manager, I thought we discussed a utilities manager. If that was the case wouldn't this take alot of work off of Linda if we hire a utilities manager. \$70,000.00 out of the utilities fund, we're not that strong that we can continue. I know right now is right now, 6 years ago the Clerk Treasurer was making right at \$18,000.00, this is what her deputy clerk is making now. That's my arguement.

President Tucker stated six years ago we were all probably making less than we are right now.

Council Member Everitt stated well the board still makes the same.

President Tucker stated that's our choice.

Council Member Everitt stated well that's true but what I'm saying is an \$18,000.00 to \$26,000.00 in six years is a pretty good increase.

President Tucker stated I understand and my opinion is since the Clerk Treasurer has the accounting responsibilities, especially for the general fund and has done that for the sewer and water department that a town manager or a utilities manager, who in my opinion is not going to come in and do the accounting, is not going to run the books, he's going to go out and facilitate the management of the facility.

Council Member Everitt stated then I suggest that we take the \$30,000.00 for the town manager completely out of the budget.

Council Member Eddings stated we all agreed on a town manager several months ago.

Council Member Everitt stated it was a utilities manager.

Council Member Everitt stated you can call it whatever you want to call it.

Council Member Everitt stated there's a big difference.

President Tucker stated this is a public hearing for the 1995 Sellersburg Budget. We had a previous meeting on August 15th. I would like to present the budget as originally presented and I'll try to explain that a little bit.

President Tucker stated there were a few recommended cuts. I would like to explain those. The budget for 1995 for the Town of Sellersburg and this is basically the general fund. This is not the sewer and water department, strickly the general fund. For the town hall building fund, as you may have read, we did sell some properties. We have to basically go back for an appropriation for the building fund to put in the estimated budget for 1995 for the town hall building fund of \$156,240.00, that's money that has basically been raised.

President Tucker stated the parks and recreation department. The initial budget presented was \$87,341.00, again if any of you have worked through the budgetary process, it's kind of like best guess first. We ususally have to cut it in some shape or form. Basically what we do is go to the respective departments and say if this is your wish list, how much is it going to cost. Then we have to go back and start cutting it and present it to the auditor's who in turn usually whacks on it a little bit, so end results are usually different than what you will hear tonight.

President Tucker stated the budget presented was:

President Tucker stated that totals \$1,858,317.00 of which we estimate \$929,079.00 will be raised by some method, either by the selling of the properties or something of this nature. It gives a tax rate of 3.81%.

President Tucker stated we had a meeting the other night and talked about some cuts. The recommended cuts at the meeting totaled approximately \$30,000.00 and I will tell you in what areas they affected. There was no change in the town hall building fund, there was a cut of \$3,500.00 in the parks and recreation department. They had requested a water slide and from a liability stand point we turned that down. The street and sanitation department we cut to \$368,596.00, we cut \$7,000.00. The police department, the recommended cut of \$25,200.00, the total of \$619,063.00.

President Tucker stated so our recommendation was a reduction of roughly 30,300.00 to 1,828,017.00 which in essence would have an effect of 2/100's of 1% on the net tax rate which is 3.79%. That's the budget as presented.

Motion made by Council Member Eddings to adopt the 1995 budget for the Town of Sellersburg as presented and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Chief Kinder asked why \$25,200.00 was cut from the police department, as you know I've been gone for the last two weeks. I don't have any exact figures, I know office supplies were cut and the other cut was on maintenance police autos. I know we have some new police cars but just today it's going to cost us \$275.00 to fix the brakes on this car. The police officers are buying some of their items out of the uniform allowance because we are low in the police equipment fund. I'd like to see some of it restored if possible.

Council Member Everitt stated, so what you're saying is shift the money from one place to the other.

Chief Kinder stated that's correct. I'm sorry I haven't had a chance to talk to Linda about this.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated year to date on your police maintenance auto is \$542.49, by purchasing, paying cash for one police vehicle or purchasing a lease program two, that's going to help in that area. There is a fund, the police station fund that you would be able to purchase additional supplies out of and transfer later on that \$3,000.00 into your police training.

Chief Kinder stated the police station fund is for vest and so forth. The life of the vest is four years and the town could get stuck with a \$7,000.00 bill for replacing vests.

President Tucker stated assuming that we are correct, we've found approximately seven different accounts that are not budgeted if you will.

