AMENDMENT OF FIRST PARAGRAPH OF SECTION EIGHT(8) ORDINANCE NUMBER ~~SEVENTY-EIGHT~~^{EIGHTY} (88) KNOWN AS THE PEDDLERS LICENSE LAW, ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG, CLARK COUNTY, INDIANA ON THE ___ day of _____, 1929.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Sellersburg, Clark County, Indiana, that the first paragraph of Section Number Eight(8) Ordinance Number ~~SEVENTY-EIGHT~~^{EIGHTY} (88), known as the Peddlers License Law of the town of Sellersburg, Clark County, Indiana adopted by the Board of Trustees of said town on the 4 day of March, 1929, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 8.

The license fee shall be as follows: For a peddler or hawker, Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars for each vehicle used by the applicant in such business. For an employe, servant, agent or helper of a licensed peddler or hawker, or of a peddler or hawker exempt from obtaining a license, Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars.

That any person so vending or peddling on foot shall pay for such license or permit as aforesaid the following fees, to wit: \$1.00 per day, \$7.50 for three months, \$15.00 for six months, \$25.00 for one year.

That all laws in conflict with this section are hereby repealed.

render the Panama canal useless for this. Interruption of sea communication between the Atlantic and Pacific coast might easily bring disaster to the nation. Having two canals obviously reduces that danger one half.

As Major Sultan's engineers cut their way through the Nicaraguan jungle their expedition is more than a symbol of the fact that the United States under an engineer President is providing for the future needs of the nation. For the Nicaraguan canal "looks both forward and backward." The expedition is the outward sign that the 400-year quest for a speedy route to the East, which inspired Columbus to sail away into the unknown, still engages the interests and efforts of the nation. That Genoese sailor has been called the father of this project and Balboa, Cortez and other Spanish explorers its godfathers.

If Constantinople had not passed from Christian hands into Moslem possession in 1453, closing the land routes to India and the Orient, the discovery of the American continent might have been postponed for centuries. Since its discovery the search for a shorter route between the two great oceans has been ceaseless. Scarcely a generation has passed since the fourth voyage of Columbus, when natives of the West Indies informed him he was nearing "a narrow place between the seas," that one or another nation has not concerned itself with bridging that narrow place.

Of the early explorers Cortez seems to have been the first who recognized the fact that the "narrow place" was not the strait they had expected to find. His plans to construct a canal by way of Tehuantepec, cut short by the treachery of his followers, were carried on by his cousin, Alvaro de Saavedra Ceron, who submitted plans by four routes—by way of Darien, Nicaragua, Tehuantepec or Panama, the very routes which received so much attention in the Nineteenth century.

In 1567 Philip II had a survey made through Nicaragua. In spite of an unfavorable report, he is said to have presented the problem to the Dominican friars. The friars, even more perplexed than the king, finally quoted the Scriptures to him: "What God hath joined together, let no man put asunder." King Philip therefore decided to abandon all attempts to divorce the two continents.

The project remained quiescent for half a century when Philip III ordered further surveys to be made for a canal by way of the Gulf of Darien and the Atrato river. For the next half century the subject was allowed to rest until the buccaneers and wars with England in the Seventeenth century played havoc with Spanish commerce.

As a result of British experience in these wars a colony was established in Caledonia bay to secure Great Britain "the keys of the universe, enabling their possessors to give laws to both oceans and to become the arbiters of the commercial world." The colony was unable to withstand the disadvantages of an unhealthy location and the combined hostility of the East India

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to aid and protect Nicaragua in all defensive wars, failed of ratification in congress.

Later a corporation headed by Cornelius Vanderbilt secured the exclusive right of excavating a ship canal from Greytown to any point on the Pacific. Col. O. W. Childs of Philadelphia, chief engineer for the company, reached a conclusion that a canal by the Nicaragua route was practicable only by following the valley of the San Juan river to Lake Nicaragua, and from that lake a choice of a southwesterly or northwesterly course. His report, completed in 1852, which has been the basis for all subsequent surveys, was submitted to the topographical engineers of the United States army. Col. J. J. Abert and Lieut. Col. W. Turnbull reported favorably on the plan, recommending some changes and modifications. The corporation failed to take decisive action and the contract was forfeited.

