ORDINANCE NO. 201

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Civil Town of Sellersburg, Indiana:

SECTION 1. PERMIT A permit shall be secured from the Town of Sellersburg by the owner of the property or by his duly authorized agent before connecting to or tapping a municipal sewer, altering or laying a building sewer to or from any sewer which is a part of the municipal sewerage system of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

SECTION 2. That before the Clerk-Treasurer shall issue any permit as provided for in Section One of this ordinance, there shall be paid by such applicant, the sum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars for each permit applied for.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof which are in conflict with the terms hereof are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not less than One (\$1.00) Dollar or more than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and legal posting and publication.

WHEREAS, the parking of motor vehicles on either side of Utica Street, in the Town of Sellersburg, along with the greatly increased flow of vehicular traffic, has become a menace to the safety and welfare of the inhabitants of said Town, and,

And he is further of the opinion that it will be possible to let a contract for the construction of the same and to procure the necessary labor and materials to complete the same.

He further certifies that at the request of the attorney for the Town of Sellersburg he made inquiry of both the War Production Board and the War Labor Board. That he was advised by the War Production Board that the Town might proceed with the project without any special permission from the Board. That he was informed by the War Labor Board that the Town might proceed with the project providing all labor used was properly certified through the local Federal Employment Agency.

Trustee Thomas thereupon introduced Ordinance No. 106, which ordinance is entitled "An Ordinance of the Town of Sellersburg authorizing the issuance of additional Sewage Works Revenue Bonds pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 92, and matters connected therewith", and moved that the Clerk-Treasurer be instructed to read said ordinance in full.

This motion was seconded by Trustee Guenther and unanimously adopted. The Clerk-Treasurer then read said ordinance in full, which ordinance reads as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 106

An Ordinance of the Town of Sellersburg authorizing the issuance of additional Sewage Works Revenue Bonds pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 92, and matters connected therewith.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 92, adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg on December 30, 1938, the issuance of Sewage Works Revenue Bonds in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) was authorized, but the amount to be sold and delivered at that time was limited to the bonds numbered from 1 to 50 inclusive, aggregating Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00), which ordinance further provided that the remaining bonds should not be prepared or issued unless and until this Board should so direct; and

WHEREAS, the Board now finds that the proceeds of said Sewage Works Revenue Bond heretofore sold and delivered are not sufficient to complete the entire project, particularly that part of the project consisting of sewers for the handling of surface water from the streets, alleys and other public

places in the Town in order to prevent the overloading of the sewage treatment plant; that it is now possible for the Town to complete said uncompleted portion of the project as originally contemplated at a cost, including all incidental expenses necessary to be incurred in connection with said project and the issuance of bonds on account thereof, of not exceeding Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00); that a necessity now exists for the issuance of additional bonds authorized under the provisions of Ordinance No. 92, in the amount of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.00); and

WHEREAS, the City Securities Corporation of Indianapolis, Indiana, the purchaser of the now outstanding Sewage Works Revenue Bonds, has agreed to purchase the additional bonds proposed to be issued on the same basis as the original bonds were purchased, viz. par for bonds bearing interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent (4-1/2%) per annum, which price the Board finds to be fair and equitable; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG:

Section 1. Minutes of Special Meeting April 26, 1940.

At a special meeting of the board two Board members, Claude Wells and Andrew Thomas, the town Attorney Mr. Douglass and Clerk-Treas were present.

At this meeting the Board discussed fixing the streets and Mr. Douglas was instructed to write the Public Service Co. and submit the following proposition;

1. The town is willing to take up the track, remove the poles, equipment and rails and restore the street, all at it's expense in consideration of transfer to it of all rails, ties, poles, wire and other material, and further that you convey to the town the three vacant lots on "Coon Hill", and the station lot and improvements thereon, except the transformer.
2. Inasmuch as the town is, at this time intending to reconstruct the streets on which the track lays and in the event the first proposition is not accepted, the town proposes to reconstruct and resurface the streets with modern "Black Top", finish, at it's expense, up to within 16 inches of the outside of the rails on each side. The Company to remove and keep the material and complete with same class and character of modern construction and "Black Top", finish that portion of the street now occupied by the track and 16 inches outside of the rails on each side thereof and to conform to the grade of the streets as established by the town. The works to be started within two weeks from date of execution of the agreement.

Motion was made and duly seconded that Mr. Douglass Atty. send the letter to Mr. D. P. Pardee, Vice Pres.

No further business the meeting was adjourned.