Council Member Truman stated would you not use we, you and Linda.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated you have \$2,310.00 in an accident fund that you will be able to use for supplies and transfer the money in to help if you need any additional.

Council Member Truman stated when we had our hearing last Monday, I was not in favor of these cuts. First of all, I didn't think that the Chief of Police was informed, also the police department is an easy target, obviously they are the most substantial portion of our budget but it is one of the most important too and it's an expensive operation.

Council Member Truman stated I feel like some of the cuts could be spread around a little bit and not in one area. For example under the town council budget, we have dues and subscriptions \$600.00, instruction and seminars \$200.00, misc. services, which I don't know what that covers for \$1,000.00, judgements and settlements of \$5,000.00 and looking at what we spent under those catagories so farthis year we've spent \$87.45 under misc. services. We haven't spent anything under those other catagories. That's through June, the first six months of the year. Under the Clerk Treasurer, dues and subscriptions \$350.00, instructions and seminars \$300.00, misc. services \$2,500.00, legal publications \$2,500.00, telephone and pagers \$6,000.00, consulting services \$6,000.00, education \$600.00 and I'm just wondering, office equipment \$1,100.00. I'm just wondering what all of that money is being used for or what is it going to be used for.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated excuse me, I would like to clarify that. You approve everything I write a check for so I don't want any misunderstanding about that area.

Council Member Truman stated I didn't approve the budget.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated as far as the budget, as I recall three meetings ago I requested any council input and Mr. Truman you've hid for the past six weeks.

Council Member Truman stated that is absolutely not true.

President Tucker stated Chief, if I understand what you said, if we add \$7,000.00 back to your budget that you would be happy with that.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I have an idea, I would recommend to the council that they approve the budget as is and we go to the budget hearing and etc. we can always transfer appropriations from cleaning.

Chief Kinder stated that was okay with him.

A resident asked about the tax rate.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated the tax rate will probably come in at 3.37 with the maximum levy .12 above the maximum levy which is your cumulative capital development fund so it will be pretty much what it was last year, maybe just slightly higher and that's due to \$90,000.00 which was a 25% match on a storm drain grant but we could either try to put up the 25% of that match to obtain \$350,000.00 back or take law suits and take all of it out of our pockets so we had no choice but to do it like that.

President Tucker stated last year we went in with a tax rate of 3.97%, what actually came out was 3.40%, in other words, we go in and they kind of toss the numbers around. We are not asking for any tax increase.

Council Member Everitt stated there are two things in the budget I would like to clarify and have on record that I was opposed to. One is the raise for the Clerk Treasurer and the second is \$30,000.00 for the Town Manager and I vote to pass the budget except for those two things.

Council Member Truman stated the reason that I voted no was not because of the police department but there are other areas that I feel are over allocated and which I feel alot of areas could be cut.

Council Member Everitt stated my only question is I was quite upset when I went down to pick up the insurance bids, they had to be in by a certain date and I picked up Hinton & Corby's and your's wasn't in the file and I don't know how it got in there but it was in the next day so I was wondering how you got into the town hall when the town hall was closed.

Mr. Bonniville stated I talked to Stan, Wednesday afternoon and I told him I could bring it down then and the office was closed, it was a little after 4:00 p.m. and he said I could bring it down now or in the morning. Is that not correct Stan.

President Tucker stated yes.

Council Member Truman stated yours was not at the town hall Wednesday night either because I was at the town hall Wednesday night.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I will clarify that, I have three deputy clerks here that will state we stamped these August 17th, Wednesday and I called President Tucker at five minutes before we closed and I had not received Mr. Bonniville's bid.

Council Member Truman stated it may of been on your desk, but it was not in the box.

President Tucker stated I did receive phone calls from both. Linda did call on the 17th, it was five minutes till 4:00, I did talk to Earl on the phone and I did state that he could wait until the following morning. He said that he could do that or maybe Karl could drop them off. I did say either option is okay.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated you dropped them off.

Council Member Truman stated yes, that's what he asked me to do.

