We the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Sellersburg, Indiana, hereby make application to the Sellersburg State Bank, Sellersburg Ind, for a loan in the sum of \$450.00 Four Hundred Fifty Dollars and same ~~being~~ ~~being~~ being granted we hereby sign said note as of officials of said Town of Sellersburg Ind.

This note is to bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum and same is payable in advance, the note is to be drawn for a period of six months and is to be dated Aug 6th 1937, and this resolution is in force and effect until same is paid in full and we hereby ask the privilege of renewing same or any part thereof for a longer term until same is paid in full

And the sum of \$100.00 from the street labor fund and \$100.00 from the general fund and \$150.00 from the light fund a total of \$350.00 as a loan to the Sullowbury Water Co. to settle up Bal. of their bills on Plant.

\$135.00 from the General Fund to the material fund.

Mr Hitch made a motion and seconded it to pay following bills.

Ordinance No. 75

An ordinance prohibiting the placing or attaching any poster, card or any other kind of advertising upon any tree, telegraph, trolley telephone or electric light pole, within the town of Sellersburg Clark County State of Indiana, and providing a penalty.

Section 1.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Clark County State of Indiana, that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to place or attach any poster card or any other form of advertising upon any tree, telegraph, telephone trolley or electric light pole, in and along any street or alley within the Town of Sellersburg, Clark County, State of Indiana.

Section 2.

Be it further ordained that any person or persons violating the foregoing section shall be arrested and fined in any sum not less than one dollar (\$1.00) or not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) together with all costs.

Section 3.

Be it further ordained that an emergency exist for the immediate taking effect of this ordinance and shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage.

Health Ordinance No. 92.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Elliptsburg, Clark County, Indiana, which Board of Trustees constitute the Health Board of said town, the same being invested with the power to establish and enforce such rules and regulations as they may deem necessary to promote, preserve and secure the health of the town and to prevent the introduction and spread of contagious, infectious or pestilential diseases hereby adopt the following rules and regulations.

Rule 1.

That it shall be unlawful for any person, persons, company or corporation to erect, construct, cause, permit, keep or maintain within the corporate limits of said town anything whatsoever which is injurious to the health, or indecent or offensive to the sense of any inhabitant of said town or any stationery to the free use of the property by any such inhabitant, and any person or persons maintaining any such nuisance referred to is hereby declared to be the author and maintainer of said nuisance.

Rule 4.

Rule 2.

It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, company or corporation to throw or deposit or suffer to throw or deposit, or suffer or permit any child, servant, member of the family, or any other person under his her, or their control, to throw or deposit any manure, human excrement, urine, rubbish, slop, putrid or unsound animal or vegetable matter, or any filth, soap, or manure, or any liquid or slop, or any substance that are liable to become unwholesome or to be upon any street, lane, alley, sidewalk, gutter, crossing, lot, cellar premises or common, and it shall be unlawful for anyone to allow rank weeds to grow or make a business of scattering poultry or animals within the corporate limits of said town.

Rule 3.

All kitchens shall be provided with garbage receptacles which shall be tightly covered and emptied frequently enough to prevent fermentation and bad odors, and garbage receptacles and vaults shall be cleaned, emptied and disinfected, and weeds shall be cut and hauled away at any time upon written order of the health officer. said health officer shall fix a reasonable time in his order, within said garbage receptacles or

Rule 5.

Health Ordinance No. 46

vaults shall be emptied, cleaned and disinfected and when weeds shall be cut and hauled away, and if any person, being duly ordered as herein provided shall fail or refuse to obey said order, it shall be the duty of the town marshal upon notice from the health officer, to cause the garbage receptacles and vaults to be cleaned, emptied and disinfected, or weeds to be cut and hauled away, and said marshal shall keep an accurate account of the expense thereof which shall be paid for from the town treasury upon sworn vouchers of the town Marshal and the sergeant shall be charged against the property on which said work was done and collected as other taxes are collected against said property.

Rule 4.