The Civil war precluded for several years any further American attempts toward canal building. In 1869 President Grant's first message to congress recommended an American canal on American soil to be constructed by the American people. Congress promptly responded by providing for further exploration. In 1872 a commission was appointed consisting of Gen. A. A. Humphreys, chief of engineers, United States army; C. P. Patterson, superintendent of the coast survey; and Commodore Daniel Ammen, chief of the bureau of navigation of the United States navy.

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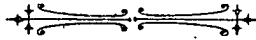

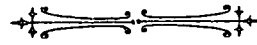

INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

HOUSING LAW OF 1917

CHAPTER 21.

AN ACT concerning dwellings or places of residence unfit for human habitation or dangerous or detrimental to life and health and providing penalties.

[H. B. 69. Law without signature of Governor.]

Buildings Unfit for Human Habitation.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the general assembly of the State of Indiana,* That whenever it shall be certified to the state board of health, or to the board of health of any city or town or the health commissioner of any county in this state, or whenever such board or commissioner shall have knowledge that a dwelling or any part thereof is unfit for human habitation, or dangerous or detrimental to life or health by reason of want of repair, or of defects in the drainage, plumbing, lighting, ventilation or the construction of the same, or by reason of being infected with contagious disease, or for any other cause, or by reason of the existence on the premises of a nuisance likely to cause sickness among occupants of said dwelling; the state board of health, the board of health of any city or town or the health commissioner of any county may, within their respective jurisdiction, issue an order requiring all persons therein to vacate such dwelling or part thereof within not less than five (5) days nor more than fifteen (15) days for one or more of the reasons to be mentioned in said order. Such board of health or health commissioners shall at any time for good cause shown, extend the time within which to comply with such order, and whenever satisfied that the danger from said dwelling has ceased to exist and that it is fit for habitation may revoke such order.

Duty of Board of Health to Order Improvement.

SEC. 2. Whenever any dwelling or any building, structure, excavation, business, pursuit, matter or thing, in or about a dwelling or the lot upon which it is situated, or the plumbing, sewerage, drainage, light or ventilation thereof, is in the opinion of the state board of health, the board of health of any city or town, or the health commissioner of any county, in a condition or in effect dangerous or detrimental to life or health, such board or commissioner may declare that the same to the extent they may specify is a public nuisance, and may order the same to be removed, abated, suspended, altered, improved or purified as the order may specify. In addition to the above powers, said board of health or commissioner may also order or cause any dwelling or excavation, building, structure, sewer, plumbing, pipe, passage, premises, ground, matter or thing, in or about a dwelling or the lot upon which it is situated, to be purified, cleansed, disinfected, renewed, altered, repaired or improved. If any order of a board of health or commissioner issued under the authority of the provisions of this act is not complied with or so far complied with as such board of health or commissioner may regard as reasonable, within such time as they may designate, then such order may be executed by said board of health or commissioner by themselves or through their officers, agents or employes. Such orders shall be served upon the tenant and owner, or his rental agent for the premises, but may be served on any person who may have by contract with the owner assumed the duty of doing those things which the order may specify.

Appeal to Circuit Court—Bond.

SEC. 3. Any person who feels himself aggrieved by any order provided in this act, may within ten days of the making of such order file his petition with the circuit or superior court of the county praying a review of such order, and it shall be the duty of such court to hear the same at the first convenient day and to make such order in the premises as right and justice may require and such decision shall be final. Such party appealing to the circuit or superior court shall file with said court a bond in an amount to be fixed by the court with sureties to be approved by the judge of the court conditioned to pay all the costs on such appeal in case such person fails to sustain his appeal or the same be dismissed for any cause. Such proceeding shall be docketed as an action between such appellant and such board or commissioner, and shall be tried as civil actions are tried. The corporation counsel or the department of law in the city or town and prosecuting attorney in cases arising outside of cities and towns and in cities and towns which may not have a department of law or any other legal representatives, shall attend to all proceedings on the part of the board or commissioner.

Penalty—Attorney's Fee.

SEC. 4. Any person who shall violate any provision of this act or who shall fail to comply with any lawful order of the board of health or commissioner as provided in this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than twenty-five (\$25) dollars or imprisonment for not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days and each day such violation or failure to comply shall continue, shall constitute a separate offense. Any person violating this act or failing to comply with any lawful order of any board or officer as provided in this act shall be liable for all costs and expenses paid or incurred by a board of health or commissioner in executing any lawful order, which may be recovered in a civil action brought by such board or commissioner who shall in such action also recover attorneys fees reasonable in such action.

Limitations of Act.