President Tucker stated last year we in essence opened the insurance up for bid and both of these gentlemen put in bids at that time. Just sort of my comment, my concerns last year which is still in place was something called claims made insurance. I didn't understand exactly what that meant. Basically it has to do with when claims are paid and then if you stop insurance you still have to pay an additional premium for that coverage to take place so what Earl and I'm not trying to pick on Earl, but what Earl's company does is create what they call a claims made policy and if we decide to not use Earl's then we'd still have an additional premium that we would have to pay and again maybe I'm over simplifying this. If you would like to defend it than please do. On the other side, the Hinton & Corby policy is like your automobile or homeowners policy, from January 1 to January 1, when it ends it ends. That was my concern last year and it's my concern this year. Again the only other point I would like to make is because we went through this exercise last year, Mr. Truman suggested we not go through this on an annual basis because it became very time consuming and you suggested that a committee be formed. I guess insurance people and I don't have a copy of those minutes, perhaps Linda does. I guess my suggestion is if, we are going to do this and I agree with what Karl says, we have insurance that comes due at different points in time but the majority comes due in August if I'm not mistaken. If we are going to do this every year that's fine I just think we need to get a little more prepared and I think we need to get a group together, Mike, Earl and Virgil or Virgil's brother, and get a committee together.

President Tucker stated again we paid a little more money last year when we changed over to Mike, basically from what I understand the coverage is approximately the same, there are some differences as far as coverage under the uninsured motorist for example it is 500 under one and a million under the other. Again I will entertain a motion to, I'm mot sure exactly how to do this but I will entertain a motion to approve Hinton & Corby Insurance and pending that answer, I will do Montgomery Agency. I don't know how to do it any different unless you have a suggestion.

Council Member Truman stated I'll make a motion to approve or accept the proposal by the Montgomery Agency. I think that there is a \$9,192.00 difference in premium and I just don't see how the town can ignore spending \$9,000.00. That is a substantial amount of money. I mean we just went through the budget issue and cuts here and there \$9,000.00 would be a substantial amount of money we could use for other things. It would replace the police training.

Motion was seconded by Council Member Eddings.

President Tucker stated right now we are paying on a month to month basis if I'm correct.

Mr. Whalen stated you are not correct on that, some of the contracts have come in and some have not. The ones that have come in are paid.

President Tucker stated if it was decided to go to another agency would they be cancelled or prorated.

Mr. Whalen stated they would be cancelled in some shape or form.

Mr. Bonniville stated I thought at the last meeting it was agreed that the insurance would not be renewed.

President Tucker stated all we did was keep insurance. I didn't renew it. I've got it going so I have insurance. I couldn't stop and say we are not insured until we make up our minds that was my decision.

Council Member Eddings stated on workers comp. there is one half million dollars per each employee and on bodily injury and only one hundred thousand on the other, is that the state guidlines.

Mr. Whalen stated mine is by the state statute.

President Tucker stated the only comment that I would like to make is that and again as I stated earlier, was the claims made policy. In 1993 we the town paid a little over \$7,000.00 to get the claims made policy and if you add that to the \$61,000.00 and you add the \$7,000.00, then the difference is between \$70,000.00 and \$68,000.00, so the difference is not that far apart.

Council Member Truman stated but if we hadn't spent an extra \$15,000.00 to switch then we would of been \$15,000.00 to the good this year.

President Tucker stated but I also think that Mike has saved us some money on various claims. I don't have the actual numbers.

Council Member Truman stated I think that \$9,000.00 is alot of money to just totally ignore, if we don't want \$9,000.00 extra in our budget and we want to spend \$9,000.00 when we don't have to.

President Tucker stated looking at it in black and white, I understand what you say, but I think there's more to it than that. I don't want to get into personalities and this type of thing but there are other things to consider other than just flat premium dollars. The companies are rated the same.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I have a comment. I want to say that it has been a pleasure working with Hinton & Corby Insurance, a pleasure, the paperwork and performance has been excellent.

Council Member Truman stated none of my comments are to be in any way interpreted as anything derogatory or negative to Mike or Hinton & Corby, that's not my intention at all. I think they are both good reputable local companies. That's not my intentions. I'm looking at the dollars for what I think is pretty comparable coverage. I ask all these board members individually how they can justify spending an extra \$9,000.00.

Council Member Everitt stated I've been on the board for six years and the first four years I was not satisfied with Montgomery Agency, different things happened. There were vehicles that was never put on the insurance, there was claims it seemed like that our town board at that time felt that they would of paid and did not.

Council Member Truman stated you mean like when the town board arrested Redbuck.

