 - b. Board members shall be paid twice per year on June 30 and December 31 for said year of service or as otherwise mutually agreed upon by this Council and the Clerk-Treasurer.
2. All other terms and conditions of Ordinance No. 2011-013 shall remain in full force and effect.

3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016 – 003

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING § 35.69 RESPONSIBILITIES OF DEPARTMENT MANAGERS

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 35-5-2 *et seq.*, this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana (this “Council”) is the town legislative and fiscal bodies and the President of the town council is the town executive; and,

WHEREAS, from time to time, this Council desires to amend its code of ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, this Council now desires to amend Section 35.69 of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana Code of Ordinances.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana the following:

1. Section 35.69 is hereby amended as follows:
 - A. It is the responsibility of the department *head* to act as or designate a steward for each piece of property *over \$500.00*. The Steward will become the focal point for questions regarding the availability, condition and usage of the asset, as well as the contact during the physical inventory process.
 - B. *The department head or his or her designee, who shall be identified in writing and forwarded to each Town Council member, shall* be designated to record the receipt of the asset, to examine the asset to make sure that no damage was incurred during shipment and to make sure that the asset was received in good working order.
 - C. The steward is also responsible for arranging for the necessary preventative maintenance and any needed repairs to keep the asset in working condition. It is necessary to have a responsible person available for questions that arise during a physical inventory or when someone wants to borrow the asset. The steward ensures that the asset is used for the purpose for which it was acquired and that there is no personal or unauthorized use. In addition, the steward

should report, *in writing, to his or her department head*, any property damage or theft.

D. Department heads shall be accountable for an inventory list for all inventory above \$500.00 charged to their departments and shall verify a list of their capital assets at year end.

E. Department heads shall use the form set forth in Exhibit A for their inventory list.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK REGARDING ELIGIBILITY TO THE TOWN'S MEDICAL INSURANCE

WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 35-5-2 *et seq.*, this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana (this "Council") is the town legislative and fiscal bodies and the President of the town council is the town executive; and,

WHEREAS, from time to time, this Council desires to amend its Employee Handbook; and,

WHEREAS, this Council now desires to amend the benefits section of the Town of Sellersburg Employee Handbook (November 2008).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana as follows:

1. Page 29 of the November 2008 Town of Sellersburg Employee Handbook shall be amended to include the following language:

Medical Insurance

Full-time employees *and full-time elected officials* are eligible for the town's medical insurance plan on the first month following 60 days of continuous employment. Major benefits of the plan include hospitalization, surgery, major medical care, diagnostic X-Rays, lab fees, and prescription coverage. More information on the plan is available from the clerk-treasurer.


Town council members and town board appointments are considered part-time elected or appointed officials and are prohibited from participating in the town's medical insurance plan. Further, all full-time employees and full-time elected officials are expected to adhere to the town's policy of working a minimum of 37 ½ hours per week on a regular basis. Failure to maintain a regular 37 ½ hour work week may jeopardize the full-time employee or full-time elected official's eligibility for the town's medical insurance plan.

2. All other provisions of the Town of Sellersburg Employee Handbook (November 2008) are unaffected by this amendment and are in full force and effect.
3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.



AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE “LOIT SPECIAL DISTRIBUTION FUND 257”

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-5-2 *et seq.*, this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana (this “Council”) is the town legislative body and the President of the town council is the town executive; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-5-2-9, the legislative body may adopt ordinances and resolutions for the performance of functions of the town; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-1-3 *et seq.* (i.e. “Home Rule”), a unit may exercise any power it has to the extent that the power is not expressly denied by the Indiana Constitution or by statute and is not expressly granted to another entity; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Senate Enrolled Act 67 (2016), on May 27, 2016 the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana received \$362,776.82 to be held in a special distribution fund.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana as follows:

1. The “LOIT Special Distribution Fund 257” is hereby established.
2. Per Ind. Code § 6-3.6-9-17(h), the \$362,776.82 shall be expended only upon an appropriation by the town’s fiscal body as follows:

(1) At least seventy-five (75%) of the special distribution must be:

a. Used exclusively by the town for:

- i. Engineering, land acquisition, construction, resurfacing, maintenance, restoration or rehabilitation of both local and arterial road and street systems;**

- ii. The payment of principal and interest on bonds sold primarily to finance road, street, or thoroughfares projects;
- iii. Any local costs required to undertake a recreational or reservoir road project under IC 8-23-5;
- iv. The purchase, rental, or repair of highway equipment;
- v. Providing a match for a grant from the local road and bridge matching grant fund under IC 8-23-30; or,
- vi. Capital projects for aviation related property or facilities, including capital projects of a board of aviation commissioners established under IC 8-22-2 or an airport authority established under IC 8-22-3-1; or

- b. Deposited in the town's rainy day fund established under IC 36-1-8-5.1. The money deposited in a rainy day fund under this clause may not be appropriated from the rainy day fund or transferred to another fund under IC 36-1-8-5.1(g), unless the money will be used exclusively for purposes set for in clause (a).

(2) The remaining part of the special distribution may be used by the town for any of the purposes of the town.

- 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.

WHEREAS, fireworks are normally expressly prohibited within the town limits; and

WHEREAS, this Council now desires to establish regulations and exceptions for the use of legal fireworks within the town limits consistent with the state laws of Indiana and State Fire Marshall.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana as follows:

1. Legal fireworks may be discharged within the town limits of Sellersburg, Indiana between the hours of 9 a.m. until two (2) hours after sunset on the days of June 29, June 30, July 1, July 2, July 3, July 5, July 6, July 7, July 8, July 9.

- 
2. Legal fireworks may also be discharged within the town limits of Sellersburg, Indiana between the hours of 9 a.m. until midnight on Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, and New Year's Eve.
 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.

WHEREAS, this Council has determined a need to establish a “Special Nonreverting Capital Fund” for the Parks and Recreation Board of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by this Town Council of Sellersburg, Indiana as follows:


1. The “Special Nonreverting Capital Fund” for the Parks and Recreation Board is hereby established.
2. Pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-10-3-22(b), the fiscal officer shall deposit fees from the swimming pool into the Special Nonreverting Capital Fund. Monies shall only be used for the maintenance and upgrades to the swimming pool.
3. Money deposited into said fund may not be withdrawn except for the purposes for which the fund was created.

4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.





**AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF MINIMUM INTERNAL
CONTROL STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES AND DETERMINING MATERIALITY
THRESHOLD FOR THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG, IN**

Ordinance 2016-014

WHEREAS, I.C. 5-11-1-27 provides that internal control standards shall be defined to promote government accountability and transparency. This statute applies to all political subdivisions under I.C. 5-11-10.5-1, including counties, townships, cities, towns, school corporations, library districts, fire protection districts, public transportation corporations, local hospital authorities or corporations, local airport authority districts, special service districts, special taxing districts, or other separate local governmental entities that may sue and be sued; and,

WHEREAS, the State Board of Accounts (SBOA) is required under I.C. 5-11-1-27(e) to define the acceptable minimum level of internal control standards. All political subdivisions subject to audit by SBOA are expected to adhere to these standards, and will be evaluated accordingly in any audits that are performed by or on behalf of the SBOA; and,

WHEREAS, in response to such statute, the SBOA developed the Uniform Internal Control Standards for Indiana Political Subdivisions manual, which contains the acceptable minimum level of internal control standards; and,

WHEREAS, after June 30, 2016, I.C. 5-11-1-27(g) provides that the legislative body of each political subdivision must adopt the minimum internal control standards as defined by SBOA. Additionally, the legislative body must ensure that personnel receive training concerning the internal control standards and procedures adopted by the political subdivision; and,

