Mr. Bridges stated his request for abatement would include the existing facility and also other facilities constructed in this area.

President Tucker stated that the request for tax abatement would be taken under advisement. Fresident Tucker also stated that the matter of zoning would need to be taken up with the zoning board.

Charles Cissell addressed the council to consider adjustments of sewer during the summer months when residents water yards and flowers. Mr. Cissell stated that New Albany offered this service. John Toombs suggested to the council that they contact Dave: Fredrick with Umbaugh and Associates due to the bond payments being based on water and sewer rates.

Reverend Bob Hauselman offered up the opening prayer for this meeting.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited.

REGULAR MEETING (CONT.)

Minutes of Last Meeting

President Tucker dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting and requested a motion be made to accept them. Motion made by Dave Broady and seconded by Karl Truman.

Resolution 1992-6/ Land Use Controls

Resolution 1992-6 was presented to the council members by President Tucker in reference to a moratoriun on the construction of new commercial, industrial, multi-family and multiple single-family development. Construction of these uses may only happen after the receipt of a special exception from the Sellersburg Planning Commission. This moratorium will be in effect until the new Zoning Ordinances and Subdivision Regulations go into effect or six months, whichever comes first.

Motion made to approve Resolution 1992-6 made by Karl Truman and seconded by Doug Eddings Jr. Vote 4-0

President Tucker Presented Information on CCD Fund

President Tucker stated for residents at this meeting that were present for the public hearing for the CCD Fund that the posting was not dated and that the meeting will be next Monday, October 19, 1992 at 6:30 p.m. at the Sellerburg Library.

Clerk Treas. Linda Schafer stated that all we needed to do on the CCD Fund was to renew this fund and the fund was originally established in 1984 and was part of the 1993 published budget with no additional increase to taxpayers.

President Tucker Presents Information on Progress of Recodification

President Tucker stated that he had requested information from the Clerk Treas. Linda Schafer as to the progress of Hoosier Recodification Services. In a letter of reply sent to the clerk treas. from Hoosier Recodification stated that the draft of the codification will be sent to the Town of Sellersburg on December 14th, 1992.

President Tucker Presents Public Information on Water

President Tucker presented public information on the draining of the water tank at Holmans In. for inspection and cleaning on Oct. 16 thru

October 23rd. Recommended caution while doing laundry. The water tank at Sellers Ave. will be drained on Oct. 25 thru Oct. 30th. Residents may experience low pressure and brown water. If conditions persist hydrants will be flushed.

Petitions Or Comments By Those Citizens Present

Pat Eckert, a resident of N. Fern St. presented a signed petition to the council members and voiced her and other residents concerns about the existing unsafe and the potentially dangerous conditions the Community Park has brought to her neighborhood.

Ms. Eckert stated that the existing problems are mainly due to the football practice that is taking place on the park grounds, and felt more concerns with Little League in the Spring.

Ms. Eckert stated that there has been excessive speed, property damage, and an increase of bicycling and children on their street with the football practice.

Ms. Eckert stated that residents would like the Town of Sellersburg to annex the park as to have the authority create an ordinance to put regulations on the operation of the park and would protect the residents who live in the area.

Ms. Eckert stated that the residents feel the short term solution would be to put a stop sing at the intersection of N. Fern St. and Atkins Ct.

Ms. Eckert stated that the residents feel the long term solution to the dangerous conditions of such a narrow street is another entrance way to the Park.

President Tucker stated that the park was in the county and the town limits ended at the houses.

President Tucker stated that another entrance has been opened and additional Police patrols have been added and discussion between Mike Goldman and Iarry Gilbert to look at possible other entrance off Diefenbach Rd. which would come over to Utica/Watson Rd. but would go around behind Iarry Gilberts place of business which would not effect Fern St. at all.

President Tucker stated for the Street Supt. to locate the dead end sign and put it back up and to check into installing a stop sign at N. Fern and Adkins Ct.

Jo Ellen & Iee Whitpan addressed the council with problems they were having due to sewer installation at their residence on Michigan Ave.