Council Member Everitt stated I've been happy with the Hinton & Corby and I'm not getting into detail, I don't need no law suits but that's my feeling. I felt like that there's on what he had just presented here Karl he's added a deductible of \$2,500.00, that wasn't on the one that was in the town hall the other night, right here, this has been added on since I got this out of my box yesterday. This booklet was laying in the building open where anybody that wanted to could see what Hinton & Corby proposed bid was. My vote is for Hinton & Corby.

President Tucker stated assuming there is no further discussion the motion is that the Montgomery Agency be approved and seconded by Doug. I will now ask for a vote.

Vote 2-3, with Council Members Truman and Eddings voting in favor of the Montgomery Agency and Council Members Everitt, Broady and President Tucker voting against.

Motion made to stay with Hinton & Corby Insurance made by Council Member Broady and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 3-2, with Council Members Everitt, Broady and President Tucker voting in favor and Council Members Eddings and Truman voting against.

Chief Kinder Addresses Council/Road Markings On Highway 311

Chief Kinder stated the only thing I have tonight is and I'm sure everyone has noticed the new lines on the road. All we know is the state highway department said they were going to lay them. I'm sure it will take some time to adjust. We haven't had any accidents yet.

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Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Birds In Cresten Subdivision

Council Member Everitt stated I got a call from Linda who stated Mr. Meyer from the Health Department told her about a company that had a machine that could get rid of birds. I did get a call Friday and he came right out and we met with some of the people in Cresten. He has some tapes I would like the board to see on this and maybe discuss purchasing this or some way of getting rid of these birds.

Several residents expressed concerns over the birds.

A representative from Adams Dominion, Mr. Hancock, explained the situation with the birds and possible health problems and how his company could help with this situation. He then showed a video tape showing the problem with the birds.

President Tucker stated Mr. Hancock, I'm not trying to diminish them at all, what I'd like you to do is leave the tape with us. I think we get a pretty good idea of what the problem is. I have to go home that way so I will drive by. What I suggest, I didn't hear about this unil Wednesday of this week and that's when Roy called and said there was a company that had something that could control this situation. What I suggest is this I assume you have a proposal with cost and so forth.

Mr. Hancock stated the cost would range from \$15,000.00 to down around \$7,000.00.

Mr. Meyer from the Clark County Health Department stated I just wanted to back up a step here. When Linda called me last week and asked me and I'm not endorsing this company by any means. I have looked over their literature and it seems like a good product. Today I've started investigating a little more and talking with some other folks throughout the state and in Kentucky and found that they do indeed appear to be pretty reputable. I've also talked with U.S.D.A. and the animal damage control division which deals with these kinds of things. One thing I want to point out about histoplasmosis, it is in the ground almost throughout Indiana and what happens is you get the birds fertilizing the gound and leaves start to develope spores, the spores then become airborne and that's how you pick them up so whatever we do from this point forward, if the spores and histo's are already active we won't be taking care of that problem. There's nothing we can do about it. I don't think in daily lives you can expose yourself to alot of histo unless you start stirring up alot of dust with heavy equipment and etc.

President Tucker stated my suggestion was and I'm not trying to procrastinate but there are only so many times that you meet and so forth. Mr. Meyer, if you can get in touch with the lady from Purdue and ask her to come to the next meeting which is Sept. 12th if you could attend and in the meantime, if you could put together a proposal of what you think it's going to be.

President Tucker asked the Clerk Treasurer to put this on the next agenda for September 12.

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Council Member Everitt Addresses Council/Birds In Cresten Subdivision Cont.

Council Member Everitt asked is there anyway we can help especially the one area there in Cresten.

President Tucker stated I didn't say we weren't going to do it. All I said was we have to think about it and see what their proposal is. I mean I don't have a budget that says here's \$7,000.00 to take care of this. There's more to it than that simple answer. I didn't find out about it until Wednesday of last week. We will have a meeting on this and if we can fix it we will. It didn't start last Wednesday. I know it's been there for at least ten years. I've seen them all over that area. It takes more than taking a gun up there and blowing a tree up.

Mr. Hancock stated he and the residents will get together and present a plan to the council.

President Tucker stated we have a meeting on September 12th, with the help of Mr. Meyer and Purdue University and Mr. Hancock, we will all be back here to discuss this and see if we can't find a solution.