WHEREAS, I.C. 5-11-1-27(j) requires erroneous or irregular material variances, losses, shortages, or thefts of political subdivision funds or property shall be reported immediately to the SBOA; and,

WHEREAS, State Examiner Directive 2015-6 directs each political subdivision to determine its own policy on materiality; and,

WHEREAS, the town of Sellersburg does not condone any erroneous or irregular material variances, losses, shortages, or thefts of political subdivision funds or property, but recognizes that relatively small items may not justify the cost of the involvement of the SBOA.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the town council of the town of Sellersburg, Indiana, as follows:

SECTION 1. Adoption of Minimum Standards & Procedures

The acceptable minimum level of internal control standards and procedures developed under I.C. 5-11-1-27(e) by the SBOA contained in the Uniform Internal Control Standards for Indiana Political Subdivisions manual, are hereby adopted by the town of Sellersburg and that

all Sellersburg town personnel shall receive training concerning the internal control standards and procedures hereby adopted.

SECTION 2. Establishment of Materiality Policy

Following ordinance 2016-003, the town of Sellersburg hereby establishes the additional Materiality Policy under I.C. 5-11-1-10, I.C. 5-11-1-21, I.C. 5-11-1-27:

Materiality, in the town of Sellersburg, is hereby defined as \$500.00 per occurrence. That is, if one occurrence of a loss or shortage or other irregularity is equal or greater than \$500.00, it must be reported to the SBOA. This materiality definition is not limited to defalcations or suspicious activity involving only cash or cash transactions. If supplies, equipment or other fixed assets belonging to the town of Sellersburg are suspected of being misappropriated or stolen or used in a manner not authorized by town officials and the value of those supplies, equipment or fixed assets are approximately \$500.00, that misuse or series of misuse should be reported. That is not to say that if a loss or shortage is less than \$500.00 it should be ignored. If there is a series of events, within the same office or department that appears to be a structuring event to defraud or misappropriate the town of Sellersburg funds or property, that event or series of events should be reported to the SBOA.

SECTION 3. Material Variances, Losses Shortages or Thefts

All erroneous or irregular material variances, losses, shortages, or thefts of political subdivision funds or property shall be reported immediately to the SBOA. For all material variances, losses, shortages or thefts, the SBOA shall:

- (1) determine the amount of funds involved and report the amount to the appropriate government and law enforcement officials;
- (2) determine the internal control weakness that contributed to or caused the condition; and
- (3) make written recommendations to the appropriate legislative body or appropriate official overseeing the internal control system addressing:
 - (A) the method of correcting the condition; and
 - (B) the necessary internal control policies and internal control procedures that must be modified to prevent a recurrence of the condition.

SECTION 4. Notification of Fiscal Misconduct

If any Sellersburg town employee knows or has a concern that other Sellersburg town employees are engaged in fiscal misconduct, it is his/her duty to immediately notify their Supervisor or at least 2 members of the Sellersburg town council, or if the Supervisor or a town council member is involved, then notification should be made to the Town Attorney. Following procedure outlined in I.C. 5-11-1-9.5(a)(1), the notification by the individual should be in the

form of a sworn statement [in writing] that the individual believes the allegation to be true. Per I.C. 5-11-1-9.5(b), the town of Sellersburg may not retaliate against an employee of the town of Sellersburg for making a sworn statement on the subject of this materiality policy.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the town board of Sellersburg.



ORDINANCE NO 2016- 20

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE AND USE OF TOWN SECURED CREDIT CARDS AND PURCHASE CARDS FOR THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG

WHEREAS, the State Board of Accounts Accounting and Uniform Compliance Guidelines Manual For Cities and Towns, Chapter 7, authorizes a Town's use of credit cards once the Town adopts a resolution or ordinance regarding credit card policies; and

WHEREAS, the Sellersburg Town Council may authorize the use of credit cards and purchasing cards with conditions it deems necessary and appropriate under Indiana Home Rule Powers in IND. CODE § 36-1-3-1; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Sellersburg desires to approve the use of Town credit cards and purchasing cards by Town employees and officials in the performance of Town duties when such use is in the best interest of the Town.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

1. Ordinance 2007-011 is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety as follows:

(A) Credit Card Issuance

Section 1. The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby authorized to make application for credit cards for use by the each of the Town's Department Heads for the official Town business limited to travel, educational expenses and public purchases.