Regular Meeting (Cont.)

Ms. Whitpan stated that cermanic tile in her bathroom cracked, door jams came away from the frames, and ceilings cracked due to blasting by Smith Const. while installing sewer lines.

Mr. Whitpan stated that they were told that their yard would be restored to its original condition but was not, and they were having some difficulty in obtaining bids to do their sewer tap.

President Tucker requested that John Toombs contact Smith Const. to meet with the Whitpans this week to resolve there problems and requested that Dave Broady get with the Whitpans to talk about what can be done as far as the sewer tap.

Bill Branham addressed the council on the storm drain problem he was having at his residence at Beechwood and Popular St. He stated that street repair on his street affected the natural draining resulting with water coming up in his yard taking the top soil with it.

Dave Broady, Council Member, stated that he, Mr. Toombs and Roy Everitt would investigate the problems and make a recommendation to the council on resolving this problem.

President Tucker requested that this be done within the next ten(10) days.

Jim Haehl a resident of Speed addressed the council due to the increase in the sewer rates. He stated that he had a limited income and could not afford the sewer rate increases.

Mr. Haehl asked the council what he could do.

President Tucker suggested that Water Superintendent, Clark Henson, check Mr. Haehl's meter due to the amount of his bill. President Tucker stated that the rates of the sewer increases were mandiated due to the bond issues and there was nothing that could be done.

Chief of Police Addresses Council on Blood Borne Pathogens

Chief Kinder of the Sellersburg Police Dept. addressed council members with information on blood borne pathogens. Chief Kinder stated that the town was in violation and the fine for not complying with this could be 100,000.00.

President Tucker requested that Chief Kinder meet with Steve Prather, IOSHA representative for the town to see if he has followed through with necessary training for employees.

Regular Meeting (Cont.)

Discussion on Sewer Tap-ins

Rick Wheeler, sewer supt., stated that alot of people have asked what will happen if they can't meet the October deadline.

John Toombs, consulting engineer, stated that the Board of Health said that the town had an ordinance that could be inforced and insist that people connect on to the sewer system.

Mr. Toombs stated that the town had a list of over 400 people that needed to tap on with 72 left. There are a few people who for one reason or another are unable even though they have tried to get on and we are keeping a list to keep them off the new billing. The remaining people who haven't tapped. Mr Toombs suggested a certified letter be sent to them.

President Tucker stated that the residents that do not have a special circumstance why they have not hooked on at some point in time will receive notices that they have to hook up and if they do not they are in non compliance. President Tucker stated that the town has the authority to force them to hook on due to the current ordinance.

Council Member Discusses Hiring Police Officers and ADA Training

Karl Truman, council member, addressed the council members reguarding the Police Dept. stating that the police commissioners are beginning or in the process to hire two police officers. He stated that he wanted everyone to understand that these are not additional officers but are replacing people that have left the dept. for one reason or another in the past. Mr. Truman stated that the commissioners are looking at a start date of mid to late December to begin the academy in January.

Mr. Truman stated that at the last police commissioners meeting there was a consultant that specialized in hiring proceedures and the police commissioners were interested in trying to work with him due to the complexities of the ADA laws in particularly Public Safety. The cost of this will be a couple thousand dollars.

Conflict of Interest Presented by Police Commissioner

Karl Truman, council member, presented to the council members for approval a conflict of interest from Earl Bonniville, Police Commissioner. Mr. Bonniville also the towns current insurance agent.

Regular Meeting (Cont.)

Motion made by Karl Truman to approve the conflict of interest from Mr. Bonniville and seconded by Dave Broady. Vote 4-0

Consulting Engineer Addresses Council on Sale of Water

John Toombs, consulting engineer, stated that he had received a call from Tom Horn of Rieth-Riley Construction has requested to buy water from Sellersburg. Mr. Horns company will be making all the concrete to put down on I-265 from I-65 to State Road 62.