The secretary of the town board of health, who is also town health officer, and all deputy health officers, and the town marshal and deputies shall have power and authority to enter upon any street, lot, alley or grounds for the purpose of making a sanitary survey of the same and if a nuisance or any conditions are found, it shall be the duty of the town health officer, when informed of the existence of the same, to immediately notify the person so offending, in writing, fixing the time to abate the nuisance within the time specified. If such person shall fail or refuse to abate the nuisance within the time specified, it shall be the duty of the town marshal upon notice by the health officer, to cause the same to be abated, keeping an accurate account of the expense thereof which shall be paid by the town treasurer and charged against the property owner and collected as other taxes are collected from the property so charged.

Rule 5.

If at any time the work of the prevention of the spread of infectious or contagious disease is more than can be reasonably expected of the health officer, he may, with the consent of the chairman of the town board, employ one or more intelligent men to act as deputies to establish quarantine, remove patients to special hospitals and conduct disinfection of all houses where infections are being spread.

Health Ordinance No. 92

diseases may exist shall at the proper time be thoroughly disinfectied according to the rules of the State Board of Health, by the health officer or his deputies at the expense of the town, no work is advisable for the benefit of the people. A complete record of all disinfections, all vaccination burials, deaths, burial permits and all other health work shall be kept by the health officer in the minute book of the town board of health.

Rule 6.

It shall be the duty of the town marshal at all times to aid the town health officer in his work of enforcing this ordinance upon demand of the health officer.

Rule 7.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, that the owners of all animals of the dog kind shall be required to keep them securely upon their own premises, and should any source of the animals of the dog kind allow them to wander upon the public Strats, Alleys and public places within the corporate limits of said town, said dogs shall be declared a public nuisance and the owner of said dog shall be fined not less than three (\$3.00) dollars and not more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars. It shall be declared a separate offense for each dog so found wandering upon the Strats, Alleys and public places within the corporate limits of said town aforesaid.

Ordinance # 97

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Sellersburg that it shall be unlawful for any ^{it} permanent dealer, their agents or employees, engaged in the business of laundrying, pressing or cleaning wearing apparel or household articles to solicit, engage in, or carry on anyone or all of the businesses designated in this section within the corporate limits of the town of Sellersburg, Indiana without first having procured from said town a license to do so.

Such license may be taken out for one or more days or for one year, and the license fee and tax shall be \$3.00 for each day or \$30.00 a year, for which such license is issued and the town clerk shall be authorized to issue such license.

Any person, his agent or employees violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in any amount not more than \$5.00 and each day violation shall constitute a separate offense.

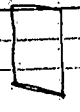

(A) Said Sewer Treatment and Disposal Plant shall be constructed so as to treat, purify and dispose in a sanitary manner of the liquid and solid waste, sewage, night soil and industrial waste of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, and all

An Ordinance for the creation of a Sinking Fund for the payment of the Sewerage Treatment and Disposal Plant Bonds, and the interest thereon, to be issued and sold by the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, in the sum and amount of \$30,000.00, and the payment of the charge of the Fiscal Agent of the Town for making payments of said Bonds and interest thereon, and to set aside and pledge a sufficient amount of the net revenue of the works, hereby defined to mean the revenue of the works remaining after the payment of the reasonable expense of operation, repair and maintenance thereof.

Section 1. Be it Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, that a Sinking Fund be, and is hereby created for the payment of the Sewerage Treatment and Disposal Plant Bonds, to be issued and sold by the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, in the sum of \$30,000.00, and the payment of the charge of the Fiscal Agent of the Town for making payment of such Bonds and interest thereon, and to set aside a sufficient amount of the net revenue of the works, hereby defined to mean the revenue of the works remaining after the payment of the reasonable expense of operation, repair and maintenance thereof.

Such amounts of revenue is to be paid into

the sinking fund by order of the Board of Trustees at intervals as herein provided.

Section 2. The following State Bank of Indiana, is hereby designated as the Fiscal Agent of the Town to make the payments of such Bonds and interest thereon, for which service said Fiscal Agent shall receive per cent of the funds and monies so handled by it in making said payments; said per cent to be paid out of the sinking fund. The Board reserves the right to change or discontinue the operations of the Fiscal Agent at its pleasure, by Resolution, spread of record in the Minutes of the proceedings of the Board.