Section 2. Credit cards issued shall have a maximum limit of \$5,000.

Section 3. The Sellersburg Town Council authorizes the Sellersburg Clerk-Treasurer to pay any annual membership fee, service fee or renewal charge levied by the credit card issuer for the Town of Sellersburg credit card.

(B) Credit Card Use Policies and Procedures

Section 1. When not in use, each Department Head will be responsible for making sure the card is kept in a secure location, or held by the Clerk Treasurer.

Section 2. Town officials and employees shall be permitted to use credit cards for the purpose of town travel, educational expenses and public purchases but limited to the following:

- (a) Hotel or motel room.

(b) Hotel or motel room charges for telephone calls pertaining to town business, unless the Town pays for that employee's cell phone.

(c) Meals, including a maximum twenty percent (20%) gratuity.

(d) Fees or costs associated with attending schools, conventions, seminars and the like.

(e) Gasoline, if using a town owned vehicle.

(f) Excluded charges include alcoholic beverages, room service, nonbusiness telephone calls, except for one daily telephone call to the home of the town official or employee, in-room movies and cash advances.

Section 3. Town officials and employees shall be permitted to use credit cards for the purpose of town purchases limited to the following:

(a) Supplies

(b) Materials

(c) Small tools and minor equipment under \$300

(d) Membership Dues for organizations related to their department

Section 4: Each Department Head shall maintain a log for each time they delegate responsibility of a purchase to a subordinate. The log shall include the name of the individual charging, their position, the date the card leaves the Department Head's possession, an estimated amount charged, the fund/account numbers to be charged, and the date the card was returned. Each line shall have an initial line. (See exhibit A)

Section 5. The Sellersburg Town Council hereby directs the Sellersburg Clerk-Treasurer to allow no interest or carrying charges or penalties to accrue or be incurred because of late payments. Accounts payable vouchers filed in connection with the use of credit cards shall be submitted to the Clerk-Treasurer for processing **within three (3) business days unless used while on travel for Town business whereby it shall be turned in within three (3) business days upon return** and shall be properly itemized and documented as provided in IC 5-11-10 before approved and paid. The credit card account will be paid in full every billing cycle. Improperly itemized and documented items shall be the personal responsibility of the individual user. Late fees due to improper presentation of receipts to the Clerk-Treasurer for timely processing shall be the personal responsibility of the individual user.

(C) This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its adoption by the Town Council of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR COUNTY RD 311
PLANNING STUDY**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the Board of Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "the County"), the Town of Clarksville, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "Clarksville"), the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "Sellersburg").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Ind. Code 36-1-7, et seq. allows political subdivisions in the state of Indiana to enter into Interlocal Agreements; and,

WHEREAS, a need arises to conduct a Planning Study to assess existing conditions, requirements and opportunities for improved public mobility and safety along the County Road 311 corridor from County Line Road to County Road 403, Clark County, Indiana; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intent of Clarksville, Sellersburg and KIPDA to enter into this Agreement constituting a contract with the County to share in the cost of such Planning Study project, estimated to be approximately Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00);

IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED by the parties as follows:

1. **PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT** Pursuant to I.C. 36-1-7-3(2), this Agreement is made between the County, Clarksville, Sellersburg and KIPDA to initiate a Planning Study of the County Road 311 Corridor from County Line Road to County Road 403, Clark County, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "the Study") and related matters thereto.
2. **DURATION:** Pursuant to I.C. 36-1-7-3(1) This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect from the time it is executed by all parties until its provisions have been fulfilled, but not to exceed four (4) years. This Agreement may not be terminated except upon written agreement of both parties and upon compliance with the procedures set forth pursuant to I.C. 36-1-7, et seq.
3. **MANNER OF FINANCING, STAFFING AND SUPPLYING THE JOINT UNDERTAKING AND OF ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A BUDGET THEREOF:**

a. Manner of Financing:

- i. The Study's estimated cost is Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00). It is the parties' understanding that the Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency will contribute Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to the Study. The remaining costs shall be shared by the parties as follows:

- a. Clarksville shall contribute up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00);

- b. Sellersburg shall contribute up to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00);
 - c. County shall contribute up to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00); and
 - ii. The County will initiate the Planning Study and invoice Clarksville and Sellersburg for each parties' proportionate share of the invoice according to their total contribution. Clarksville and Sellersburg shall then remit payment under the invoice immediately;
 - iii. Each parties entire share due and payable shall be paid in full to the County by March 1, 2017;
 - b. Staffing and Supplying Joint Undertaking: The study will be undertaken in concert with the Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency (hereinafter referred to as "KIPDA"). Clark County shall enter into an agreement with KIPDA regarding the Study. In the Selection Process each party to this agreement shall have one (1) vote each in the Study engineer firm's selection. KIPDA shall have two (2) votes.
 - c. Maintenance of Budget: That the County shall monitor and maintain the budget.
4. **METHODS THAT MAY BE EMPLOYED IN ACCOMPLISHING THE PARTIAL OR COMPLETE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT:** This Agreement shall terminate upon the fulfillment of all terms and conditions outlined herein.
 5. **ADMINISTRATION:** This Agreement shall be administered jointly by the County Clarksville and Sellersburg. These entities shall be authorized to perform all duties and carry out all functions as are necessary to effectuate the purpose of this Agreement.
 6. **ACQUIRING, HOLDING AND DISPOSING OF PROPERTY:** No real estate shall be acquired, held or disposed of as part of this Agreement.
 7. **PAYMENT SCHEDULE:** Each party to this agreement shall immediately submit payment to the County upon receipt of an invoice, with the total balance, if any, then due on or before March 1, 2017.
 8. **APPROVALS:** This Agreement becomes in full force and effect upon approval by all parties as indicated by their signatures on this Agreement.
 9. **EXTENSION:** No extension of this Agreement is anticipated without additional approval of the parties.

10. **PURCHASE, SALE, OR EXCHANGE OF SERVICES, SUPPLIES OR EQUIPMENT:** Whenever a contract provides for the purchase, sale, or exchange of services, supplies, or equipment between or among Indiana governmental entities only, no notice by publication or posting is required pursuant to IC 36-1-7-12.

11. **UPON APPROVAL OF THIS AGREEMENT,** the County authorizes the President of the Clark County Commissioners, Clarksville authorizes the Town Council President, and Sellersburg authorizes its Town Council President, to execute all documents necessary to implement this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have affixed their signatures hereto on the dates shown below indicating their respective approvals of this Interlocal Agreement which will be for the benefit the general public.

WHEREAS, from time to time, this Council desires to amend its code of ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, this Council desires to amend the Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA) for the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana; and,

WHEREAS, this matter was considered in an open public meeting at which the public were invited to attend and participate.

BE IT NOW THEREFORE ORDAINED as follows:

1. Section 2 of Ordinance 2014-018 is hereby repealed and replaced with the following language:

Employee shall pay the first \$250 of the single deductible and the first \$500 of the family deductible.

Further, employee shall pay the first \$3,000 of the single out-of-pocket and the first \$6,000 of the family out-of-pocket.


2. All other sections of Ordinance 2014-018 shall remain in full force and effect.
3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and promulgation as evidenced by the affirmative signatures of the undersigned as the majority of the duly elected and serving members of this Council.