Motion made by Doug Eddings Jr. to approve request to sell water to Rieth-Riley Construction Co. under the auspice of John Toombs and Clark Henson and seconded by Karl Truman. Vote 4-0

Consulting Engineer Addresses Council with Memorandum of Water Tanks

John Toombs presented to the council members memorandum on cleaning and testing the water tanks at Holman In. and Sellers. Ave.

Mr. Toombs stated that the total cost of 3900.00 would be paid out of the Servend Project payable to CT Services, Inc.

Consulting Engineer Presents Contract

John Toombs presented his contract for the Planning Grant Program Storm Water Management Plan for the signature of President Tucker.

No motion was made to approve President Tucker signing the presented document since it was previously approve to accept John Toombs' proposal from his company on contingency of the release of IDOC Funds.

Consulting Engineer Presents Proposal on Sewer Problem

John Toombs discussed the Beechwood area the same neighborhood that was discuss on drainage problems earlier in the meeting. Mr Toombs stated that the houses that set on Dreyer In. have had alot of problems with sewer back-ups. Mr Toombs stated that he looked at it and the sewer is much to shallow and he had developed a project and took prices to go into these peoples back yards hoping to eliminate problems by installing a new sewer, that a manhole will take some of this flow the other direction.

Mr Toombs stated that he had requested prices from 5 companies and received 2. The low bidder was Reschar Sewer Service, Inc.

Attorney McCall Addresses Council Presenting Ord. 92-539 Annexation

Attorney McCall Discusses the Airport Sewer Lift Station

Attorney McCall addressed the council on the tentative agreement that was sent to him for the take over of the airport sewer lift station. Attorney McCall stated that he felt we may need to get it in writing. The easement that needed to be in the agreement he did not have the original. Attorney McCall stated he would make a copy and place them in the councils boxes to give them a chance to review and he would address this at the next meeting.

President Tucker asked who was going to repair the ladder at the lift station. Mr. Toombs stated that he would see that it was done.

President Tucker stated that the CCD Fund already existed in our budget now and what happened is that every three years the CCD Fund needed to be renewed. The prior administration should have renewed in 1991 so that it would be available in 1992. It was not renewed and this meeting was set in esscence to renew the CCD Fund.

Karl Truman, council member stated that the Police Dept. and the Sellersburg Fire District has entered into negotiations for the Police Dept. to do the knock-out for the Fire District setting off the toner page. Council Member Truman stated that when the firemen arrive at the fire station they will take over the dispatching. Council Member Truman stated that basicaly the terms of the agreement is that the Fire District is going to pay the dispatchers a total of 6000.00 in additional compensation to cover this and that the Fire District will provide the necessary equipment to do it and other equipment such as recording devices and the Fire District will hold the Town of Sellersburg debt free and hold harmless the Town of Sellersburg for any acts or lawsuits that may rise and the Fire District council will take care of the agreement for the town to sign.

Council Member Truman made a motion that the Town of Sellesburg approve this agreement.

Vice-President Everitt stated that the council should first see the agreement in writing first before it is approved.

Council Member Truman stated that the reason he brought it up to be approved was that the Fire District was facing a time crunch due to notifing the Central Alarm due to the next meeting on December 14, 1992 Council Member Truman stated that this was his reason for outlining this verbaly and the written document for signatures would be presented at a later date.

Mr. Toombs stated that the town is asking them to put the Hwy 311 on their list of projects that need to be looked into.

Mr. Toombs stated that maybe there could be meetings for input to get the ball rolling and get it on what is called the TIP (Transportation Improvment Program.

Consulting Engineer Presents Letter to Covered Bridge Golf Course

John Toombs, consulting engineer, presented to the council members a letter prepared for the owners of the Covered Bridge Golf Course stated that when the Town of Sellersburg granted permission to connect to the sewers, they agreed to have the actual owners of the development give the town a written statement that they would never oppose annexation by the town of Sellersburg in the future and that this would be put on the subdivision plats, as well, to bind any further owners of lots or the Golf Course. The letter also stated that the documents needed to be prepared and presented to the Sellersburg Town Council before any house can be connected to the sewers and their engineer needs to complete details of the Lift Stations and submit them to Mr. Toombs for approval.