Section 3. Section 1 That the Town of Sellersburg do issue and sell Sewage Treatment and Disposal Bonds of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana in the sum of \$30,000.00 to pay part of the cost of the acquisition and construction of a sewage treatment and disposal plant, intercepting sewers, out-fall sewers, pumping station, Ejector station, and all other appliances necessary or useful and convenient for the treatment and disposal in a sanitary manner of liquid and solid waste, right soil and industrial waste, to finance that part of the costs thereof not provided by the United States of America.

Section 2 That in order to procure said sum of \$30,000.00 The bonds of said Town be issued to the said amount of \$30,000.00 subject to the conditions and restrictions set in said bonds pertaining to Revenue bonds of the character herein provided. An Ordinance concerning the issuance and sale of revenue bonds to provide the cost of construction of sewage treatment works of the Town of Sellersburg, and matters connected therewith.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg did, on the 25th day of November, 1933, adopt Ordinance No 89 providing for the establishment, construction, equipment, operation and maintenance of sewage treatment works by said Town under the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana for the year 1932 (Special Session), and all laws amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, which Ordinance covered all requirements of section 5 of said Chapter 67 of the Acts of 1932 except the terms and conditions governing the issuance of the proposed revenue bonds and provisions for safe keeping the assets of the bond holders and

Whereas, pursuant to the provisions of said ordinance a specific election was held the 23rd day of November, 1938, on the question of the establishment of said sewerage works and the issuance of revenue bonds in an amount not exceeding the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars \$30,000.00 to finance the cost thereof, and at said election 190 votes were cast in favor of said project and 18 votes were cast against said project, and

Whereas, it has been definitely determined that it will be necessary to issue said revenue bonds in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) in order to provide for the cost construction of said plant, ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ the bonds during the period of construction and the incidental expenses necessary to be incurred in connection with said project, including the issuance of bonds on account thereof, now therefore,

The balance of said bonds numbered from fifty one (51) to sixty (60) inclusive, shall not be executed or sold unless the Board shall first that the sale of said bonds is necessary to complete said project and shall order the sale thereof.

Sec. 4. All accrued interest received at the time of the delivery of said bonds shall be paid into the Sewage Works Sinking Fund herewith created, together with such an amount as shall be necessary to provide for the payment of interest on the bonds prior to the date when revenue will be available for that purpose. The remaining proceeds from the sale of the bonds, and any other funds received for use in paying the cost of construction of the works, after reimbursement of the Town for the amount advanced for preliminary expenses, are provided by sections 4 of Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1932 shall be deposited in a bank or banks which are legally designated depositories for the funds of the Town of Bellefleur in a special account to be of account to be designated as "Town of Bellefleur Sewage Works Construction account" and each of said special accounts shall be continuously audited and

accordance with the provisions of Chapter 70 of the Acts of the Indiana General Assembly for the year 1935 and all acts amendatory thereof and supplement thereto governing the deposit of public funds.

The fund in such special account or accounts shall be applied solely to the payment of the cost of said sewage works as defined in Section 7 of Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1932, and the interest on the bonds prior to the collection of revenues from such works, except as herein otherwise specifically provided. Any balance remaining unexpended in such special account or accounts after the completion of the works, which are not required to meet unpaid obligations incurred in connection with the construction of the works, shall be paid into the Sewage work Sinking Fund to be used for the payment of interest and principal of the bonds.

Sec. 5. When said works are completed and put in operation, all revenues derived from the operation thereof shall be segregated and kept in a special fund separate from all other funds of the town. Out of this fund all proper and legal reasonable expense of operation, repair and maintenance of said sewage works shall be paid.

The town shall keep proper books of record and account, separate from all of its other records and accounts, in which complete and correct entries shall be made showing all revenues collected from said works and deposited in said fund and all disbursements made therefrom on account of said works and all transactions relating to said works. These shall be prepared and furnished to the original purchaser of the bonds, so long as it holds any of the bonds, and upon written request, to any subsequent holder of the bonds more than thirty days after the close of each annual fiscal period, complete operating and income statement of the works, in readable detail, covering such annual fiscal period, which statement shall be certified by the Clerk. Treasurer or by an Auditor employed for that purpose. Copies of all such statements and reports shall be kept on file in the office of the Clerk. Treasurer. All bondholders shall have the right at all reasonable times to inspect said sewage works and all records, accounts and data of the town relating

streets.