Stephen D. Prather, Building Inspector Presents Claims

Stephen D. Prather, Building Commissioner presented his claims from August 9th through August 22nd in the amount of \$2,723.72 and stated here is a second document for a refund for Ivy Tech. They will need to come in and sign this form.

President Tucker stated the zoning appeals board on August 9th recommended that the town council refund \$625.00 to Ivy Tech, to make a long story short, they were fined \$1,000.00 by the Building Commissioner. It was agreed by that committee as sort of a legal process that the town refund \$625.00 to Ivy Tech.

Motion to approve refund in the amount of \$625.00 to Ivy Tech made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Everitt.

Vote 4-0

Motion made to approve claims in the amount of \$2,723.72 to the Building Commissioner made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Truman.

Council Member Eddings Addresses Council/Hydrant Flushing

Council Member Eddings stated we will be flushing hydrants in Jeffersonville on Wednesday and Thursday.

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Council Member Broady Addresses Council/Request From Gail Finan On Sewer Adjustment

Council Member Broady stated I have a letter from Gail Finan requesting an additional sewer adjustment. Once upon a time we gave her a sewer adjustment and since then on three seperate occasions there has been some sort of a failure on the plumbing of her pool.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer asked would her insurance compensate her on this for the loss. I have referred a couple of residents who have had success with their agents.

Council Member Broady stated it's common practice to give a one time sewer adjustment on pools.

President Tucker stated I will give you my personal opinion. Several years ago my pool had a hole in it. The water leaked out and I had to fill it up several times. I paid my sewer bills.

Council Member Truman stated I feel like if it is documented why not give the lady a break.

After much discussion a motion was made by Council Member Truman to give Ms. Finan an additional sewer adjustment and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 2-3, with Council Members Broady and Truman voting in favor and Council Members Everitt, Eddings and President Tucker voting against.

Council Member Broady Addresses Council/Request From Wayne Nelis On Sewer Adjustment

Council Member Broady stated this was made out to me from Wayne Nelis in Covered Bridge and he would like to know if and when he will be able to get an adjustment on his sprinkler system.

President Tucker stated we have already discussed that issue, they are not in the Town of Sellersburg so they are not entitled to an adjustment.

Council Member Eddings stated if they have two meters installed, one for sprinkling the lawn, do we still charge them for sewer.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated yes, because they are not Town of Sellersburg residents.

Council Member Eddings stated you'd better look at that again folks.

Clerk Treasurer Schafer stated I had the State Board of Accounts look at it and they said due to the fact it stated Town of Sellersburg residents, it did not apply to Covered Bridge.

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Council Member Broady Addresses Council/Request From Wayne Nelis On Sewer Adjustment Cont.

Council Member Eddings stated can you legally charge somebody for something they are not using, I'm talking about the sewer.

President Tucker asked Attorney McCall to look into that.

President Tucker Presents Res. 1994-25/A Res. Authorizing Town of Sburg Council President And Clerk Treasurer To Close On The Sale Of Town Real Property

President Tucker stated let me get into this real quick. To make a long story short, the two parcels of land that we just sold, one on Highway 131 and the old fire station. We need to pass a resolution that Linda and I sign to close on the properties.

Attorney McCall Addresses Council/Pixley VS Town of Sellersburg Settlement

Attorney McCall stated I've got this thing on the Pixley case, the wetland marsh deal. Regardless of what happens. It basically says we will follow one of the recommendations, meaning we don't have to to the wetland, we can either do the soiling and planting the grass or the wetland marsh deal I'm asking tonight that the town council vote to settle this case once and for all.

Motion to settle this case by one of the two options in the Pixley VS Town of Sellersburg case made by Council Member Eddings and seconded by Council Member Broady.

Vote 4-0

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Council Member Broady Addresses Council/Sewer Adjustment R. J. Wilson Builders

Council Member Broady stated that he had been approached by R. J. Wilson Builders on possible sewer adjustments for homes that they were building. Mr. Wilson stated that they didn't use the sewer that they watered the grass and sprayed off the road and had asked him if it would be possible to get a sewer adjustment. Mr. Wilson stated that New Albany didn't charge them until after the home had sold.

President Tucker asked Council Member Broady to check the surrounding cities and see what type of procedure, they use and they would then discuss it further.