Bobby Adkins addressed the council members concerning the burning of hazardous waste.

Mr. Adkins stated that he had been involved in the subject of hazardous waste for several months back even before the election he had talked to Karl Truman about it before he was elected to the town council.

Mr. Adkins stated that the Sellersburg Town Council has chosen to ignore something that is very vital to the community and this is concerning ESSROC wanting to burn hazardous waste, not only in the edge of the community that covers Speed and Sellersburg but across from the schools.

Mr. Adkins stated that as a matter of fact if you take the Sellersburg Elementary, St. Pauls, Ivy Tech there are about 4500 students within a mile and one half of ESSROC'S plant.

Mr. Adkins stated that a little history of this was when ESSROC first came out that they wanted to burn hazardous waste they established a committee

of select people and in talking to these people Mr. Adkins felt they were not told by ESSROC what they were going to do and there has never been a public meeting with the people involved as to what they were going to do.

Mr. Adkins stated that one thing that was told by ESSROC was they did not plan to burn anything except paint thinners and contaminated clothes and so forth, but when Mr. Adkins reviewed the application to burn there was fourteen pages of about thirty-five chemicals per page, and Mr. Adkins was told that this was one of the largest applications ever seen in a cement Kiln, somewhere between 400 and 500 chemicals that ESSROC is wanting to burn in this community.

Mr. Adkins stated that at one point he felt the lone voice in the wilderness, that no one was listening, but fortunatly people did start to listen and started to take notice.

Mr. Adkins stated that one thing his group did was go to the county commissioners and ask them to get involved, because they were not getting any involvment from local leaders, which the Sellersburg Town Council is the main body of this.

Mr. Adkins stated that the council members are the town executives, elected by the town, and were not appointed, and ran for the job and there is a responsibility that goes with this job and destroying our community by burning hazardous waste certainly needs to be looked into.

Mr. Adkins stated that he respected the fact that the council wanted to remain neutral in it but requested the council to look at the fact that this has grave consequences to the community if the things he is reading are true.

Mr. Adkins stated that if the council gets involved and finds that it agrees with hazardous burning and they can come out and lead the community and tell us why burning hazardous waste is safe he would be very interested in getting involved, but to remain neutral at this point in time is a luxury the council can no longer afford and certainly not the community.

Mr. Adkins stated that the county commissioners have gone on record as saying that they don't believe that burning hazardous waste in Sellersburg can do anything for the community nor can it do anything for the county in general and they will do anything they can to stop hazardous waste whether an ordinance or what ever and in addition to that the commissioners appointed a group of people, (a sub-committee) to look into the burning of hazardous waste and two weeks ago the committee stated that they felt the commissioners should pass a moritorium on any burning until they could aquire more information because of how bad it appeared to them that burning hazardous waste will be across from schools

and in the community.

Mr. Adkins stated that the council members have waited to hear from the community and presented the council with a petition containing 1,951 signatures from a community that is pretty well set against burning hazardous waste and the number of people refusing to sign fell in the catagory of conflict of interest in that they did business with they or they had family that worked for ESSROC.

Mr. Adkins stated to President Tucker, that in Forrest Estates out of thirty homes five refused to sign the petition and President Tucker was one of the five.

Mr. Adkins requested that the council get involved, find out what is going on and requested that the council pass a resolution to lead our town saying they are against hazardous waste burning.

Mr. Adkins stated that the council needs to take an active roll based on the level or consequences to the community.

Mr. Adkins stated that the health factor was the most important thing but the 1980 deensus stated that when ever hazardous waste is burnttin a community that property values decrease 35% to 40%. This will cover a radius of at least two miles and two miles will cover most of Sellersburg and Hamburg and Speed.