Section 6 The Town shall, by Ordinance of the Board of Trustees, establish just and equitable rates and charge for the use of and the service rendered by such works, to be paid by the owner of each and every lot, parcel of real estate or building that is connected with and uses such work by or through any part of the sewerage system of the Town, or that in any way uses or is served by such works, such rates to charge shall be sufficient in each year for the payment of the proper and reasonable expenses of operations, replacement and maintenance of the works and for the payment of the sums required to be paid into the sinking fund hereinafter created.

Such rates of charge shall, if necessary be changed and adjusted from time to time so the revenues from such rates or charges shall always be sufficient to meet the requirements of this Ordinance and of said act.

The rates or charges so established shall apply to any and all use of such works by and be paid by the Town, and shall be paid by the Town as the charges are.

It is hereby determined that a just and equitable charge against the Town of \$1000.00 for the handling and treatment of surface water collected from the streets, alleys and other public places of the Town from streets and alleys sewers inlets is in the amount of Twelve hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per annum, and the Town covenant with the holders of the bonds herein authorized to pay such charge in semi-annual installments on or before the first day of January and July of each year after said bonds are in default and coloring as any of the bonds herein authorized are outstanding. Such payment shall constitute a portion of the revenue of said work and shall be applied accordingly.

Sec. 7. There is hereby created a sinking fund for the payment of City bonds herein authorized to be issued and the interest thereon, and the payment of any charges of banks or trust companies for making payments of the bonds "of interest which fund shall be known as the Sewerage Works Sinking Fund." And the Town shall set aside and pay into said sinking fund

quarterly or as revenues are collected, a sufficient amount of the net revenues of said sewage works for the payment of (A.) the interest on the bonds as such interest shall fall due, (B.) the necessary fiscal agency charges for paying the bonds and the interest, and (C.) the payment of the bonds as they fall due, and in addition to provide a margin of safety, which margin, to be held with any unused surplus of such margin, to be carried forward from the preceding year, shall equal ten per cent (10%) of all other amounts so required to be paid into the sinking fund.

After all requirements of said sinking fund have been met, the Board of Trustees may, at any time in its discretion, transfer all or any part of the balance of such net revenue after reserving an amount deemed by said Board sufficient for operation, repair and maintenance of said works for an ensuing period of not less than (12) Twelve months into the sinking fund or may use the same for extensions, betterments and additions to said sewage works.

Sec. 8. For the purpose of further regarding the interest of the holders of bonds, it is specifically provided as follows:

(A.) All contracts for said work shall be let after an advertisement as required by the law of the State of Indiana, and all contractors shall be required to furnish with bonds necessary to the Town of Sellersburg, in an amount equal to one hundred per cent (100%) of the amount of such contracts, to insure the completion of said contracts in accordance with their terms, and such contractor shall also be required to carry such employers liability and public liability insurance as are required under the law of the State of Indiana in the case of other public contracts, and shall be governed in all respect by the laws of Indiana relating to other public contracts.

(B.) The work shall be contracted for and constructed under the supervision and subject to the approval of Charles H. Hurd, consulting engineer of Indianapolis, Indiana, or such other, competent and reputable engineers as shall be designated by the Board of Trustees. All contracts of work