SEC. 5. Nothing herein shall be deemed to repeal any existing valid city or town ordinance dealing with any of the subject matter of this act, and the inspector of buildings in any city or town shall, within the limits of the city or town in which he is an official, have and exercise all the powers granted to such inspector in such ordinance, and such inspector may exercise any of the powers granted in this act to boards of health or health commissioners.

State Board of Health.

SEC. 6. The state board of health shall not exercise any of the powers granted to it in this act without first giving notice to the board of health of the city or town or the health commissioner of the county setting forth the conditions which have been certified to it or of which it has knowledge. Upon failure of such board of health or commissioner to act within three (3) days after such notice the state board of health may exercise the powers herein granted.

"Dwelling" Defined.

SEC. 7. The word "dwelling" wherever used in this act shall be taken to include not only any dwelling house and parts thereof, but also a part of any building used as a place of residence or habitation by any person, or for sleeping purposes.

REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWN BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SELLERSBURG, INDIANA.

A regular meeting of the Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, was held in the Town Hall in said Town of Sellersburg, Clark County, Indiana, on the 29 day of Jan, 1931, at the regular meeting place of said Board, pursuant to the rules of said Board.

Louis Dold, President of the Town Board was present and presided at the meeting. Katherine Beyl, Clerk of said Town Board was present and kept a record of the minutes of said meeting. The following Trustees were present:

- Louis Dold,
- Wm. Binger,
- Abe Hitch.

All members of said Board being present, the President then and there declared said meeting was duly convened according to law and was open for the transaction of the business of the Town.

Lowell D. Smith, Secretary-Treasurer of the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., then appeared before said Board and stated to the Board that in view of the fact that the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., had not as yet received the money from the sale of all the Stock of the Company, and in view of the fact that weather conditions had prevented the Company from construction of the plant, and there would yet be sometime within which the Company could complete its plant, he asked leave of the Board that an extension of time be granted in addition to that time heretofore set forth in the franchise for the complete construction

of said plant. He stated that in his opinion, he desired an extension of at least five (5) months time to be given within which to complete construction of said plant. After discussion of this matter by the various members of the Board, Trustee Abe Hitch, then moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, heretofore on the 11th day of August, 1930, a Franchise was given by the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, to the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., for the purpose of laying pipes, and installing hydrants and water mains in the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, with the view of furnishing the Town and inhabitants thereof with water for domestic, industrial and commercial purposes, and,

WHEREAS, the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., was now installing and erecting said waterworks plant and system in said Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, and that weather conditions were such that it retarded the construction of said plant and that the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., had met with some delay in selling the Stock of said Company, and that the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., had now sold and disposed of the Stock of said Company, and now had in its possession sufficient funds with which to complete the installation and erection of said waterworks plant and system, and,

WHEREAS, it was to the best interest of said Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, and inhabitants thereof, that an extension of time of five (5) months should be granted to the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., within which to complete the installation and erection of said waterworks plant and system.

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, regularly convened at its regular meeting do hereby grant an extension of time of five months from the date of this resolution, to the said Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., within which to complete the installation and erection of the waterworks plant and system now being installed and to be installed and completed in the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

The motion to adopt this resolution was duly seconded by Wm. Binger. The roll was called upon the vote of adoption of said resolution, whereupon all Trustees voting in the affirmative, said resolution was by the President of said Board of Trustees, declared duly passed and adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Town Board of Trustees and the Town Clerk be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and instructed to enter into and execute such lease and contract in the name of and on behalf of said Town of Sellersburg, Indiana.

The motion to adopt this resolution was seconded by Wm Binger and then submitted to a vote, which vote resulted as follows, those in favor of the adoption of said resolution voting "Yes":

Louis Dold, yes,
Abe Hitch, yes,
Wm. Binger, yes.

The resolution having been carried by the affirmative vote of the entire Board of Trustees, the President thereupon declared same to have been duly passed and adopted.

Thereupon the President of the Board and the Town Clerk met with the officers of the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., and the lease contract referred to in the above and foregoing resolution was duly executed on the part of the Town of Sellersburg by the President of the Town Board of Trustees and the Clerk of said Town Board, and on the part of the Sellersburg Water Company, Inc., by the President and the Secretary-Treasurer thereof, and the President of the Board and the Clerk of said Town, so referred it to the meeting.

Thereupon Mr Abe Hitch, introduced the following ordinance which was read and ordered put upon its passage.