Mr. Adkins stated that it was time that the council look at two things, one is that Louisville Cement no longer exist, they went out of business when they were bought out by this company in 1984 or 1985 and if Louisville Cement was still running the cement plant they would not put on this community the burning of hazardous waste, therefore this community should not be giving to ESSROC some of the good will that came from the Louisville Cement Plant that goes back to 1870. The second thing is that its time that it becomes part of this community and becomes a good cItizen in the community and stop the fugitive dust that's blanketing the area. Its also time since most of the services are being furnished to Speed now with the exception of police is that Speed and the mill be ANNEXED and the public needs to be informed where the town is on the ANNEXATION of this area.

President Tucker stated that Leo Gettlefinger from ESSROC had dropped a press release off at his work stating that they have discontinued any desire to burn hazardous waste.

Mr. Adkins stated that until ESSROC informs IDEM in writing this press release meant nothing, and there are better places to burn hazardous

waste in Indiana than in a community and better ways than a cement kiln such as a hazardous waste incinerator that is designed to burn hazardous waste and is controlled and monitored minute by minute and whenever it doesn't comply with air standards its shut down until the modifications are made.

Mr. Adkins stated that he was told that ESSROC had until August 1994 to complete test burning and he wanted it in writing that ESSROC has withdrawn their application and it will give the Sellersburg Town Council, the County Commissioners, and the rest of the people time to put together ordinances so that it doesn't occur in our community.

President Tucker stated that in his conversation with Leo Gettlefinger he stated that they were going to withdraw their application and to work on the dust problem before they do anything else.

President Tucker stated that he had also told Mr. Adkins that the council was remaining neutral to gather information, not because they are not passionate, don't understand, or they don't have feelings, but the council is trying to gather information and Mr. Adkins had presented the council with 1900 signatures of how people feel but there are 4000 other people that the council wanted to hear from.

President Tucker stated that it was not in the Town of Sellersburg at this time its in the county and the commissioners have made their feelings known.

President Tucker stated that he will ask the other council members to take under advisement what the town should do next, whether it be an ordinance or resolution and ask the advise of the council attorney as well.

President Tucker stated that all he was trying to do issignther informate ion.

Mr. Adkins asked President Tucker if he would like to state how he felt now or at the next council meeting because if President Tucker has been gathering information he must have an opinion.

President Tucker stated that he had no positive information at this time.

Basically we had a lot of bills we had to pay in 1992 that were left over from 1991 and in essencewe were in the hole at the beginning of the year and that will continue until we can reduce spending to pick up the 98,000.00. Sone of the things that happened in the past was that certain amounts of money that were in the budget even though there was no cash for it were encumbered, meaning I still want the money so leave back in the previous year but we still have to pay it out of current years money. In our case if we emcumber the police bills we will have to pay it out of 1993 money and by encumbering the bills it basically perpetuates the problem. By being 98,000.00 in the hole we would be 104,000.00 in the hole. But if you pay the bills from 1993 dollars this would cut into the money you would have to spend for 1993. President Tucker stated that the clerk treas. was asking that the bills incured in 1992 be paid in 1993 which would reduce the amount to be spent in that catigory for 1993 in the amount of 6000.00

Council Member Truman stated that he didn't understand at all. He stated that he kept hearing 90,000.00 70,000.00, 100,000.00 and he stated that he doesn't know what we are in the hole. We were suppose to start the year 1992 with 70,000.00 out of the sewer cash reserve fund an amount of 140,000.00 was transfered into the general fund and how are we suppose to be 98,000.00 in the hole, something is not adding up. Where is this money going. If it was 1993 money that came in December there were other bills paid out of that money so if you are going to say 1993 money your going to say that all the bills paid back then was 1993 money. Council' Member Truman asked what do you think is going to happen to the police dept. budget which was already cut to be these for 1993 than for 1992. Now your taking several thousand dollars more out of the budget. Council Member Truman stated that the police dept. was being crippled.

Council member Trumanemade motion they be paid out of 1992 as they should have been. When clerk treas. Linda Schafer tried to respond Council Member Truman called point of order. Doug Eddings Jr. seconded to open it up for discussion.