- done and material furnished shall first be checked by the engineer and approved by the Board of Trustees. Prior to pay ment, said work shall be accepted as completed by the board with out the approval of the engineer.
- (C) The Town shall at all times maintain its sewage treatment works in good condition and operate the same in an efficient manner and at a reasonable cost. The Town shall at all times maintain and keep in good repair and working order out of ~~the~~ funds other than the revenue from its sewage works its general sewer system (not included in the sewage works contracts from the proceeds of the lands authorized.)
- (d) So long as any of the lands herein authorized are outstanding the Town shall maintain insurance on insurable parts of said sewage works, of a kind and in an amount which normally would be carried by private companies engaged in a similar business. in the event of loss, the proceeds of such insurance shall be used in restoring the property damaged.
- (E) So long as any of the lands are out standing, the Town shall not mortgage, pledge or otherwise encumber said sewage works, or any part thereof, and shall not sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any portion thereof except such equipment as may become worn out or obsolete and shall be replaced.
- (F) So long as any of the lands herein authorized are out standing no additional lands or other obligations pledged by any portion of the revenues of said sewage works shall be executed or issued by the Town unless the same be made valid and authorized in all respect to the lands herein authorized.
- (G) The Town shall take all action or proceedings necessary and proper to connect all of the property where liquid and solid waste, sewage, bright soil, or industrial waste is produced with available sanitary sewers. The Town further agrees that it will in so far as possible cause all sanitary sewers to be connected with the Town ~~and~~ sewage treatment works.

(h) All revenues received by the Town from said sewage works, and that portion of said

revenue set aside into the Sewage Works Sinking Fund, shall be deposited in the Sinking Fund of the Town, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 70 of the Acts of 1935, and shall be continuously secured in accordance with the provisions of said Act and all laws amendatory thereof or supplement thereto relating to the deposit and holding of public funds.

(I) The provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a contract by and between the Town of Sellersburg and the holders of the bonds herein authorized and after the issuance of said bonds the Ordinance shall not be repealed or amended in any respect which will adversely affect the rights and interest of the holder of said bonds, nor shall the Board of Trustees of the Town adopt any law, ordinance or resolution in any way adversely affecting the rights of such holder so long as any of said bonds or the interest thereon remain unpaid.

(J) The provisions of this ordinance shall be construed to create a trust in the proceeds derived from the sale of the bonds herein authorized, for the use and purpose herein set forth, and so long as any such bonds are outstanding the provisions of this ordinance shall also be construed to create a trust in the portion of the net revenue of said sewage works herein directed to be set apart and paid into the sewage works sinking funds ~~and~~ for the use and purpose of said fund as herein provided, the holders of the bonds shall have all of the rights, remedies and privileges either expressly set forth in the provisions of Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1935, (Special Session) and also all amendatory thereof or supplement thereto, or implied therein including the right to have a receiver appointed to administer said works in the event of default as provided in said Act.

(K) ~~None~~ None of the provisions of this ordinance shall be construed as requiring the expenditure of any funds derived from source other than the sale of the bonds herein authorized and the operation of said sewage treatment works.

Sec 9 All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby specifically repealed.

Sec. 10. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and signing by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg. Passed and adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana on the 30th day of ~~Nov~~ December 1938.

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 92 entitled "An Ordinance concerning the revenue and sale of revenue bonds to provide the cost of construction of sewage treatment works of the Town of Sellersburg, and matters connected therewith."

Whereas, Ordinance No. 92 was adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg on December 30th, 1938, and it has been discovered that through inadvertence and mistake said Ordinance failed to describe properly the project on account of which the sewage works revenue bonds referred to in said Ordinance are being issued, and the Board has been advised that said Ordinance should be amended in certain respects prior to the issuance of bonds thereunder, in order to avoid questions as to the validity of said bonds; now therefore

Be it Ordained By The Board of Trustees of the
Of Sellersburg:

That the preamble of said ordinance be

Adopted on December, 30th 1938, entitled as "Ordinance concerning the issuance and sale of revenue bonds to provide the cost of construction of sewage treatment works of the Town of Sellersburg and matters connected herewith" be amended to read as follows:

"Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg has, by the adoption of various ordinances and resolutions, here to be provided for the establishment, construction, equipment, operation and maintenance of sewage works, consisting of a sanitary sewer system and sewage treatment plant under the provisions of Chapter 61 of the acts of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana for the year 1932 (Special Session), and all laws amendatory thereto and supplementary thereto, which ordinance and Resolutions collect all of the requirements of Section 5 of said Chapter 61 of the acts of 1932 except the terms and conditions governing the issuance of the proposed revenue bonds and provisions for safeguarding the interests of the bondholders; and

Whereas, an election was held on the 23rd day of November, 1938, on the question of the establishment of said sewage works and the issuance of revenue bonds in an amount not exceeding the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to finance the cost thereof, and at said election ninety (90) votes were cast in favor of said project and Eighteen (18) votes were cast against said project; and

Whereas, it appears at the present time that sufficient funds can be raised by the sale of five revenue bonds in the amount of Twenty Five Thousand Dollars, (\$25,000.00) to meet that portion of the cost of said project to be borne by the Town, and since above the Works Progress Administration grant available for application on said project, and that the proceeds derived from the sale of said amount of bonds will be sufficient to provide for the construction of said works, in that on the bonds during the period of construction and the incidental expenses necessary to be

incurred in connection with said project, including the issuance of Bonds, but the Board finds that it would be expedient to authorize the issuance of bonds in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) so that if additional funds are required the additional bonds may be issued to raise such funds.

Sec. 2. That section 2 of said Ordinance No. 92 be amended to read as follows

"Sec. 2. The form and tenor of said bonds, the interest coupons to be attached thereto and the form of registry endorsement thereon, shall be substantially as follows, to-wit:

and to pay interest thereon from the date thereof until the principal is paid, at the rate of four and one half ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each year, beginning January 1, 1940, after presentation and surrender of the assigned coupons as they severally become due.

Both principal and interest of this bond are payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Sellersburg State Bank, in the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana,

This bond is one of an authorized issue of Sixty (60) bonds of the Town of Sellersburg of like date, denomination, tenor and effect.

except as to date of maturity, in the aggregate principal amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) numbered from 1 to 60 inclusive, issued in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 61 of the Code of the Indiana General Assembly for the year 1932. (Special Session), and all acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 62 adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Sellersburg on the 30th day of December, 1938, as amended by Ordinance No. 63 adopted by said Board on the 27th day of January, 1939, for the purpose of procuring funds to be applied on the cost of construction of sewage works consisting of a sanitary sewer system and sewage treatment plant.

Pursuant to the provisions of said act and said Ordinance, the principal and interest of this bond and all other bonds of said issue are payable solely from the Sewage Works Sinking Fund, (created by Ordinance No. 60) to be provided from the net revenues (herein defined as gross revenues after deductions only for the payment of the reasonable expenses of operation, repair and maintenance) of the sewage works of the Town of Sellersburg, Indiana, including the works constructed with the provisions of this bond and the issue of which it is a part, and all additions and improvements thereto and replacements thereof, subrepeatedly constructed or acquired.

This bond shall not constitute an indebtedness of the Town of Sellersburg within the meaning of the provisions and limitations of the constitution of the State of Indiana, and said Town shall not be obligated to pay said bonds or the interest thereon except from a special fund provided from said net revenues.

To the prompt payment of the principal and interest of this bond and all other Bonds of said issue the Town of Sellersburg irrevocably pledges the entire net revenues of said work and covenants that it will cause to be filed, maintained and collected such rates and charges for service rendered by said works as shall be sufficient in each year for the payment

of the proper and reasonable expenses of operation, repair, replacement and maintenance of said works and for the payment of the sums required to be paid into said sinking fund.

In the event the Trustee of Sellersburg, or the proper officers thereof, shall fail or refuse to so fully maintain and collect such charges, or if there be a default in the payment of the principal or interest of this bond, the holder of this bond shall have all the rights and remedies provided for in said Chapter 61 of the Acts of 1932 (Special Session) and all other remedial thereof and supplemental thereto, including the right to have a receiver appointed to administer the works and to charge and collect rates sufficient to provide for the payment of this bond and the interest thereon.

The Town of Sellersburg further covenants that it will set aside and pay into its "Sewage Works Sinking Fund" a sufficient amount of the net revenues of said works to meet (A) the interest on this Bond and the other bonds of this issue herein referred to, (B) the necessary fiscal agency charges for paying bonds and interest (C) the principal of said bonds as they fall due, and (D) an additional amount as a margin of safety, which margin, together with any unused surplus of such margin, carried forward from the preceding year, shall equal ten per cent (10%) of all other amounts so required to be paid into said sinking fund.

Such required payments shall constitute a first charge upon all the net revenues of the works.
